City of Lucas Parks and Open Space Board Request August 30, 2022

Requester: Parks and Open Space Board

Agenda Item Request

Discuss the creation and distribution of a parks survey to obtain input from Lucas citizens.

Background Information

On July 26, 2022, the Parks and Open Space Board discussed conducting a parks survey to help determine what residents are interested in since the demographic has changed throughout the years. The Parks and Open Space Board also discussed the importance of prioritizing park improvements and that results from a parks survey can help determine the prioritization. In addition, the Parks and Open Space Board recommended updating the parks matrix to provide guidance about future years.

The City of Lucas operates three public parks in addition to having preserved considerable open space and accessibility through the development process. The City's public parks are the Lucas Community Park, Kenneth R. Lewis Park, and Forest Creek Park. The City owns and maintains the East Winningkoff Trailhead which provides trail access in the northern area of Lucas.

Previous Parks Feedback

In 2015, the City held a Town Hall Meeting where citizens were given an opportunity to express their preferences as it relates to updating the Comprehensive Plan. Most of the citizens at the meeting felt the need for parks was minimal due to the large lots and natural open spaces in Lucas. Citizens indicated they desired walking and riding trails throughout the City that connected with other trails. There were some comments relating to the underutilization of small pocket neighborhood parks and the need for more practice ball fields. The City developed a sample parks survey for the Parks and Open Space Board to review; however, a parks survey was not conducted.

In 2005, the City conducted a parks survey where the findings suggest that citizens most often request multi-purpose trails, open space, and picnicking. The survey findings indicated a high request for equestrian trails and fishing activities. In addition to the survey, the City held a public workshop to solicit additional public input. Survey results were reviewed and found consistent with citizens who attended the public workshop. Feedback included preserving parkland along the lake, equestrian and multi-purpose trails should also link residential neighborhoods to the lake, and trails should follow creek corridors where possible.
