- During the cleanup event in your chosen area, place all trash bags centrally located together on the side of the road. You may also keep your cleanup supplies or leave them with the trash bags for pickup.
- Beginning at 1:00 pm, City staff will drive to the pickup locations to collect trash bags.

NORTH TEXAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

The North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) will temporarily change the disinfectant in its water treatment process from March 1 through March 29, 2022. This annual, routine change is necessary to maintain the regional system and year round water quality, but during this time, you may notice the water taste different. It is safe. The NTMWD has conducted the temporary change in water disinfectant for over a decade and continues to meet safe drinking water standards earning recognition from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as a Superior Public Water System. 
OUTDOOR BURNING PROHIBITED UNLESS CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS ARE MET

Some residents may have lost tree limbs during the winter storm in February, and with spring yard maintenance beginning, those tree limbs may be piling up. Outdoor burning of your tree limbs and brush is prohibited unless the following requirements can be met:

- Fire placed in an approved container no less than 15 feet from a structure
- Pile shall be three feet or less in diameter and two feet or less in height
- Fire shall only contain firewood and or natural tree branches generated on your property
- Fire shall be minimum of 25 feet from property line
- Extinguishment source such as water hose, fire extinguisher or shovel with dirt at site of fire
- Fire shall be constantly attended
- Fire shall not cause nuisance from smoke or traffic hazards
- Fire shall be located with a "clear sky view" and not ٠

located under a tree or canopy.

Should you need tree limbs removed, Barnes Waste Disposal will pick up unbundled brush no greater than 4 feet in length twice per month, and will collect unlimited bundled brush not heavier than 40 pounds placed by your cart for collection. Call Barnes at 972.734.3333 for more information.

As you may be aware, Barnes Waste Disposal after September, will no longer be providing trash services to the City of Lucas. City Council has sent requests for proposals to a long list of waste hauler in the area. Those proposals are due back to the City by March 1. Once Staff has had a chance to review and grade the proposals, City Council will consider the proposals at a meeting in late March or early April. We really want to be ahead of this so we can have the smoothest transition as possible. We will keep y'all posted.

Streets and drainage are still a topic of priority for the City and will be for years to come. There is no easy fix, so we need to look long-term at how we protect our quality of life in Lucas while living in one of the most rapidly growing counties in the State of Texas. Having said that... TxDOT is holding a public meeting on Thursday, February 24 from 6-8 pm at Lovejoy High School in the cafeteria to discuss and receive comments regarding the possible widening and realignment of Country Club/Southview (FM 1378) from Parker Road to East Stacy Road. This project will also lead into further project development for the east-west section along West Lucas Road from FM 3286 intersection to West Lucas Road. These are TxDOT roads, so after hearing from the public, TxDOT decides what is best for their roads.

Some of the favorites include Salsa Texan, J Foster Farms, Rocky Creek Candles and Mill Creek Honey just to name a few. The farmers markets will average more than 50 vendors per market.

This year we will have more local produce than ever before. We will also have some new exciting vendors in many areas offering products like fresh baked goods, unique local produce, Berkshire Pork, goat milk carmel's and even a booth to get your knives sharpened on the spot.

In addition to our great vendor line up, the 2022 farmers market season will feature "special events" at each market. We are really excited to have these events under the pavilion. Each market will be different

OUTDOOR WATERING SCHEDULE BEGINS APRIL 1

Beginning April 1, 2022, Lucas water customers are required to limit outdoor watering to twice per week. The outdoor watering schedule will help prevent stressing the capabilities of our water system. No outdoor watering will be allowed between 10 am and 6 pm on any day. The City has established specific watering zones to help manage water usage. A map identifying watering zones is available on the City's website at www.lucastexas.us/ watering-days/ to help you determine your watering days.

In 2018, the City of Lucas began offering residents subscription-based curbside recycling services provided by Republic Services. Currently, there are 793 out of 2,680 residential households subscribed for curbside recycling. This makes up only 30% of the total residential households in Lucas. From 2019-2021, Republic Services has collected over 200 tons of recyclable materials each year from Lucas residents which is processed through their facility in Plano. The facility uses highly advanced sorting technologies to process 350 tons of recyclable materials per day. This facility also has an interactive learning center designed to educate consumers about recycling. Visitors can view the recycling process from the observation deck, watch educational videos, and interact with colorful displays and games throughout the learning center. You can schedule a free tour of the recycling facility online at www.republicservices.com/tours/recycling-center/plano-tx.

Technology at the recycling facility is state of the art, but even the most advanced scanning and sorting equipment cannot remove all contamination. On average, recycling contamination levels are at 30% which means the separation of clean recyclables from contaminated materials are more important than ever. It is very important that recyclables must be empty, clean, and dry to prevent the contamination of other recyclables in the collection truck and at the recycling processing center. Otherwise, contaminated materials have to be sent to the landfill. Following the recycling steps will help prevent the spread of contaminated materials.

If you would like to sign up for curbside recycling to help make Lucas a clean and sustainable community call Republic Services at 972.422.2341. The current rate for curbside recycling services is \$8.44 (including sales tax) per month. Use the table below to properly recycle your items at home.
