# OCTOBER CWD TRANSITION UPDATE

Community Waste Disposal (CWD) – Delivery of trash and recycling carts will begin the week of September 26, 2022. Residents should expect to receive their new trash and recycling carts one week before on what would be their new schedule service day. CWD service will begin the week of October 3, 2022.

Barnes Waste Disposal Update – Barnes Waste Disposal will complete their last regular trash pickup schedule from September 26-30, 2022. Residents should leave their Barnes trash carts out after their regular trash pickup to allow for pick up. Barnes will begin picking up their carts during the weekend following the last trash pickup. This may extend to the following week depending on how much can be completed.

Republic Services – Republic Services will complete their last regular recycling pickup day on Friday, September 23, 2022. Republic will begin picking up their recycling carts beginning Saturday, September 24, 2022. Recycling subscribers should continue to leave out their recycling carts until the carts are picked up.

CWD Dates for Desidential Calid Wests and Describe

Beginning in October 2022, CWD will become the new residential trash and recycling services provider. The new base residential trash and recycling services will include one free CWD trash cart and one free CWD recycle cart. All residents will receive weekly collection of trash, recycling, and brush/bulk. In addition, all residents will have the opportunity to request door side collection of household hazardous waste or used electronics twice per year. These services are included with your base residential rate of \$26.10 (including taxes and fees). A senior citizen discount rate of \$23.49 (including taxes and fees) is also available to request if you meet the requirements. There are also optional services you may request for an additional fee such as extra carts, concierge service, and manure/stable matter collection.

## **Look Up Your Service Day**

To look up your service day with CWD, go to https://communitywastedisposal.com/view-my-schedule and enter your residential address. After entering your address, your collection schedule will show the day that will be your weekly pickup.

### **Senior Citizen Discount Rate**

The City will offer a senior citizen discount rate for seniors ages 65 or older on base residential trash/recycling services only. Seniors ages 65 or older can apply for the senior citizen discount rate. This discount does not apply to additional optional services such as extra carts, concierge service, excess bulk, or manure/stable matter collection. # MAYOR'S MESSAGE By Jim Olk



I know that last month I talked about budget, but I thought it was important enough to talk about it again this month. The City Council uses our budget deliberations as our strategic planning sessions. It just seems more prudent to have these discussions when we have all the numbers in front of us and we gain a broader picture of what happens to the budget as a whole. One of the biggest

takeaways this year in our budget is the focus on public safety. With rising prices of everything, Council decided to take money (just under \$500K) out of the City's reserves (savings) and purchase a new ambulance. Emergency equipment prices have been climbing at a rate substantially higher than the rate of inflation and our older ambulance was scheduled to need replacing in 2025. Council felt that we would save a significant amount of money by locking in the purchase now and providing the Lucas Fire-Rescue with what they need to serve the community. Additionally last year Council approved the implementation of a water rescue program for our Fire-Rescue Department. This included the training of 14 of our fire personnel as well as adding a rescue boat to the program. This will allow swifter response to emergencies on our side of the Lake.

Considering all that is happening around us, the City Council felt that it was time to look at expanding our law enforcement coverage with the Sheriff's Office. Council studied our current staffing and coverage as well as trends in and around Lucas. We met with the Sheriff Skinner and his leadership team to get an understanding of the advantages of our partnership with the Collin County Sheriff's Office. All this led Council to expanding the budget to fund two additional Deputies for the City of Lucas. This will bring us to four Sheriff's Deputies patrolling the City of Lucas and responding to calls for service here in Lucas. I personally am so pleased with the Deputies that have been assigned to Lucas. They have become an integral part of the Community and take pride in being here. I believe that our continued support of our Fire Department along with our Sheriff's Deputies provides the City of Lucas with excellent public safety and I thank them for their service to our community.

# PUBLIC LANDS TRAIL CLEANUP THANK YOU TO ALL OUR VOLUNTEERS!!!

The Public Lands Trail Cleanup was held at the Highland Park Trailhead on Saturday, September 17. The City partnered with the Trinity Trail Preservation Association and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to remove trash and debris from the Trinity Trail along Lavon Lake. The trail cleanup was held in observation of National Public Lands Day and as part of the Keep Lucas Beautiful program. A total of 81 volunteers picked up approximately 1,350 pounds of trash and debris along 4 miles of the trail.

The cleanup event began early Saturday morning with City staff preparing all of the equipment that was needed for the event. Staff began work at 7:00 am and ensured that the Highland Park Trailhead was ready for the busy day ahead. Volunteers began showing up to the event as early as 8:00 am and continued arriving at the trailhead up until 10:30 am. As volunteers began to come back from their assigned routes along the trail, the North Texas

Municipal Water District had set up an interactive educational display on erosion. The Blackland Prairie Raptor Center had also brought two birds (an owl and a kestrel), for the volunteers to meet and learn more about. Thank you to all the volunteers for your hard work!
