This committee was created after Councilmember Debbie Fisher brought to the Council her concerns regarding limited, unreliable and in some cases, unavailable internet service that many of our residents experience. The City Council responded by creating the Technology Committee. The City put out a call for volunteers and true to Lucas form many well qualified, well educated, tech savvy, Lucas residents answered the call. The appointed members have been hard at work gathering data, researching with internet providers and seeking solutions. In early September, the Committee is traveling to Mont Belvieu, Texas to have a first hand look at how this small Texas city has addressed this problem for their citizens.

Paul Rathgeb is the Chairman of the Technology Committee. He, his wife Marie, and their 3 children (Armand 17, Audrey 14, and Lucie 12) moved to Lucas six years ago. ## Mayor's Message

Your City Council continues to invest in infrastructure while being sensitive to the amount of taxes you pay to the City. As the City Council prepares to review and update our Capital Improvement Plan at the September 5, 2019 City Council meeting, it is nice to reflect on the completion of recent projects that benefit our citizens, some of which include:

Winningkoff Reverse Curve  
Stinson Road/West Lucas Road Intersection Improvements  
West Lucas Road Widening and Maintenance  
White Rock Trail Reconstruction  
East Winningkoff Road Trailhead  
Parker Road 12-Inch Waterline Phase 1 – Section 1  
Parker Road Eight-Inch Waterline Phase 2  
Parker Road Eight-Inch Waterline Phase 3  
Snider Lane Eight-Inch Waterline  
Replaced every water meter with the upgraded Neptune Meter

In the May edition of the Lucas Leader, I discussed the City Council considering issuing certificates of obligation. The City Council obtained a structural analysis for the Winningkoff, Snider and Stinson bridges (this entire report is available on the City's website)

and considered other projects to determine the financial investment that would be required. Council debated and decided that the best way to fund these priority capital projects with minimal impact to our citizens was through the issuance of certificates of obligation. At the August 1 City Council meeting, the City Council voted to approve the issuance of \$9 million dollars of certificates of obligation. The "Series 2019" certificates of obligation will fund \$7.5 million in bridge and roadway improvements and \$1.5 million in water projects that will improve water flow and water quality. The following projects have been funded with the 2019 certificates of obligation:

### Bridges:

- Design for the replacement of the Stinson Road Bridge
  - Design for the replacement of the Snider Lane Bridge
- Note: Once the design is complete for both bridges, the City Council will evaluate the reconstruction of the bridge deemed the highest priority.

### Roadways:

- Winningkoff Road southern section culvert
- West/East Lucas Road intersection at the Bait Shop (TxDOT funding with 20% local contribution)
- West Lucas Road widening (seeking 2018 Collin County Bond funding with 20% local contribution)

### Water Projects:

- Rollingwood Circle/Choice Lane/Lakeview Drive 6-inch waterline loop
- Edgefield Lane/West Lucas Road and Cedar Bend Trail/East Lucas Road 6-inch waterline loop
- Graham Lane/Rock Ridge Court 8-inch waterline loop

The City received an excellent bond rating report of AA+ from Standard & Poor's. The report showed strong management, very strong budgetary performance and flexibility, very strong liquidity, and good financial policies and practices. Because of the City's AA+ financial rating the City was able to receive a very low interest rate of 2.34 percent. Due to the great interest rate that they City received on the issuance, the proposed tax rate in the draft budget for FY 2019-2020 remains the same at a rate of **\$303216**. City Council's goal is to provide a way to fund essential capital projects with minimal financial impact to our citizens. That means we strategically borrow money with our eye on how to make the biggest impact with each dollar to provide our citizens with the best value.

## Lucas Announces Farmers Market

The City of Lucas is pleased to announce the grand opening of the Lucas Farmers Market, October 12 from 8 am to Noon at the Lucas Community Park located next to City Hall. Another City-sponsored market is scheduled for November 2. These two markets are trial runs to measure whether local citizens and farmers will support a regularly scheduled market beginning next spring.

"Lucas is a farming community, so it only seems natural that we help our local farmers sell products to neighbors who want a convenient place to buy healthy, fresh food," said Councilmember Tim Baney. "We are excited the City Council has agreed to sponsor this grassroots project and invite everyone to come out and support the market." A recent Parks and Open Space Board meeting was attended by many enthusiastic supporters, 17 of whom agreed to serve on a steering committee to get the project underway. The committee is currently working to establish market rules, identify vendors and create market awareness.

Fees will be waived to area producers for the first year. 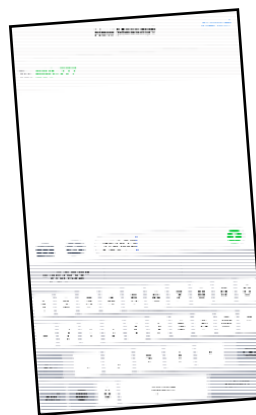

## The Truth About Recycling

The entire industry of recycling has changed throughout the years, and U.S. recycling facilities are facing challenges in collecting and disposing recyclable materials. The current effects of recycling challenges have caused higher costs in labor, technology and equipment, as well as increased contamination levels amongst collected materials that require more transport and disposal. For decades, China has been the largest importer of the world's recycled commodities and 40 percent of those commodities were exported by the U.S. However, China has adopted new acceptance criteria for imported recyclables which includes banning all mixed paper from import. Reductions in accepted recyclables took effect in March 2018, which affected costs and changes at most U.S. recycling facilities to meet new standards. Due to changes in recycling demands, it is important for the public to know which materials are recyclable and non-recyclable and how it impacts U.S. recycling facilities. For instance, batteries are not recyclable. Batteries can combust during the recycling process and damage equipment and facilities. Other non-recyclable materials include pizza boxes covered with food or grease residue and liquid-filled bottles and containers.

The City of Lucas maintains an agreement with Republic Services to provide subscription-based services for curbside recycling to

## Keep Yourself Informed Instantly Sign up for Nixle

Recently, the City experienced a water line break at the McGarity water tower. This break affected many residents throughout the City with low water pressure. City staff began working on the break around 9:30 pm and finished making repairs at 1:00 am. Because of staff's quick response, no resident was ever without water.

This is a great example of why Nixle, the City's emergency notification system, is a great tool to sign up for. Residents that have signed up for Nixle, were notified within minutes of the water main break, aware that the problem was being addressed, and notified when the repairs were complete.

Signing up for Nixle will keep you informed with up-to-date information. To sign up for Nixle, text your **zip code** to 888777 and hit send, you will receive a text confirmation that you have been added to the Nixle sign up for Lucas. Its that easy! residents. There are 736 out of 2,563 homes utilizing curbside recycling in Lucas. It is important for residents to sign up for curbside recycling to help protect the environment and eliminate waste. The City currently has a 31.6 percent contamination level in the recycling stream. To help reduce residual waste and contamination, *Recycling Simplified* is a new educational initiative created by Republic Services to educate residents on the new way of recycling. Recycling is simple as three steps: (1) know what to throw away, (2) empty, clean and dry all recyclables, and (3) do not bag any recyclables.
