Mayors Message

As the year comes to an end, I couldn't help but think about all we have accomplished. I can tell you... our 60th year as the City of Lucas was very eventful and all in a good way!

I hope you made it out to see Santa at Country Christmas. I believe that we had over 1,000 people attend and enjoy hot chocolate, cookies, ice skating, In & Out Burger, train rides and a Holiday Farmers Market. The weather was great and the kids didn't want to leave. This event always seems to culminate the year and brings it all together. We were able pause and think about all of

the other events throughout the year, such as Founders Day, the City of Lucas 60th Anniversary, the Spring Clean-up event, Trail Clean-up, two Farmers Markets, Arbor Day, Scarecrow Contest and the Equine Parade.

Your tax dollars were put to work with the issuance of Certificates of Obligation for road maintenance and reconstruction as well as utility maintenance. 

Mark your Calendars 2020 Farmers Market Season

At the December 5, 2019 City Council meeting, the City Council discussed establishing a schedule for the Farmers Markets to be held in 2020.

The Farmers Market schedule that was approved by the City Council includes the following dates:

- First Market of the 2020 Season on April 25 (Fourth Saturday in April)
- May 9 (Second Saturday in conjunction with Founders Day) and May 23 (Fourth Saturday)
- June 13 (Second Saturday) and June 27 (Fourth Saturday)
- July 11 (Second Saturday) and July 25 (Fourth Saturday)
- August 8 (Second Saturday) and August 22 (Fourth Saturday)
- September 12 (Second Saturday and September 26 (Fourth Saturday)
- October 10 (Second Saturday)
- November (no market scheduled)
- December 4 (First Friday indoor Holiday Farmers Market at Country Christmas)

The mission statement of the Lucas Farmers Market is to create a safe and pleasant social experience for our community and visitors by providing access to local farmers, food producers and artists. The Lucas Farmers Market Committee will hold their first planning meeting for the 2020 season on Tuesday, January 7 at 5:30 pm in the Council Chambers at City Hall. The goal of the Lucas Farmers Market Committee was to maintain a vendor mix that included 50% agricultural producers, 30% value added/cottage food vendors and 20% artisan vendors. Review and updates to the rules will be discussed at the planning meeting along with updates to the application process and the implementation of vendor fees to cover the cost associated with the market.



Deadline Approaching for Service Tree Nominations

January 10 is the deadline to submit nominations for a Service Tree Award. The City of Lucas has established a Service Tree Award Program that allows for annual recognition of an individual, business, youth or civic group who has contributed a significant and useful service to the community. The award consists of planting and dedicating a living tree at the Lucas Community Park in the recipients honor and Service Tree Awards presented to the recipients during the Lucas Founders Day event on May 9, 2020. https://www.lucastexas.us/service-tree-program/. Nominations must be submitted no later than **January 10, 2020** to City Secretary Stacy Henderson at shenderson@lucastexas.us. Nominees should meet the following criteria:

- Actions should benefit the City/residents in a significant way.
- Nominee may be individual, youth, church group, civic or neighborhood group (ex: HOA, garden club), youth group (ex: Boy or Girl Scout troop, 4-H Club), local business, local charity.
- The individual must live in the City of Lucas or have lived in the City of Lucas corporate limits during the time the service was performed. If a business or church, they must be located within the City of Lucas.



The next phase of the Winningkoff Road work is north of the reverse curve project. This next phase will extend to and include the Snider Lane/Winningkoff Road intersection. This project was awarded to McMahon Contracting along with the Blondy Jhune Road and Stinson Road projects. McMahon cannot start the Winningkoff project until Blondy Jhune is open to two-way traffic, which is anticipated in January. Stinson Road as well should be open two-way traffic in January.

There is a maintenance project associated with the Winningkoff reverse curve. Almost immediately after the completion, several panels of the southbound lane near the southern end of the project began to crack. The cause of the cracking has been determined to be a lack of lime stabilization under the concrete. G-Rod Contractors, the reverse curve contractor, will be replacing these panel sections soon. Most likely prior to the beginning of McMahon's work on Winningkoff north of the reverse curve. The schedule and traffic control plan have not been finalized at this time.

The North Pump Station project is on schedule for completion in late summer or early fall. The existing antiquated three-pump station is being replaced with a new five-pump station to improve water delivery and fire protection. Once the exiting pump station is demolished, there will be room to construct the new water tower at the North Pump Station located at 915 Country Club Road.

Candidate Filing Begins

City of Lucas General Election

City elections will be held on May 2, 2020. There will be two seats on the ballot during the City's General Election that include the seats for City Council Seat 1 and City Council Seat 2 each serving three year terms. Applications for a place on the ballot in the General Election will be available from the City Secretary's office beginning January 2. Prospective candidates may file an application with the City Secretary beginning Wednesday, January 15 through Friday, February 14, 2020 from 8 am to 5 pm. Please note that electronic candidate application submittals will not be accepted.

To be eligible to be a candidate for office, the City Charter states the following criteria must be met:

- Has been a resident of the City of Lucas for twelve (12) continuous months
- Qualified voter of the city
- Has never been convicted of and is not currently charged with a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude
- Is 18 years of age
- Is not delinquent on any ad valorem tax due to the City of Lucas

Below is an overview of the City's Boards and Commissions:

Planning and Zoning Commission - 2-year term

2nd Thursday of each month - Meetings begin at 7 pm Makes recommendations to the City Council on matters relating to rezoning applications, site plans, plats, and development projects for the City.

Parks and Open Space Board - 2-year term

4th Tuesday, meets every other month - Meetings begin at 7 pm Serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council and staff in matters relating to the parks and open space of the City and implementing beautification projects.

Board of Adjustment - 2-vear term

Meets as needed - Responsible for reviewing application requests for special exceptions to the City's Zoning Ordinances and determining if variances are needed related to items such as fencing, lot coverage, and signage.

To serve on a City Board candidates must meet the following criteria:

- Be a citizen of the City for twelve continuous months prior to appointment
- Be eighteen years old prior to the date of appointment
- Have not been convicted and are not currently charged with a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude
- Have no indebtedness to the City, such as delinquent taxes
- Be a qualified voter of the City
