Background Information

Agenda Item 2A:

ISO (Insurance Services Office) is a New York-based advisory organization that serves the property and casualty insurance industry by providing inspection and statistical services to the insurance industry. Since 2018, the City of Lucas has been recognized as an ISO Class 2 City. Prior to this, the City had been recognized as an ISO Class 3 City.

Effective October 1, 2022, the City received the distinctive ISO Class 1 Rating as recommended by the ISO and approved by the Texas State Fire Marshal's Office and the Texas Department of Insurance. The City joins only 76 other communities in Texas with the Class 1 Public Protection Classification, which is the highest rating awarded.

By adding full-time firefighter/paramedics, improvement with the fire hydrant and water distribution system, and since Wylie Public Safety Communications dispatches for the Cities of Lucas, Wylie, Fairview, and Parker, credit was received for each city providing automatic aid to the citizens of Lucas. All of which were added to Lucas's Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating.

A representative from the Texas State Fire Marshal's Office and a representative from the Insurance Services Office will provide the City with a short presentation recognizing the outstanding support of the City Council, City staff, and Fire-Rescue Department.

Mayor Olk provided an update on the new telephone system, trash and recycling transition, Public Lands Trail Cleanup, Lucas Farmers Market, National Night Out, CPR training, Fire Station Open House, and Movie in the Park.

Councilmember Fisher indicated that Collin County Judge Chris Hill is accepting applications for the Collin County Youth Leadership Council and encouraged students to apply.

Public Works Director Scott Holden provided background information on this agenda item and introduced Gary Hendricks with Birkhoff, Hendricks & Carter, LLP.

Mr. Hendricks gave a presentation on this agenda item discussing the study area and recommendations for Rimrock detention pond improvements and Orchard Road channel and culvert improvements. City Council discussed the study area and recommendations regarding the proposed improvements.

L.A. Pacheco, 7 Orchard Road, spoke in favor of this agenda item.

Brad Livingstone, 9 Orchard Road, spoke in favor of this agenda item.

Robert Lang, 8 Orchard Road, spoke in favor of this agenda item.

Alan Leiker, 24 Citrus Way, spoke in favor of this agenda item.

Councilmember Lawrence recused himself from this agenda item.

City Council discussed different approaches about how to address future concerns and drainage issues such as public improvement districts. City Council agreed that the culvert at Orchard Road is a city issue that should be fixed. Mr. Hendricks indicated that the culvert and channel improvements are needed together.

City Council further discussed the benefits and concerns of funding both the Orchard Road south culvert and channel improvements and the Rimrock detention pond.

MOTION:

A motion was made by Mayor Olk, seconded by Councilmember Baney to approve appropriating funds from unrestricted general fund reserves to account 11-8209-303 Drainage in a total amount not to exceed \$572,000 in fiscal year 2022-2023 for:

- Orchard Road South Culvert and Channel Improvements in the amount of \$374,000 and
- Rimrock Detention Pond in the amount of \$198,000.

The motion passed by a 5 to 1 vote. Mayor Pro Tem Peele voted in opposition and Councilmember Lawrence was recused from voting.

City Council went into break at 8:56 pm.

City Council returned from break at 9:07pm.

7. Consider approving the request by Karl D. Williams to vacate the existing plat of Wendy Farms Addition creating 13 single family lots being all of a 53.788 tract of land situated in the John W. Kirby Survey, Abstract 506, Peter F. Lucas Survey Abstract 537, and the Benjamin Sparks Survey Abstract 813 located on the north end of Wendy Lane, more commonly known as 1355 Wendy Lane.

Development Services Director Joe Hilbourn presented on this agenda item. Mr. Hilbourn indicated the zoning will remain R2 (single-family residential, 2-acre lots). Mr. Hilbourn clarified this does not impact Blondy Jhune Road and there will still be access to Wendy Lane.

A motion was made by Councilmember Fisher, seconded by Councilmember Baney to approve vacating the existing plat of Wendy Farms Addition creating 13 single family lots being all of a 53.788 tract of land situated in the John W. The motion passed unanimously by a 7 to 0 vote.

8. Discuss the use of roll-off containers and dumpsters in residential zoning districts and provide direction to the City Manager.

Mayor Olk indicated he received a request to table this agenda item. City Council agreed not to table this agenda item and would like to continue with the discussion.

Development Services Director Joe Hilbourn discussed the concern of the residential dumpster on Blondy Jhune Road and has contacted the property owner that it was not allowed.

City Council discussed the benefits and concerns of dumpsters in different zoning districts and indicated the current contract with CWD (Community Waste Disposal) shows the use of poly carts for manure collection.

Greg Jacobs, 1415 Ford Lane, spoke in opposition of this agenda item.

Mayor Olk read an email from Deborah Jacobs, 1415 Ford Lane, who is in opposition to this agenda item.

City Council indicated the City has given CWD exclusive rights and should be in compliance with the CWD contract. City Council agreed to continue with the current regulations as they are. City Council directed staff to work with residents on a timeline for removing dumpsters and that the residents should be notified and re-notified.

Background Information

Harry and Helen Freshcoln are Lucas citizens who moved to Kirkland Estates West in 1986.

In 1988, Harry Freshcoln began his service in Lucas when he was appointed to the Board of Adjustments. His exemplary service on the Board of Adjustments led to his next appointment. In 1990 and continuing for five additional years, Mr. Freshcoln served on the City's Water System Review Board which was comprised of several involved citizen volunteers.

Prior to that time, Lucas water lines had primarily been added gradually by property owners or developers. There were few records of where these pipes were located. The Water System Review Board's first task was to create a map of Lucas' water system. Their next job was planning for future water needs. The Water System Review Board created a roadmap that helped lead to the fine water system we have today.

Sadly, Mr. Freshcoln passed away in March 2022. To honor Harry's life and service to Lucas, Helen Freshcoln and her family would like to donate and install a live tree and memorial stone marker at the Community Park.

Discuss establishing logo usage guidelines for the City of Lucas logo and provide direction to the City Manager.

Background Information

The City of Lucas logo is the official trademark of the City. It represents the City's distinctive brand in municipal governance and public services. The City of Lucas logo is recognizable and a valuable asset in communicating with the public. The logo helps residents identify personnel, property, printed materials, and other forms of communication originating from the City of Lucas.

The city logo is valid and protected under the State of Texas Trademark Registration. The City currently does not have guidelines for city logo usage or a formal process to consider third-party requests to use the city logo for reproduction (e.g., website, publications, print materials, products, and signage). Guidelines for city logo usage may help standardize requirements and govern limited use by third-party entities.

The City of Lucas has received a request from the Friends of Lucas-Fire Rescue to use the city logo on small barn quilts that are displayed on mailboxes. The Friends received an inquiry from a Lucas resident who would like to purchase these small barn quilts with the logo for their neighborhood.

The City Manager is requesting direction from the City Council in regard to allowing third parties to use the City's logo and establishing logo usage guidelines.

City of Lucas Logo Usage Guidelines

Purpose

The purpose of these guidelines is to protect the City of Lucas' ("City") property rights inherent in the City logo and ancillary logos by governing its limited use by third-party entities professionally and consistently. These guidelines are intended to standardize the application of the City's logo and ancillary logos, hereinafter referred to collectively as "logos," and to protect the City's logos from any unauthorized usage.

Policy

The City's logo is the official trademark of the City of Lucas. It represents the City's distinctive localized success in municipal governance and public services. Pursuant to municipal law, City logos are exclusively used for official City business such as events, services, marketing, communications, etc.

The City's logo is protected under the State of Texas Trademark Registration #802567570. The registration is valid from January 2022 to 2027. With permission from the City of Lucas, there are limited circumstances under which non-City, third parties may be granted permission to use the City's logos on a case-by-case basis for reproduction. Any use that falls outside of these guidelines is expressly unauthorized.

The City of Lucas reserves the right to deviate from these guidelines in certain situations, as it deems necessary.

Procedure

1. Eligibility

To be eligible for consideration for use of the City of Lucas' logos, third-party entities must fill out the official request use application below, submit the completed application form, and be in compliance with the evaluation criteria listed in these guidelines.

Apart from government agencies and public institutions, inaugural or one-time programs and events primarily sponsored by third parties that are unfamiliar to the City or without a direct collaborative history with the City are ineligible to use City logos. These parameters help the City manage community expectations and protect the City's public image by building and assessing new relationships with third party entities over time. Permission to use the City logos is a privilege and requires direct, written City approval in every case.

2. Application

Organizations or individuals requesting permission to use City logos shall submit the required application form to the City Manager.

The submitted application shall be completed in its entirety and, at a minimum, include the following information: explanation of the proposed use of the City logos, how the City logos are proposed to appear, identification of project, and proposed scope of distribution.

3. Evaluation Criteria

The City shall consider (as appropriate) any of the following criteria to evaluate the merits of the third-party entity's application and the City's benefits of co-branding an event or program with the third-party entity:

- a) Demonstrated commitment to the City's core values and City's Comprehensive Plan;
- b) Impact on City core services, operations, assets, and facility resources;
- c) Financial viability;
- d) Media exposure value for key City messages;
- e) Economic impact;
- f) Protection of the City's best interests;
- g) Project timelines;
- h) Third party entity's experience, qualifications, and reputation;
- i) Communications strategy; and
- i) Other relevant criteria as determined by City staff.

4. License Agreement

Third party entities granted permission to use City logos for approved activities shall sign a separate license agreement accepting the City's terms and conditions.

Not-for-profit organizations recognized by the City, State of Texas and/or United States may be granted use of the City logos without a licensing fee.

For-profit corporations granted permission to use the City's logos in connection with merchandise for sale shall enter a license agreement and pay a license fee. The license fee is [.........] of the gross sales amount of the first sale of all items bearing the City logo unless otherwise waived. The for-profit corporation shall register the City of Lucas as the point of sale for said merchandise.

5. Guidelines

The City shall ensure the following guidelines are adhered to:

- a) Reproduction of City logos adherence with these guidelines;
- b) Submission of a pre-event copy of final artwork for approval by the City;

- c) City logos do not imply endorsement or sponsorship of any kind; and
- d) Enforcement of unaccepted uses of the City logos including, but not limited to:
 - i. Use that advocates or promotes the sale or use of tobacco, alcohol, controlled substances, firearms or weapons;
 - ii. Use that promotes pornography, obscenity, indecency, or other material offensive to prevailing community standards or persons of ordinary sensibilities;
 - iii. Use that promotes adult-oriented businesses;
 - iv. Use that promotes religious messages or advocates or promotes religious beliefs;
 - v. Use to promote, or support, or in opposition to any political candidate or ballot measure;
 - vi. Use to promote or support political messages not endorsed by the City; and
 - vii. Use that in any way denigrates the City, or its operation, or its officers, agents, or employees.

Improper use of City logos may result in termination of an entity's license agreement and prohibition of future use of City logos.
