CITY DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT PUBLIC WORKS AND ENGINEERING

This month, the Lucas Leader is highlighting the City of Lucas Public Works and Engineering Department. One of the most important aspects of the Public Works team is to provide clean and safe drinking water to the Lucas Community. Recently, the City of Lucas updated its Water Master Plan to ensure that every existing and future water customer receives water that exceeds the standards set by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). This Department instills a sense of civic pride by taking care of our parks and maintaining areas along our major roadways. Because of their hard work, Keep Lucas Beautiful continues to be recognized as a Gold Star Affiliate, the highest form of recognition from Keep Texas Beautiful. Public Works Supervisor Jeremy Bogle has been with the City of Lucas for 17 years and has been instrumental in improving service delivery. Our Public Works employees can be found in and around Lucas performing maintenance to public waterlines, making culvert enhancements to improve drainage, and performing general maintenance to facilities around the city such as water towers and fire hydrants. They are also invaluable to making sure special events like Founders Day and the Lucas Farmers Market run smoothly! Our highly skilled Public Works team puts countless hours into our city and are always available to respond in emergency situations.

The engineering component of this department is essential in planning for the design and construction of infrastructure improvements. Recently, the Lucas City Council approved the design and construction of a new elevated storage tank that will ensure that the city is able to meet future water demand. Our Public Works Director, City Engineer, and Capital Improvement Project Manager work on a diverse range of tasks that include project management of roadways, Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and management of numerous construction and professional services contracts. Much like other departments, they use the City of Lucas Comprehensive Plan and the Capital Improvement Plan to guide projects that will help ensure a high standard of living for Lucas residents!

Public Works Director Scott Holden has been working in the public works and engineering profession for 25 years. In his position as Director, he oversees all aspects of water, stormwater drainage and public facilities, along with the daily operation of the Public Works and Engineering department. This can include water leaks in the city with the Public Works team, or managing capital projects that help improve roadways and other infrastructure alongside our Engineering team. 2022 ANNUAL DRINKING WATER REPORT

Each year the City of Lucas and the North Texas

Municipal Water District (NTMWD) produce a report to inform our water customers about the quality and safety of our drinking water. The 2022 Annual Drinking Water Quality Report (Consumer Confidence Report) can be found on the City's website at the following link: https://www.lucastexas.us/drinking-water-quality-report-ccr-latest/. The source of drinking water used by the City of Lucas is purchased surface water from the NTMWD. The City of Lucas estimated that 9,789,433 gallons of water were unaccounted for during the 2022 calendar year. Unaccounted water use is attributed to leaks, hydrant flushing, water works maintenance and fire-rescue operations. STATE VERSUS LOCAL ROADS

Did you know that most of the main roads through and around Lucas are actually State of Texas maintained highways? That's right. Estates Parkway, Country Club Road, East Lucas Road (from Country Club Road headed east) Angel Parkway, Parker Road and Southview Drive are all maintained by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). This includes all signs, pavement, publicly owned drainage and traffic signals along these roadways. ANNUAL STREETS MAINTENANCE

It's asphalt season in Texas and that means road construction, and the City of Lucas annual Streets Maintenance program is underway. This year's projects include repairs to segments of Estelle Lane and Honeysuckle Lane, an overlay of the intersection of Long Road and Bloom Street, and a mill and overlay of a western segment of Snider Lane. The City of Lucas selected these projects based on systemwide condition assessments and a consideration of the areas with the highest traffic. The Honeysuckle and Estelle Lane project is complete, while the Snider Lane, Long Road and Bloom Street projects are scheduled to commence by late summer. The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is proposing to widen FM 1378 from west of FM 3286 to West Lucas Road. As a result, TxDOT will be holding a public meeting on Thursday, May 25, 2023 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm at the Willow Springs Middle School Cafeteria located on 1101 West Lucas Road, Lucas, TX 75002. Attendees will be able to view the presentation of the project, review hard copies of project materials and ask questions of TxDOT staff and/or consultants. On a different note, the McKinney Airport Bond election failed. As I mentioned in a previous newsletter, the City of McKinney was asking its residents to support a \$200 million dollar bond to construct a four-gate commercial airline terminal at the McKinney airport. This would have brought commercial passenger planes over Lucas. The Lucas City Council opposed the airport expansion due to potential negative noise and traffic impacts on our community. Now, this does not mean the airport is going away and we will still have to deal with the air traffic the airport currently generates. I will continue to have conversations with the City of McKinney to see if there are improvements to air traffic patterns or other changes that could lessen the impact that the airport has on our enjoyment of our homes.

At a City Council meeting in early May, we received a report on the efforts to restore Streaker. No, that is not a reference to a fad from the '70s, it is our first fire engine here in Lucas. There has been an ongoing effort to restore Streaker by the Friends of Lucas Fire Rescue for many years now. At the Council meeting, I said that I would mention the extraordinary efforts of the volunteers in my newsletter article this month (especially since I skipped my article last month). You can find a more detailed explanation of the progress in this newsletter, but I sincerely appreciate all the efforts to bring Streaker back to better than its original glory and am looking forward to seeing its revival. Thanks to all that have participated and contributed to this effort!



50 FOR 50 - SUPPORTING OLE' STREAKER

The City of Lucas invites you to help restore history!

The Friends of Lucas Fire-Rescue is a local non-profit organization that supports Lucas Fire-Rescue. In 2019, the "Friends" began the process of restoring Ole' Streaker, a 1949 Ford F7 Detroit General Fire Engine that once served Lucas and its residents. With a total restoration cost of approximately \$128,000, the Lucas community has been actively raising money and donating time to bring Ole' Streaker back to its original glory. In 2022, at the very first Lucas Car Show, Tony Purch with Homes by J Anthony and Rich Verbal with Legacy Classic Cars raised \$25,000 towards this cause. Many volunteers have donated nearly 3,000 hours of labor towards the project. This said, the "Friends" still need to raise another \$50,000 to complete this historically significant fire engine.

FIVE REASONS TO AVOID FIREWORKS IN LUCAS

- (1) Fireworks are *illegal* in the City of Lucas That's right! The City of Lucas has adopted an amended version of the International Fire Code that prohibits the possession and use of fireworks.
- (2) Likelihood of Injury No one is surprised to hear about an injury from a firework, but everyone is surprised if they get injured by one. In fact, thousands of people are injured every year by sparklers and firecrackers, which many people would consider nearly harmless. Children aged 10-14 years were most likely to go to the emergency room from firework injuries; the second most likely group was adults between 20-24 years old. These injuries are typically burning to the hands or fingers, but burns and impact injuries to the head, neck and eye area are also common. Who wants to leave the party to spend the night in the emergency room? Think twice before allowing anyone in your household to light up the night.
- (3) Fire Risk Fireworks cause significant property loss and damage. Every year, fireworks cause approximately 18,500 fires. More fires are reported on July 4 than any other day of the year, so let's try and break that tradition.
- (4) Pollutants Fireworks create airborne microscopic toxins that can be harmful to the environment. Individuals with asthma or chemical sensitivities may also experience negative effects from firework materials regardless of any specific chemical toxicity.
- (5) Veterans, Pets, & Children When you are blasting off fireworks on your own schedule, it can be very frightening to veterans, kids and fur-kids and cause them to be anxious and sleepless. You might be depriving a baby (and their parents) an entire night of sleep while all the neighborhood dogs cry and cower. Consider the golden rule before subjecting your community to an unscheduled and illegal fireworks display.

All of the major safety organizations agree. If you are looking for fireworks safety tips, the first thing you will find is the overwhelming recommendation *not* to use fireworks at home. Enjoy a professional display instead. These displays employ complete safety protocols and commercial-grade pyrotechnics for a superior show. The City of Lucas wishes safe and fun summer celebrations to all!
