RESPONSIBLE PET OWNERSHIP

Owning a pet is a privilege and should result in a mutually rewarding relationship. There are many benefits of pet ownership. However, it also comes with some important responsibilities. It is the pet owner's job to keep their pet safe and keep their environment clean and sanitary and to make sure that pets get regular veterinary care along with a good diet, fresh water, shelter, and exercise. Many pets need routine vaccinations, de-worming, and flea and tick control to protect them, their owners and neighbor pets from certain diseases.

Rural environments have many natural predators, making small dogs and outdoor cats easy prey for hawks, owls, bobcats, and coyotes. Pets running at large are at risk for becoming prey for other animals as well as being accidently injured or killed and causing accidents on roadways. Proper fencing, functional and safe restraints and obedience training are all ways to mitigate the risk of your pet taking an unannounced sabbatical. Pets running at large also creates a nuisance for neighbors and a potentially unsafe environment for neighboring pets.

It is the pet owner's responsibility to keep their pet's environment clean, sanitary and free of waste. At home and when out make certain that all waste is cleaned up and disposed of properly in a timely manner. Keep a bag with you when you take your furry friends for a walk. Neighbors do not want to find your pet's "gifts" in their yard or on the sidewalk. Provide your pets with appropriate housing and a clean location in your home or yard for them.

Regular exercise and some basic training are good ways to mentally and physically stimulate your animal and they provide owners with a means to give positive reinforcement to their pets. Animals tend to be more well behaved and receptive to commands when provided with a stimulating environment and sufficient companionship. Teach your family, friends and children how to interact with your pet to set clear boundaries for everyone. Pets benefit greatly from consistency in human interactions.

Properly taking care of animals starts with welcoming them into a loving home. But you also need to address nutrition, habitat, and everything in between to keep your pet happy and healthy. Establishing a relationship with a veterinarian is one of the best ways to make sure you meet your pet's needs. Following these guidelines and loving your four legged friend is a great way to ensure a happy and healthy life together.

KLB is committed to ensuring the Lucas community remains a clean and beautiful place to live. Here are the specifics for this year's event:

TRASH, RECYCLING & BULK/BRUSH REMINDERS

Community Waste Disposal (CWD) picks up all trash, recyclables, bulky waste, and brush weekly on your regular service day. Please follow the below guidelines for trash and recycling:

- Place all trash, recyclables, bulky waste, and brush out no later than 7:00 am on your service date.
- CWD picks up all items between 7:00 am and 7:00 pm on your service day.
- All household trash must be placed inside the CWD grey trash cart.
- Only use CWD carts as other carts will not be picked up.
- All recyclables must be empty, clean, dry, and placed loosely inside the CWD blue recycle cart.
- DO NOT leave household trash bags next to the carts as they will not be picked up.
- DO NOT bag recyclables.
- DO NOT tie down or place an object on top of your trash and recycle card lids.
- ALWAYS bring in your trash and recycling carts to your house side after service has been completed.

OUTDOOR BURNING REGULATIONS AND FIRE PREVENTION TIPS

As we approach Wildfire Season in Texas, we want to remind the citizens of Lucas of the dangers of outdoor burning and encourage all residents to follow the regulations the Lucas Fire Rescue has put in place to help alleviate some of that danger.

The following requirements MUST be met for outdoor burning to be permitted:

- No County Burn Ban is in effect.
- Fire shall be constantly attended.
- Pile shall be 3 feet or less in diameter and 2 feet or less in height.
- Fire shall only contain firewood and/or natural tree branches generated on your property.
- Fire in approved containers no less than 15 feet from a structure.
- Fire shall be a minimum of 25 feet from the property line.
- Extinguishment source such as water hose, fire extinguisher or shovel with dirt at site of fire.
- Fire shall not cause nuisance from smoke or traffic hazards.
- Fire shall be located with a "clear sky view" and not located under a tree or canopy.

You can help prepare yourself for the wildfire season by following these import tips:

- Create a safe zone of up to 100 feet around your home.
- Remove dry brush and leaves from around your home.
- Keep woodpiles at least 30 feet from your home.
- Plan and practice a home evacuation plan and create a family communication plan.
