Blondy Jhune Road

By the end of August, the future eastbound lane (southern half) of the roadway is scheduled to be complete with all traffic being switched to the southern side. The driveway culverts and headwalls should all be done as well. Traffic was switched to new pavement last month on the western end of the project and the milling and liming of the northern half started. The project is scheduled for completion in April 2020.

Stinson Road

The contractor is planning to have the eastern half completed and open to traffic by the end of August. The removal of the western half of the pavement should begin as well. The project is scheduled for completion in December 2019.

Winningkoff Road

In anticipation of the start of the roadway project, AT&T will be relocating its infrastructure along Winningkoff Road between Forestview Drive and Snider Lane in August and September. The utility contractor will be utilizing existing easements in the Huntwick II and Creekwood Estates neighborhoods.

West Lucas Road

The old road (center 24 feet) constructed before 2012 in front of Willow Springs Middle School is scheduled to be repaired before the first day of school on August 19.

Roadway Maintenance in Fiscal Year 2019-2020

The following streets are being considered for rehabilitation:

- East Winningkoff Road
- Forest Grove Road
- Lewis Lane
- Snider Lane
- Stinson Road
- West Lucas Road

FM 1378 Improvements

FM 1378 is known as Country Club Road, West Lucas Road, and Southview Drive in Lucas. TxDOT will begin a project this month with three main objectives: 1) add narrow shoulders to FM 1378, 2) improve drainage, and 3) resurface the main lanes with high-friction asphalt. When TxDOT widened the White Rock Creek bridge just south of Forest Grove Road on FM 1378, these three objectives were accomplished north of the bridge. This new project is six miles long from the White Rock Creek Bridge to Parker Road. TxDOT selected Jagoe-Public Company who estimates that the construction will last about 12 months.

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Mayors Message

House Bill 2439 was signed into law by Governor Greg Abbott during this last legislative session and will become effective September 1, 2019.

House Bill 2439 applies to all residential, multi-family and commercial buildings AND severely limits the City's ability to require any sort of building materials in any of our zoning districts.

The bill states that "...a governmental entity may not adopt, or enforce a rule, charter provision, ordinance, order or building code, or other regulation that prohibits or limits, directly or indirectly, the use or installation of a building product or material in the construction, renovation or maintenance, or other alteration of a residential or commercial building if the building product or material is approved for use by a national model code published within the last three code cycles that apply to construction, renovation, maintenance, or other alteration of the building."

Under this new law, the City cannot require a builder/contractor to use certain materials. However, it is legal for homeowners associations to have these restrictions and deed restrictions on various items because the associations are private enterprises.

Revised Date for Fiscal Year 2019/2020 Budget Public Hearing

August 22 @ 7 pm

Due to the timing of when the City receives the certified tax roll from Collin County and when the City Council determines a proposed tax rate to be used and included as part of required public hearing advertisements, the City's budget public hearing dates have been moved from August 1 to August 22.

The public hearing notice for the budget requires special language regarding anticipated property tax revenue increases which will not be calculated until the City Council determination of the proposed tax rate.

Blondy Jhune/Winningkoff Intersection Neighborhood Meeting Update

Thank you to the approximately 40 Lucas neighbors who came out to attend the neighborhood meeting on July 10. The presentation provided an overview of possible intersection design elements and options to address safety concerns associated with the Blondy Jhune/Winningkoff intersection. For those of you who may not have been able to attend the meeting, an audio recording is available on the City website. The purpose of the meeting was to ensure that Lucas citizens had an opportunity to:

- 1) receive information regarding why specific recommendations were being made;
- 2) discuss other possible solutions that should be considered;
- 3) explore possible impacts regarding maneuverability of school buses, truck and horse trailers, and other farm equipment; and
- 4) address any potential impact to the rural atmosphere of the area.

In order to make an informed decision before moving forward with construction of the intersection, the City Council wants to ensure that they have a clear understanding of citizen concerns and the engineering recommendations to ensure the best possible outcome.

In response to the feedback received at the meeting, the following actions have been taken thus far:

- The approximate area on Blondy Jhune Road where a potential low-rise island would be placed has been painted on the road. The southern edge of the roadway has also been painted to show the potential for excess pavement beyond what is needed for a school bus or a truck pulling a horse trailer. This will give neighbors a visual representation of the proposed island and an opportunity to visually assess the maneuverability of the intersection.
- An item will be placed on the August 15th City Council agenda to discuss the Blondy Jhune/Winningkoff intersection. There will be a brief overview, opportunity for citizen input and Council discussion, followed by Council direction to City Staff on how to move forward.
- In an effort to address speed in the area, City staff has erected two additional speed limit signs on Winningkoff Road.

Upcoming Drainage Workshop

September 12 @ 7pm

The City Council will be conducting a joint drainage workshop with the Planning and Zoning Commission at their September 12, 2019 meeting. Many older neighborhoods in Lucas developed prior to 2012 were not required to comply with the City's current drainage requirements. This has caused a common drainage issue in a significant portion of the City. There will be an open discussion regarding drainage issues and challenges throughout the City and possible solutions to install, maintain, and promote drainage on both private and public property. The City currently faces many challenges with limited resources and limited staff to correct these issues. City staff will provide the Council with possible solutions to properly serve the citizens and help alleviate one of the largest ongoing issues pertaining to Lucas.

Technology Committee Update

The Technology Committee held a meeting on Tuesday, July 9 and met with Lucas resident Josh Mercer regarding internet services offered by Big Wave Wireless, a wireless internet service provider (WISP) with towers and base stations that provide wireless internet connection. Mr. Mercer discussed spectrum challenges such as many WISPs are deployed in unlicensed frequencies, the use of off-the-shelf inexpensive hardware, tower antennas at a 90-degree wide angle, and noise radio frequency environments. Mr. Mercer addressed how to mitigate spectrum challenges that included using RADWIN wireless carrier grade equipment that utilizes true beam forming technology for interference mitigation. Big Wave Wireless consists of base stations that can provide up to 750 Mbps per sector. Mr. Mercer indicated that subscribers can expect to see between 25 Mbps and 100 Mbps and that each tower site can reliably serve up to 200 users. Mr. Mercer explained that a base station on the Winningkoff tower was enough to cover most of the City, while the McGarity tower would be added service and a third tower could provide additional capacity as needed.

The Committee discussed the City of Mont Belvieu's fiber network which is Texas' first municipally owned fiber-optic broadband network that offers subscribers internet service with up to one gigabyte per second. City staff has been in contact with City of Mont Belvieu staff to coordinate a meeting to discuss the planning and implementation of a fiber network. The Committee has expressed interest in traveling to the meeting in Mont Belvieu, Texas, and a future meeting date will be coordinated.

The Committee also reviewed data collected from the speed test and the locations of reported internet speeds collected thus far. The Committee will be creating reports of a geographical map outlining speed results and provider information while protecting private information. The Committee will continue to collect more data to present a full representation of internet service throughout the City.

Public Lands Trail Cleanup

The City is partnering with the Trinity Trail Preservation Association and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for a trail cleanup event as part of National Public Lands Day on Saturday, September 21, 2019. The cleanup event will be held from 9 am to 1 pm at Brockdale Park and Highland Park trailhead. We encourage the community to participate in this cleanup event to remove trash and debris from the trails as we continue to "Keep Lucas Beautiful."

We ask that all volunteers pre-register for the cleanup event. The registration deadline is Friday, September 13 by 5 pm. All registered volunteers will be contacted prior to the event date and grouped into cleanup teams to meet at either Brockdale Park or Highland Park Trailhead for the cleanup. Celebrating Lucas Fire-Rescue Volunteers

Firefighter/Paramedic Brandon McVean



Firefighter/Paramedic Brandon McVean is a fairly new volunteer with the City of Lucas Fire-Rescue, joining the department in September of 2018. He currently serves as a Firefighter/Paramedic volunteering over 1,300 hours since he's been with Lucas Fire-Rescue.

Brandon was born in Arlington, Texas, but spent most of his life moving every couple of years to various Texas cities for his mother's career. Eventually, Brandon decided to move in with his grandmother in Allen, Texas, and has spent the last eight years in this area. Brandon attended high school at a small private school in Plano called Great Lakes Academy. Immediately following high school, Brandon began studying at Collin College where he would obtain his EMT-Basic certification, his Texas Commission on Fire Protection certification, and his EMT-Paramedic certification. He would eventually like to pursue a bachelor's degree in Computer Science or a related field.

Brandon recently accepted a full-time position as a Firefighter/Paramedic with Plano Fire-Rescue at just 21 years old. Brandon is also enlisted in the Texas State Guard, a state-funded military organization that provides support to the National Guard and the State of Texas in disaster relief and homeland security operations. He also volunteers with Lone Star Search & Rescue, a K9 search-and-rescue team based in Wylie, Texas and a close partner with Lucas Fire-Rescue. Outside of his career and his volunteer work with Lucas Fire-Rescue Brandon enjoys shooting various types of guns both leisurely and competitively. When he's not shooting, you can find him on a bike ride or tinkering with computers. When asked why he chose to pursue a career in the fire/EMS industry, Brandon stated, "The fire service is an incredibly unique and fulfilling occupation. It is one in which a distraught mother will hand you her ailing child without a second thought, and trust a complete stranger with her whole world, simply because of the uniform we wear and the logo on the door. In my opinion, the responsibility that comes with that is without comparison. When you're responsible for the safety of thousands of citizens in the event of an emergency, passion is essential, and improvement should be an unending process." He also stated in the limited experience he has had so far in this industry that he has learned two valuable points.

- "The minute you stop learning and improving, you're sunk."
- "Nobody cares how much you know until they know how much you care."

Brandon has shown the department nothing but outstanding dedication over the last 10 months and he has amazed us in the accomplishments he has achieved. We are incredibly fortunate and grateful to have him as a part of the Lucas Fire-Rescue family.

July 4th Activities

On July 5th at approximately 10 pm, the City of Lucas concluded its annual fireworks patrol. Over the two days of patrol, the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and 911 received 21 calls for service. The City passed out 12 letters of warning for the illegal use of fireworks. With the continued effort from the community, we hope that next year there will be no illegal use of fireworks and zero letters of warning or citations issued. The overall operations was successfully completed with the help of City departments from Public Works, Code Enforcement, Lucas Fire-Rescue and assistance from the Collin County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) and CCSO Citizens on Patrol.
