# CITY CONDUCTING A WATER RATE STUDY

The City has contracted with Capex Consulting Group to conduct a five-year water and wastewater study. The purpose of the study is to design and implement a rate plan that will enable the water fund to meet operating and capital expenditure requirements. The study considers each customer class (residential and commercial) to make sure any rate structure is just and reasonable. It also reflects national and industry standards for ratemaking, as well as making sure rates are competitive with other water providers in the area. The Capex Consulting Group began this study on Monday, July 11, 2022, and should take approximately three months to complete.

# DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS FOR LEMONTREE AND KINGSWOOD

At City Council direction, the engineering firm Birkhoff, Hendricks, and Carter LLP is working closely with staff to prepare plans for drainage improvements in the Lemontree and Kingswood neighborhoods. City Council selected the Rimrocks Detention Pond Embankment Improvement Project and the Orchard Road South Culvert and Channel Improvement Project based on the conclusions of previous studies. Stormwater modeling predicts that, in combination with past projects, these are the improvements likely to have the greatest positive impact on drainage in this area. # Upcoming Trash and Recycling Transition

Beginning in October 2022, Community Waste Disposal (CWD) will become the new residential trash and recycling services provider. The new base residential trash and recycling services will include one free CWD trash cart and one free CWD recycle cart. All residents will receive weekly

collection of trash, recycling, and brush/bulk. In addition, all residents will have the opportunity to request door side collection of household hazardous waste or used electronics twice per year. These services are included with your base residential rate of \$26.10 (including taxes and fees). A senior citizen discount rate of \$23.49 (including taxes and fees) is also available to request if you meet the requirements. There are also optional services you may request for an additional fee such as extra carts, concierge service, and manure/ stable matter collection. In preparation for the upcoming residential trash and recycling services transition to Community Waste Disposal (CWD), please be aware of the following transition process from Barnes Waste Disposal and Republic Services to CWD:

#### Republic Services Recycle Carts Removal

The last day of subscription-based recycling service by Republic Services is September 23, 2022. Please leave your Republic recycle carts out after your regular recycling pickup has been collected. Your Republic recycle carts will be removed beginning September 24, 2022. Republic Services will be sending out notifications to remind all subscribers to leave their recycle carts out so they can be removed. If your recycle cart does not get removed, please continue to leave the cart out to be removed throughout the first week of October.

#### **Barnes Waste Disposal Trash Carts Removal**

The last week of trash service by Barnes Waste Disposal is September 26-30, 2022. Please leave your Barnes trash carts out after your regular trash pickup has been collected. Your Barnes trash carts will be removed throughout the weekend and the first week of October. If your trash cart does not get removed, please continue to leave your cart out as work crews will continue to remove any remaining carts.

#### **CWD Delivery of New Trash and Recycle Carts**

CWD will be delivering one new trash cart and one new recycle cart to each Lucas residence beginning October 3, 2022. Your new trash cart and recycle cart will be delivered on your new service day. There will also be a CWD brochure attached to your new cart which provides information on the new available services and collection schedule. You will also receive a mailed copy of the CWD brochure in advance. Please look out for more information in the next newsletter and in the CWD brochure on how to find out your new service day prior to the transition.

#### **Senior Citizen Discount Rate**

The City will offer a senior citizen discount rate for seniors ages 65 or older on base residential trash/recycling services only. Seniors ages 65 or older can apply for the senior citizen discount rate. This discount does not apply to additional optional services such as extra carts, concierge service, excess bulk, or manure/stable matter collection. ## **CONGRATULATIONS TO LUCAS FIRE-RESCUE**



Fire protection in the City of Lucas is receiving the highest Public Protection Classification rating awarded by the Insurance Services Office and approved by the Texas Department of Insurance and the Texas Fire Marshal's Office. The City of Lucas will join approximately 75 other communities in Texas with a Class 1 rating.

The Insurance Services Office (ISO) is a leading supplier of statistical, underwriting and actuarial information for the property/casualty insurance industry.

As part of its evaluation, the ISO collects information on municipal fire-protection efforts in communities throughout the United States. ISO's Public Protection Classification (PPC) Program helps establish appropriate fire insurance premiums for residential and commercial properties and provides insurance companies with reliable, up-to-date information about a community's fire protection services. The formal assessment process consisted of three major areas:

- Fire department (staffing, equipment, training, and emergency response capabilities).
- Water supply system (highlighting the water supply a community uses for fire suppression).
- Fire alarm and communications system (dispatch).

The ISO evaluation of the fire department accounts for 50 percent of the rating; while water supply accounts for 40 percent, and the department's communication system accounts for the final 10 percent. The ISO rating is used to measure the quality and effectiveness of fire protection in a community. Additionally, it allows residential and commercial property owners the opportunity to obtain the best possible insurance rates. Our new ISO Class 1 rating takes effect on October 1, 2022.
