



### MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Since I don't know when these newsletters will get into everyone's mailbox before early voting, I thought I would put this election reminder in the October newsletter. Normally, City election "stuff" is on the May election. May elections tend to be for municipal and school related

issues to somewhat isolate them from partisan politics. This year due to COVID the May elections were pushed to the November 3 national election day. The election slate in November will have everything from the President of United States, Congressional seats, State Legislative seats, to County Commissioners, School Board members, and yes... City of Lucas items. I thought I would just briefly remind you of what will be on the ballot for the City of Lucas.

There are actually two City Council seats up for re-election. City Council members serve three year terms so that two City Council seats come up each year. The Mayor's seat is also on a three year cycle. So this year City Council Seats 1 and Seat 2 are on the ballot.

Seat 1 is currently held by Councilmember Wayne Millsap and he is seeking re-election. Tim Johnson, a City of Lucas Planning and

Zoning Commissioner is also running for Seat 1. So it will be up to the citizens of Lucas as to who you would like to represent you. I would encourage you to look them up on their websites www.millsap4lucas.com and www.johnson4lucas.com or call them. (I am sure they wouldn't mind me saying that;) The City Council Seat 2 election is a little easier. Current Councilmember Tim Baney is seeking re-election and he is running unopposed.

Proposition "A" on the ballot for the City of Lucas is proposing to continue the  $\frac{1}{2}$ % (0.5%) of the sales tax collected in the City to go to street maintenance. Currently when you shop for nongrocery items you pay 8.25% sales tax. Right now 2.0% of the 8.25% comes to the City, 0.5% of the 2.0% is put in a fund that is used strictly for street maintenance. Last year the 0.5% added approximately \$387,000 to the street maintenance budget. If Proposition "A" passes that will continue.

Proposition "B" proposes the issuance of a general obligation bond in the amount of \$19,190,000 to create a City of Lucas fiber optic broadband utility system to deliver citywide broadband internet service. There is a lot of information on this, if you recall my article last month was dedicated to laying out Proposition "B" and I would encourage you to go to the City's website and there is button/box on the front page "Lucas Broadband Project" that will take you to several pages of information on this project.

### WINNINGKOFF ROAD PHASE 2 UPDATE

The Winningkoff Phase 2 project extends north from Forestview Drive to Snider Lane. The original contract with McMahon Contracting was cancelled and the next bidder, Camino Construction is scheduled to begin construction in October. The work schedule has not be provided by the contractor at this time, and the project duration was bid at 270 days, October to July, but may be lengthened based on new contract documents. Camino Construction is the same contractor that successfully and efficiently built the three lane Stinson Road connection to West Lucas Road in 2017.

Beginning November 1 through March 31 water restrictions will change to allow watering between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm, but still only twice per week.



## CITY WILL HOST FINAL FARMERS MARKETS OF THE SEASON

Lucas Farmers Markets will be held September 26 October 10 8am until Noon



"Despite the challenges this season, the Lucas Farmers Market created a safe community event while providing fresh, local food for our citizens to enjoy," said Councilmember Tim Baney. We are thankful to the steady stream of both vendors and shoppers who have continued to support our efforts to keep the Lucas Farmers Market a local community event. Over 40 vendors have signed up to participate in the September and October markets, including a strong showing of produce suppliers.

Shoppers can browse among a variety of products including locally grown produce, honey, syrup, herbs, flowers, jams, breads, free range eggs, salsa, chicken, beef and pork. Several vendors will offer teas, olive oils, soaps, cutting boards, and other artisan products. Upcoming markets will continue to follow local and state safety guidelines including:

- Wash or disinfect hands frequently
- Maintain 6 feet of separation from individuals not within the same household.
- Mandatory wearing cloth face coverings or masks (over the nose and mouth) when entering the market.
- Measures such as cough etiquette, and good hygiene should be practiced.

# LIVE STREAMING OF CITY COUNCIL AND BOARD MEETINGS BEGINNING IN OCTOBER

To better reach our citizens and provide as many opportunities as possible to connect with our City Council and other boards and commissions, the City has partnered with SwagIt, a video streaming company, to begin in October streaming City Council, Planning and Zoning Commission, and Board of Adjustment meetings live via all platforms and devices capable of video playback.

While City meetings are closed to on-site visitors, Zoom will continue to be used for those residents that would like to participate and speak at a meeting, but you may also view the live feed from the City's website. The meeting recordings will also offer bookmarking to easily find particular agenda items within the recording.

Once City meetings are open to on-site visitors, the City will discontinue Zoom and move to live streaming of meetings so that you may view a meeting from anywhere should you not be able to attend in person. We hope Lucas residents enjoy this new feature of staying informed with what's happening in Lucas.



# MEET YOUR CITY ENGINEER Stanton Foerster

This summer, City Engineer Stanton Foerster, P.E. celebrated his seventh anniversary with the City of Lucas. During that seven years, the City Council authorized more public works projects than in the previous 55 years. Waterlines, concrete roads, bridges, and pump stations have been in high gear in Lucas and dramatic changes

have taken place to the infrastructure in Lucas.

After graduating from the University of Oklahoma, Stanton started his engineering career with the Texas Department of Transportation in 1987. During his seven years with TxDOT, Stanton was responsible for \$200 million in right-of-way acquisition; various aspects of public involvement; and all elements relating to construction traffic control plans including the sequencing of construction for \$820 million in state highways, city streets, and light rail projects. From 1994 to joining the City in 2013, Stanton ran his own consulting firm where he was the engineer-of-record for several north Texas towns. He was also Director of Special Projects for Transportation Strategies, Inc. an affiliate of the international law firm of Winstead, P.C.; the Business Development Manager for the Environmental and Transportation Divisions of CP&Y, Inc.; and the Transportation Manager for the City of Allen.

As the City Engineer, Stanton performs complex management, administrative, and technical professional work in the engineering, leadership, development, and technological enhancement of the operations of the Engineering Department. Operations of the Department include facilitation of the design and development of a wide variety of construction projects, environmental management and protection, and oversight of public utilities infrastructure. Also, he is responsible for capital streets and drainage structures and a wide variety of public works projects and programs.

Beyond the everyday challenges of the Lucas engineering needs, Stanton is committed to his community as well. During the past 20 years, Stanton was Deputy Mayor Pro Tem of the Rowlett City Council and a Planning and Zoning Commissioner, a member of the Dallas Regional Mobility Council, a Trinity Harbor Church founding member, and President/Vice President of two homeowners associations.



# ACCEPTING NOMINATIONS FOR SERVICE TREE AWARDS

The City of Lucas has established a Service Tree Award Program that allows for annual recognition of an individual, business, youth or civic group who has contributed a significant and useful service to the community. The award consists of planting and dedicating a living tree at the Lucas Community Park in the recipients honor. All nominees will be reviewed, and finalists selected by the Lucas City Council, with Service Tree Awards presented to the recipients during the Lucas Founders Day event in May 8, 2021. To submit a nomination, an online application can be found on the City's website at www.lucastexas.us/service-tree-program/. Nominations must be submitted no later than December 10, 2020 to City Secretary Stacy Henderson at shenderson@lucastexas.us. Nominees should meet the following criteria:

- Actions should benefit the City/residents in a significant way.
- Nominee may be individual, youth, church group, civic or neighborhood group (ex: HOA, garden club), youth group (ex: Boy or Girl Scout troop, 4-H Club), local business or charity.
- The individual must live in the City of Lucas or have lived in the city corporate limits during the time the service was performed. If a business or church, they must be located within the City of Lucas.

#### Join a Board or Commission

Application Deadline is November 1, 2020

Would you like to serve your community and get involved? One way to do that is to serve on a City of Lucas Board or Commission. The Lucas City Council is always looking for dedicated individuals that are interested in preserving the quality of life in Lucas. The deadline to apply is November 1 and prospective candidates will interview with the City Council at their November 19 meeting. Selected candidates will then be appointed at the December 3, 2020 City Council meeting. To serve on a City Board all candidates must meet the following criteria:

- Be a citizen of the City for twelve continuous months prior to appointment
- Be eighteen years old prior to the date of appointment
- Have not been convicted and are not currently charged with a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude
- Have no indebtedness to the City, such as delinquent taxes
- Be a qualified voter of the City

Below is an overview of the City's Boards and Commissions:

### Planning and Zoning Commission - 2-year term

2nd Thursday of each month - 7 pm Makes recommendations to the City Council on matters relating to rezoning applications, site plans, plats, and development projects for the City.

### Parks and Open Space Board - 2-year term

Meets every other month - 7 pm

Serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council and staff in matters relating to the parks and open space of the City and implementing beautification projects.

#### Board of Adjustment - 2-year term

Meets as needed

Responsible for reviewing application requests for special exceptions to the City's Zoning Ordinances and determining if variances are needed related to items such as fencing, lot coverage, and signage.
