CITY CHOOSES NEW TRASH AND RECYCLING PROVIDER

In 2021, the City received notice from Barnes Waste Disposal stating that they were unable to continue to provide solid waste services to Lucas residents. The current agreement for residential solid waste services expires on September 30, 2022. In preparation for the selection of a new company, the City prepared a Request for Proposal (RFP) to seek proposals from solid waste service providers who are interested in providing services to Lucas. The City emphasized the need for special considerations due to unique features such as large residential lots, small roads, natural environment, and brush accumulation.

In January 2022, the City released the RFP and asked proposers to include information for collection and disposal services of solid waste, unlimited bundled brush, unbundled brush, recycling, concierge service for pickup near the home, excess brush, bulky item removal, manure/stable matter, and commercial services. The City expressed interest in learning about how all options for future services could potentially lower costs and provide beneficial services for residents.

The City received proposals for solid waste and recycling services from BlackJack Disposal, CARDS Recycling, Community Waste Disposal (CWD), and Republic Services. Staff assembled an evaluation team to review and evaluate the proposals based on criteria in the RFP. CWD was ranked the highest overall, followed by Republic Services, BlackJack Disposal and CARDS Recycling. The City Council was provided with a report of the proposals and evaluations to help with the selection process.

During the April 7 City Council meeting, the City Council discussed the proposals and voted to select CWD as the new provider to provide solid waste and recycling services for all residents which includes:

- Solid waste and recycling collection weekly
- Unlimited bundled brush collection weekly
- Unbundled brush collection weekly
- Concierge service for all residents to request pickup near the home for an additional fee
- Excess brush collection for all residents for an additional fee.
- Bulky item removal
- Manure and stable matter collection for an additional fee

The next step for the City is to negotiate a contract with CWD and discuss the transition plan for transitioning solid waste and recycling services no later than October 1, 2022. The City's current recycling provider, Republic Services, will continue to provide recycling services until the transition to CWD has been completed. The City will be communicating new information to residents on the transition to CWD. Please stay tuned for more details regarding the services, rates, and transition process.

Lucas Fire-Rescue, Collin County Sherriff's Office Deputy Nick Noel, Texas Department of Public Safety, Fairview Fire-Rescue, Medical City McKinney Hospital, and PHI Air Ambulance Service were invited to participate in the 2022 Shattered Dreams Project at Lovejoy High School on March 31, 2022. This year, parent volunteers teamed up with Lucas Fire-Rescue and organized the event. The event took place in the front parking lot of the high school.

Shattered Dreams is a high school-based program that promotes responsible decision-making among high school students regarding drunk and distracted driving. This impactful program conveys how irresponsible choices can shatter dreams. Shattered Dreams utilizes a realistic dramatization of an alcohol-related crash and the aftermath including the impact on innocent victims, friends, and family members.

Lucas Fire-Rescue led the extrication efforts of one vehicle and Fairview Fire-Rescue led the extrication efforts of the second vehicle. Lucas Fire-Rescue had both Medic 861 and 862 on scene to take care of the first vehicle's patients while the Fairview medic took care of the patients in the second vehicle. One patient was pronounced "dead" on scene and one patient was flown by PHI. The "drunk driver" was "arrested" by the Department of Public Safety.

After the outdoor activities concluded, all students were taken into the gymnasium where they watched videos of the scene at Medical City McKinney emergency department, notification of one patient being paralyzed, and in an attorney's office. FIRE RISKS

A high risk of fire activity in Lucas is projected to remain through the rest of the spring as temperatures are expected to keep climbing with summer approaching. With the recent rains, many believe it is safe to burn, however, the extreme dryness of dead vegetation provides the perfect combination for high fire danger, including easy ignition and quickly spreading fires.

Here are a few tips on what not to do:

- **DO NOT BURN**
- Do not operate equipment that produces sparks near dry vegetation.
- Always clear the area around your workspace.
- Don't park a hot car or other machinery in dry or tall grass.
- Remove tall grass vegetation from your property, including burn piles which cannot be legally ignited in the city.
