CITY OF LUCAS FIRE-RESCUE VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY RESPONDER EXPECTATIONS



These are the expectations of all volunteer emergency responders for the City of Lucas Fire-Rescue.

- All volunteer emergency responders must pass a background investigation and drug test.
- All volunteer emergency responders must be at least 18 years of age.
- All volunteer emergency responders must have a valid high school diploma or GED.
- All volunteer emergency responders must have the following credentials:
 - o Hold a TCFP or SFFMA interior structural firefighting certificate; and/or
 - o be an EMT-Basic or be an EMT-Paramedic; or
 - o be enrolled in an accredited interior structural firefighting program or an approved EMT-Basic or Paramedic school.
- All volunteer emergency responders shall agree to successfully complete the following City of Lucas Fire-Rescue training:
 - 1. Emergency vehicles operator's course;
 - 2. approval to operate Squads and Ambulances;
 - 3. medical skill assessment; and
 - 4. fire skills assessment
- All volunteer emergency responders shall agree to volunteer for at least 48 shift hours a month.
- All volunteer emergency responders shall agree to attend a minimum of 60 annual training hours through monthly department training, monthly emergency medical services continuing education training (EMS-CE) and complete the monthly computer-based training (CBT)."
- All volunteer emergency responders shall agree to attend at least one live fire training per year.
- All volunteer emergency responders should agree to attend at least 240 company training hours per year, which may include the 60 hours mentioned above.
- All volunteer emergency responders shall agree to sign up for 12 or 24 hour shifts on the department calendar. Once you sign up for a shift, it is your responsibility to be at that shift. If you are unable to be at that shift, it is your responsibility to find a replacement and notify the shift officer at least 24 hours in advance of that shift. If an emergency arises, notify the shift officer immediately.
- The City of Lucas Fire-Rescue name and logo shall not be displayed in any manner unbecoming of the department.
- All issued gear and uniforms are property of the City of Lucas Fire-Rescue. If you leave the department, you must return all gear and uniforms.
- All volunteer emergency responders are required to comply with the City of Lucas Employee Policies and Procedures Handbook. A copy of the City's Handbook and the Lucas Fire-Rescue SOG Manual is available to all volunteer emergency responders is in the Fire-Rescue Ops/Watch room.
- Failure to meet the volunteer emergency responders' expectations as stated above will result in the volunteer being placed on an ineligible list. By signing this, the Volunteer agrees with and understands the expectations listed above.

CITY OF LUCAS FIRE-RESCUE VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY RESPONDER MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING



General Requirements

- 1. Emergency vehicles operator's course;
- 2. approval to operate Squads and Ambulances;
- 3. medical skill assessment; and
- 4. fire skills assessment.

To be in good standing, all volunteer emergency responders agree to complete these qualifying services:

- Participate in a minimum of 60 training hours annually.
- Participate in a minimum of 500 service hours annually.

Lucas Fire-Rescue has a two-tier system for volunteer emergency responders to encourage both certified volunteers to provide essential public service and those individuals in accredited programs to be able to gain valuable experience.

Tier One Volunteer Emergency Responders

To be classified as a tier one volunteer emergency responder, you must possess and maintain at least one fire certification, or one EMS certification as listed below with preference given to those with one fire and one EMS certification:

- SFFMA Intro (or higher) Firefighter
- TCFP Basic (or higher) Firefighter
- EMT-B Basic
- EMT-P Paramedic

Tier one volunteer emergency responders in good standing are eligible to receive a stipend in accordance with program guidelines, participate in the Texas Emergency Services Retirement System (TESRS) and the Length of Service Award Program (LOSAP). One of the goals of the tier one volunteer emergency responder is to participate in the "City of Lucas Fire-Rescue Staffing Plan" in accordance with departmental strategies.

Tier Two Volunteer Emergency Responders

To be classified as a tier two volunteer emergency responder, you must be enrolled in an accredited interior structural firefighting program or an approved EMT-Basic or Paramedic school. You are required to be pursuing certification in one or more of the following:

- SFFMA Firefighter
- TCFP Firefighter
- EMT-Basic or above

Tier two volunteer emergency responders may not assist in ensuring adequate staffing and are not eligible to receive a stipend.

Stipend Program:

Only tier one volunteer emergency responders in good standing are eligible to receive stipends based on the following guidelines:

- Volunteer emergency responders with rank of Chief Engineer, Operations Chief or Night Incident Commander will receive a flat rate stipend of \$625 per month.
- Tier one volunteer emergency responder stipends are based on the following:
 - \circ Day shift (7:00 am to 7:00 pm) = \$75
 - Night Shift 7:00 pm to 7:00 am for night shift) = \$45
- If a volunteer emergency responder is unable to volunteer for the activity/shift they signed up for, they shall attempt to find a replacement and notify the shift supervisor.
- Sign-ups will be completed in the "FD Shift Calendar" in Outlook.
- The maximum stipend an individual may receive annually is \$7,500. Emergency Volunteer Responders may sign-up for additional shifts, but stipends will not be paid over the \$7,500 maximum.
- Sign-ups will be completed by the 15th of the current month for the next month. There will be two months posted for sign-ups.

This memorandum of understanding is valid from the date signed by the volunteer emergency responder and accepted by the City of Lucas until dissolution by the volunteer emergency responder or the City of Lucas.
