Provide an update on the status of the Request for Proposal (RFP) for a Broadband Network Design and Financial Model.

Background Information

The goal of the RFP is to acquire the services of a consultant to provide a high-level design and financial model for existing and future broadband needs. The broadband study will assess the cost of installation, operation, and maintenance of a broadband network; and the revenues generated from retail services and third-party network access. The deliverables for the study will include a financial model that allows dynamic adjustments in cost and revenue assumptions across a recommended time horizon.

The RFP was distributed to vendors and posted on the City's website on December 16, 2019. The following vendors have expressed interest in responding to the RFP: Fujitsu Network Communications, Lit Communities, Magellan Advisors, and Vantage Point. All vendors were asked to submit any questions relating to the RFP by January 8, 2020. A comprehensive list of questions and answers in response to the RFP will be distributed to vendors and posted on the City's website.

The submission deadline for all proposals is January 24, 2020.

Discuss the future of Internet services provided by Frontier Communications.

Background Information

During Citizen Input at the November 12, 2019 Technology Committee meeting, Steve Preston, 1525 Bee Caves, inquired if there would be plans to replace Frontier Communications. Mr. Preston indicated that Frontier Communications may be facing bankruptcy. City staff and the Technology Committee has researched Mr. Preston's concern, and there has been no direct information from Frontier Communications regarding the concern and how it will affect the future of Internet service in Lucas.

The City's Internet speed test map revealed that Frontier Communications provided Internet service primarily within the southern section of Lucas. The southern section of Lucas on the Internet speed test map can be identified as south of West Lucas Road and East Lucas Road; and north of Parker Road. There was a total of 127 household respondents who indicated having Internet service provided by Frontier Communications. The Internet speed test calculated an average download speed of 87.88 Mbps and upload speed of 69.97 Mbps from households with service from Frontier Communications. The most recent data shows that there are 508 total households that responded to the City's Internet speed test. Households that are serviced by Frontier Communications make up 25 percent of the respondents.
