No Vehicles Allowed on Trinity Trail

The Trinity Trail is 25 miles of equestrian and hiking trails along Lavon Lake on U.S. Army Corp of Engineers land with trailheads located at Brockdale Park Road, Winningkoff Road, and Highland Park. The Trinity Trail is managed by a non-profit volunteer organization, the Trinity Trail Preservation Association, whose main goal is to preserve the trail and encourage hikers, joggers, nature lovers, and trail riders to use the scenic trail.

The U.S. Army Corp of Engineers does not allow for vehicle traffic on the trail including, dirt bikes and four-wheelers. When this occurs, it can cause a tremendous amount of damage and additional volunteer hours to maintain the trail to its original condition. Don't mess with Texas TRASH-OFF

The Don't mess with Texas Trash-off cleanup event will be held on Saturday, April 4, 2020 from 8 am to 12 pm. This annual spring cleanup event is part of the Keep Lucas Beautiful program to support efforts in clearing roadsides of trash. We strongly encourage the community to participate as a volunteer in the Don't mess with Texas Trash-Off as we continue to promote the beautification of the City, litter abatement, and sustainable practices.

Volunteers must also submit the adult or minor volunteer release form found on the above mentioned website. The volunteer release forms must be submitted to Assistant to the City Manager Kent Souriyasak via email at kent@lucastexas.us or dropped off at City Hall.

We strongly recommend that volunteers register prior to the cleanup event. However, you may also register onsite at the event. Volunteer check-in will begin at 8 am at the pavilion of the Lucas Community Park located at 665 Country Club Road. Volunteers will be divided into cleanup groups, supervised by City staff and transported to the cleanup sites. Supplies, beverages and lunch will be provided to all volunteers.

The cleanup sites will take place along the following roadsides: East Lucas Road, East Winningkoff Road, Estates Parkway, Estelle Lane, Forest Grove Road, Ingram Lane, Orr Road, Snider Lane, Stinson Road, West Lucas Road (between Angel Parkway and Country Club Road), and Winningkoff Road (between south of Christian Lane and north of Snider Lane). Road closures will include Snider Lane and Stinson Road during the hours of the cleanup event to ensure the safety of volunteers.

Lucas Broadband Study

In 2019, the Technology Committee was formed to research possible internet solutions to resolve issues related to internet service in Lucas. During their research, the Technology Committee identified that a broadband study would help determine which broadband options could resolve internet problems, and the City Council approved the recommendation to acquire the services of Magellan Advisors to conduct the broadband study.

A kick-off meeting and work session will be scheduled with the City, the Technology Committee, and Magellan Advisors to discuss goals, review the planning process, and provide any information needed to conduct the broadband study. The proposed timeline to complete the broadband study is four months. We look forward to reviewing the recommendations in the broadband study to improve internet service in Lucas.

When I initially thought about this article, I had decided to write about outdoor burning, but now with COVID-19 I thought I should give you an update on what the City is looking at. (I'll let outdoor burning smolder for another month.)

To start off I want you to know that the City of Lucas does have a Continuity of Operation Plan as part of our Emergency Operations Plan. The Continuity of Operations Plan is intended to provide guidance as to how we continue to deliver City services in the event of catastrophic damage to City facilities or to loss of staffing due to a pandemic. The City understands that emergency services like fire and EMS are critical and must be operational at all times. Water service is also a necessity for sanitary living conditions. It is important that these functions along with others that the City delivers continue in spite of the events that can happen. As to COVID-19. The City of Lucas partners with Collin County and the County Health Department to stay abreast of the latest conditions and spread of this virus. We along with other Collin County cities and school districts attended a briefing with the County on March 11 to get the latest update, as well as how we will have near constant contact with the Health Department as we move forward.

As to where we are right now. The CDC along with the County Health Department feel that the "risk of transmission is low" in Collin County. Those most at risk are the elderly and those with underlying health conditions that may compromise their ability to fight off the virus. They reiterated that all of us should practice good hygiene by washing our hands and keep an adequate "social distance" in crowded or populated areas.

As I watch what is happening around the nation, I want the residents of Lucas to know that City staff and City Council have your well-being at the forefront of our thoughts and decisions as we move forward. This is a very fluid event and we will adjust our response as things change. It will be our intent to continue with governmental meetings that are essential for maintaining City services. Other social events will be addressed as conditions warrant. As decisions are made, we will let you know via our website and our social media outlets. Please stay safe and well.

City Elections-What's on the Ballot

The 2020 General and Special City elections will take place on Saturday, May 2 at the Lucas Community Center at 665 Country Club Road. Early voting will be held April 20 through April 28. The General Election ballot will include City Council Seat 1 and City

Council Seat 2, and the Special Election ballot will include updates to the City's Home Rule Charter and renewal of the street maintenance tax allocation. The City of Lucas is a Home Rule City that operates under a Home Rule Charter. City charters define the structure, duties and authority of their local government. The City of Lucas voted to become a Home Rule Charter city in May 2008 and the charter requires a review every five years. Any amendments to the City Charter are presented to the voters for consideration. To view all the charter amendments before you vote, go to www.lucastexas.us/elections.

Renewal of the City's 0.50% street maintenance sales tax dedication will also be on the ballot. Sales tax is levied by the City on all goods sold within the city limits. The City has adopted a dedicated purpose sales tax that allocates 0.50% of the 2% sales tax collected for street maintenance. These dedicated funds will be spent to repair and maintain existing city streets. This dedicated revenue source for street maintenance will discontinue in September 2020 unless voters approve its continuation. This represents approximately \$387,000 annually.

Service Tree Award Winners Announced

Congratulations to David Rhoads and Craig Zale, 2020 recipients of the City of Lucas Service Tree Award. The Service Tree Award program was established in 2015 to recognize individuals or groups who have contributed significant and useful service to the community.

David Rhoads was honored for his work as a dedicated volunteer and community servant. In addition to his emergency and non-emergency work with Lucas Fire-Rescue, he has consistently served on multiple Boards and Commissions including the Parks and Open Space Board since 2013 and as the Board Chair since 2016. Craig Zale was honored for his work as an exemplary first responder and emergency services volunteer. He has dedicated countless hours and personal resources to the activities and betterment of Lucas Fire-Rescue. He was instrumental in bringing emergency medical services to the City of Lucas and improving the quality of life for all citizens and visitors. April 1 – National Census Day

As mandated by the US Constitution, a count of the population living in the United States is taken every 10 years. These decennial census results are necessary to ensure fair representation in the legislative process. Based on these numbers, maps are re-drawn into districts to reapportion the population so that all areas have a balanced representation in the legislatures at the federal and state levels. April 1, 2020 is National Census Day. The goal is to make sure the new maps created by the Census results are fair, right and constitutional. It is possible with new numbers reported that Collin County will qualify for its own Senate District for the first time. Important dates for the Census include:

•	March 12-20	Census information mailed to households, questionnaires may be answered online, mail or by phone
•	April 1	National Census Day
•	May - July	Census takers visit homes that haven't responded to the 2020 Census.
•	December	Census Bureau delivers apportionment counts to the President and Congress
•	January 2021	87th Legislature convenes
•	February	Expected delivery of Census data to Texas
•	May 31	87th Legislature adjourns
•	March 2022	First elections held with new districts
