Dawton believes the Fire Department is a very worthy group to be honored and appreciated for all they do for us. This is why he chose to custom build a picnic table for our own Lucas Fire Department. With materials donated from Tower Extrusions in Wylie and financial support from the City of Lucas and several generous citizens, some of who remain anonymous, made this endeavor possible. He used forest green planking on a carefully constructed frame. The bracing, made from raw angle and flat stock was carefully measured, cut, filed and drilled. Polished Diamond Plate displays several Dura---Black plates, which include the names of the firefighters, donors, a note of appreciation and a Bible verse, Isaiah 43:2. A plate with the words, "In Honor of Our Hometown Heroes" can be found in the center of the table. It also brandishes the Maltese Cross, the Star of Life and the various symbols which represent our Fire Station. Facing the unforeseen challenges of the year, he constructed this one of a kind table.

On December 7, 2020, Pearl Harbor Day, Dawton Bruner went on to achieve the Rank of Eagle Scout. The evening ended by Bruner retiring a very special American Flag which had been flown over Pearl Harbor in June 2006 in honor of Aviation Radioman 1st class Petty Officer James Elvin Sellers, a WWII veteran. Mr. Sellers served in the U.S. Navy from 1942---1945. He was the father of Mrs. Janet Tillman, a much loved and retired Lovejoy ISD Librarian, whom we would like to thank for entrusting us with this honor. Candidate Filing for City Elections January 13 - February 12, 2021

The City of Lucas general election will be held on May 1, 2021. There will be two City Council seats on the ballot. Seat 3 and Seat 4. as well as the seat for Mayor. Each position serves a three year term. Applications for a place on the ballot are now available from the City Secretary's office as well as the City's website election page. Prospective candidates may file an application with the City Secretary January 13 through February 12, 2021. Please note that electronic application submittals will not be accepted.

To be eligible for office, the City Charter states the following criteria must be met:

- Resident of the City for twelve continuous months
- Qualified voter of the city
- Never been convicted or not currently charged with a felony or crime involving moral turpitude
- 18 years of age
- Not delinquent on ad valorem taxes due to the City of Lucas

, in it	ORGANIZE A NEIGHBORHOOD BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT or enhance your yard by following these tips from the Collin County Master Gardeners:
ıt nto r	 February Prune rose bushes by 30-50% around Valentine's Day. Make each cut just above a bud. Prune shrubs: first remove any dead or damaged branches, then thin out by removing 1/3 of the oldest stems at ground level and shape the rest of the plant following its natural form. Plant cabbage, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cauliflower, and potatoes. Feed the birds. Do not forget fresh water! Begin clean-up in the garden and landscape. Remove weeds and debris, prune out dead foliage and cut back perennials.
s ril nat	 March Begin pruning to shape spring flowering shrubs and vines as they finish blooming throughout the season. Pruning of evergreens and summer flowering trees should be completed by early March. Begin planting shrubs, perennials, and annuals. Late in March, begin planting warm season vegetables: tomatoes, peppers, beans, corn, cucumbers, and squash. Perform an audit of the irrigation system. Dig and divide summer and fall flowering perennials just before they initiate their spring growth.
nd s in d ail y to	 April Install sod. Plant warm season annuals such as Angelonia, begonias, coleus, fountain grass, pentas. Hummingbirds are arriving. Hang feeders filled with 1-part cane sugar to 4 parts water. Boil to dissolve sugar and cool. May be refrigerated for 2 weeks. Plant dill, fennel, and parsley as host plants for swallowtail butterflies. Plant spring containers with good quality potting mix. Choose plants that share the same water and light requirements. Water root balls slowly. Use a good quality, time-released fertilizer once a month and water-soluble fertilizer every 2 weeks to keep plants in containers healthy. Fertilize shrubs and perennials with slow-release fertilizer. Stay on top of weeds; do not make new plants compete for space and nutrients.
