The students do an amazing job curating and managing this exhibit. However, there are a few areas that we could use our community's help and support.

"A motion was made by J. Siler that the Secretary of the Council divide the typing costs (\$17.00) plus the filing fee (if necessary) equally among each farm involved in the annexation. The Secretary will then send a bill to each farm owner for his share of the annexation cost."

The official name remained the Town of Lucas until some later point in the 1970s or 1980s when it was changed to the City of Lucas. There were no taxes collected until the same time period. I will research more minutes to determine exactly when this occurred (or would certainly appreciate information if someone knows it).

Our city has grown from these humble beginnings to a city of over 7,000 residents today. We have our own water system with water supplied by the North Texas Municipal Water District. We remain a family-oriented city with residents valuing a quality education for all our students in all areas of the city.

In 1973, the city was approached about forming a fire department with volunteers providing the manpower. My next article will be about our amazing Fire Department and their history. Stay tuned!

History of Lucas: **Part 5**

It is often said of small towns that everyone pitches in to make things happen without being asked to contribute. That is certainly true of the early Lucas community. The families worked hard with most area residents involved in farming. While the major crop in Collin County was wheat, the Lucas area was known for its cotton.

The 1950s brought many changes to the area. The dam that formed Lake Lavon had been completed, and the North Texas Municipal Water District was formed to provide water to an area that was beginning to see substantial growth. With this growth, cities nearby were beginning to stretch their boundaries to include much of the farmland. New rules were being made about land use. As a way to preserve the lifestyle they treasured and the choice to be governed by local people with common needs, a group of local residents met together to discuss a formal incorporation into becoming a town.

In 1958, this group sought legal advice for the process of incorporation. They had to pass around a petition to take to the Collin County Judge so that an election could be called. All of these costs were paid by this group voluntarily. I do not have records of the persons involved but know that the

incorporation election was held on December 20, 1958 with 49 votes "For" and 25 votes "Against". Lucas was officially incorporated as the Town of Lucas on February 19, 1959.

The next step was to elect a Town council. The election was held in March 1959. Gene Biggs was elected Mayor along with Council Members Joe Siler, Horace E. Mann, Sr., Kenneth Lewis, O.E. Spurgin and Constable Dale Spurgin. At their first meeting on April 9, 1959 at the Lucas School, O.E. Spurgin was elected Town Secretary and Treasurer.

The background of the first elected council reflected the community they represented. Four were farmers, one was an engineer, and one was a postal worker.

The minutes of the first meeting are hand written. They discussed "the telephone situation." And they agreed to pay Mr. Gay, a lawyer, for services connected to the incorporation and the two elections that were held. Again, these costs were shared among those agreeing to be part of the city. Another decision made was to meet on the first Monday of every month at 8 p.m.

The date of this section of minutes is not clear, but included with the April 15, 1959 minutes are the following notes:

"A motion was made by J. Siler that the Secretary of the Council determine the filing procedure and filing cost (if necessary) for the annexation ordinance, ordinance number 1002. The Secretary will then file the ordinance, if necessary, with the court, paying the Cost from City of Lucas funds.

Unfortunately, Brady sustained an injury and was out for a year. But his passion for running only got stronger. Coming back to it, he began running every day after that and trained his hardest. He works hard every day to be motivated and focused, setting up good habits that'll serve him well later in life. "I always have my eye on the end game," says Brady. "I really wanted to make it to the state championship, and that's what kind of drove me this year. I wanted to improve my times run the best, but still have fun. And to drive others to do the same."

It's Happened Again

(FIRST IN A 3-PART SERIES PERTAINING TO MENTAL HEALTH, SUICIDE, INFO, AND RESOURCES)

Bobbi is a grieving mom, published author of two books about losing her teenage son to depression, a guest speaker, and advocate for suicide awareness and prevention.

On Friday, February 24, the Lovejoy community was once again impacted by mental health. This time, an eighth grader. When are we going to say, "This is one too many — no more!"? When are we, as a community, going to come together and have the difficult conversations about mental health, depression, anxiety, bullying, etc.? If we DO NOT have the difficult conversations, this epidemic will never end.

In the U.S., over the past 15 years, suicide rates have continued to climb at a rate of 15%. In other developed countries, it has dropped. An official with the CDC stated that one of the reasons is the lack of facilities to handle mental health, especially in rural areas. He also cited a study, based in a community of several neighboring cities, that noted that when doctors and ER staff asked every new patient they encountered, "Are you suicidal or suffering from depression, anxiety, or any other mental health issue?", the patient was more likely to share if they were struggling than if they were not asked and it was just left up to the patient to volunteer that info.

We lost our teenage son to suicide three years ago in April, after a toxic relationship with an on-again/offagain ex-girlfriend. We knew that he was struggling with anxiety and depression. After a suicide attempt by OD, we admitted him to a mental

health facility for a week. He received the last bed available for teens in the DFW area at a facility we did not prefer, but we had no choice. Only 10 facilities currently accept teens in the DFW area. Our last two weeks with him were great. It was as if we had our son back to his former self before she came along; however, he could not get past it and took his life in her front vard.

The numbers from 2016 are staggering: (for comparison purposes only)

- 16,238 Murders
- 44,965 Suicides
- 64,000 Over Doses
- 1,124,125 ATTEMPTED SUICIDES (these are just the ones that get reported)

*Many ODs are actually suicides, but do not get labeled as such unless a note is left behind.

The World Health Organization has designated depression as the #1 killer in the world! Depression far surpasses cancer and all other diseases in the cause of death.

Suicide Facts:

- Every day, 105 Americans die by suicide.
- Over 44k Americans die by suicide each year.
- 79% of all U.S. suicide deaths are male.
- 22 is the average number of active duty/vets we lose per day to suicide.

- 'Talking about suicide may give someone the idea.' -NOT TRUE -Suicide Awareness Voices of Education

It's Okay To Say I'm Not Okay

A campaign released last year targeting the stigma attached to mental health was launched nationwide. In each region, local celebrities/popular sports figures participated in the PSA spot. Emmitt Smith and Mark Cuban appeared in the North Texas version. It features different people making statements, such as:

My wife has cancer. Why is it not okay for me to say my daughter suffers from depression?'

'My husband died from a brain tumor. Why is it not okay to say I am suffering from anxiety?'

This campaign is a HUGE step in the right direction to bring mental health out of the darkness and into the light. If we, as parents, can let our children know, "It's okay to say you're not okay," then maybe they will be more willing to open up to us about what they are feeling and struggling with in terms of emotions, relationships, friendships, pressures, etc.

Parents need to be comfortable to ask their kids, "Have you ever considered suicide or are you depressed?" I KNOW! TRUST ME - I KNOW! You're thinking I can't ask that! The first time the ex broke up with Pierce, he came home crying, ran into his room and locked the door. I knocked and he told me to leave him alone. Fifteen minutes later, he texted, asking me to come talk. He was struggling because he was the perfect boyfriend and couldn't understand why she would be doing this when he had done nothing wrong. After our talk, I asked him, "You're not thinking about hurting yourself, are you?" His reply, "No Mom, I would never do that to you or Dad."

Tell your kids, often: SUICIDE IS A PERMANENT SOLUTION TO A TEMPORARY PROBLEM. In my student speeches, I tell them to think back to a time last year when something happened that seemed like the end of the world and they thought they'd never survive it. Well, here you are today. You survived. And guess what, something will happen this year that's horrible, but, remember, you survived last year, so survive this year.

We must teach our kids coping skills. Our generation has raised children where everyone receives a participation trophy. Oh, you didn't pass the test? Here, take it again until you do. You're the best. You're going to get into this college, etc. We all know that is not how real life works. Without coping skills, they will not survive this often cruel world.

NEVER BELIEVE YOU OR YOUR FAMILY IS IMMUNE TO SUI-CIDE. It is an equal opportunity employer. As my husband said, "It's not if. It's when you or a loved one will be touched by mental health."

enjoying butterflies INLUCAS

It is April 1st and I saw at least ten butterflies in my garden looking for food today. This is a tough time of the year since flowers are not yet blooming. But as the season progresses, it is very easy to attract butterflies to your yard. All the butterflies need are plants that are needed by the caterpillars for food and flowers that will produce nectar and attract the adult butterflies.

The widespread use of pesticides for both farming and elimination of mosquitoes threaten the very existence of butterflies. A lot of the jungle in Mexico that is used for winter habitats of the monarch, in particular, is being eliminated. McKinney has joined a growing list of cities in the U.S. to stand behind the initiative to support the monarch butterfly and other pollinators by signing the National Wildlife Federation Mayors' Monarch Pledge. If you go to McKinney Monarch Initiative on your computer, there is an informative video about their migration journey and why it needs to be preserved.

We can start in our own backyard by providing a habitat that attracts butterflies. Three plant sales are just around the corner. Texas Discovery Gardens at Fair Park has their annual plant sale on April 7th and 8th with a members' preview on April 6th from 4 to 7 p.m. There will be a "Plant Sale Safari" on April 6th from 3 to 4 p.m. Their website has a list of more than 600 varieties of rare native and adapted plants that will be available.

In our own backyard, the Heard Museum is having their 29th annual plant sale on April 14th through the 15th. They will have native milkweed plants that are magnets for all butterflies and assorted nectar plants for butterflies, hummingbirds, and other endangered pollinators. Admission to the museum is not necessary to attend the plant sale. However, a museum membership gets you into the members-only pre-sale.

On June 2 through September 30, the Butterfly Garden at the Heard is open. You can walk around and see native butterflies and other pollinators in the Native Texas Butterfly House and Garden. The website for the Heard Museum has all the details. Some other interesting events at the Heard also include the following talks (all are from 10 to 11 a.m.):

- Saturday, June 2: Butterflies 101
- Saturday, July 7: Butterfly Talk Creating Your Butterfly Nursery
- Saturday, September 29: Amazing Monarchs Discover more about our state butterfly



The 15th Annual Plant Sale by the Collin County Master Gardeners will be held at Myers Park and Event Center. At the sale taking place on Saturday, April 21, there will be native and unique plants available. A children's hands-on craft section is new this year.

Another section that will be open is the pollinator and butterfly attracting Earth Kind Gardens. No pesticides or herbicides are used in the garden, and they are watered one to two times a season if needed. These gardens are maintained by the Collin County Master Gardeners, and at their peak, the gardens have a large variety of butterflies. Many garden events and weddings are held in the middle of the garden. Also available for view at the park are the vegetable and herb gardens, Crepe Myrtle gardens, and wine grape gardens. It is a great place to take a picnic lunch and a fishing pole.

All of the sales encourage you to bring your own wagon or cart. Do your homework ahead of the sales to find a sunny location in your yard that will attract butterflies, preferably one you can observe from your home or patio and watch the parade. You will not be disappointed!
