CITY DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

This month, the Lucas Leader is highlighting the Development Services Department at the City of Lucas. Development Services oversees all aspects of land use, natural resources, public and private properties, construction oversight and enforcement efforts to ensure proper zoning and ordinance compliance. All of these important aspects are part of ensuring the health and well-being of our residents and maintaining the quality of life in our city. The work of the Development Services Department is guided by the City of Lucas Comprehensive Plan. This document, which is revised every 5 years with public opinion and City Council vote, helps the Development Services Department decides land use, zoning, ordinances and other tasks for the coming years.

Development Services Director Joe Hilbourn has been with the City of Lucas for 15 years. In his time, he has overseen all aspects of Development Services and more. Joe recommends that anyone looking to learn more about how the planned development of our City occurs should join a board or commission, or share their opinion on the Comprehensive Plan when it is up for revision at a public hearing. The Development Services Department uses this plan to help guide city development and improvements, therefore it is foundational to what the City of Lucas will look like in the future. STORMWATER MANAGEMENT: KEEPING LUCAS CLEAN

Effective stormwater management is an important part of keeping Lucas clean, safe and healthy. If left unmanaged, stormwater can cause home flooding, stagnant water and downstream pollution. Lucas relies on open channels and ditches to carry the vast majority of stormwater. It is vitally important that residents keep the stormwater clean and flowing as it enters and leaves their property. This includes cleaning out and performing maintenance of driveway culverts, cleaning up debris and repairing any damage to bar ditches. Anything other than rainwater entering the drainage system is a stormwater pollutant. This includes yard waste, loose dirt, trash, chemicals, animal waste or anything else that may clog culvert pipes or pollute downstream water bodies. NEW REQUIREMENTS FOR TRASH & RECYCLING


On March 16, 2023, the Lucas City Council approved adopting Ordinance 2023-03-00973 amending the solid waste article in the City's Code of Ordinances. The amended ordinance has new requirements for residents to follow:

- All residences and households within the city must use Community Waste Disposal (CWD) for the collection and disposal of municipal solid waste and recyclable materials.
- All residents must use polycarts provided by CWD for garbage, trash and recyclable materials.
- If curbside service is used, place the polycarts at the curbside on the street of the premises where it is most convenient for the collectors, no earlier than 12:00 pm prior to the day of scheduled pickup. Polycarts must be removed from the curbside location and stored on private property safely away from the street no later than 12:00 pm on the day after scheduled collection.
- Requirements for the collection of weekly bulk waste, bundled and unbundled brush collections, which is included in residential service, can be found at lucastexas.us/cwd, as well as the amended ordinance.
- Collection of household hazardous waste and used electronics are offered to residents as an inclusive service that can be used twice per year.

CITY COUNCIL PASSES RESOLUTION OPPOSING MCKINNEY AIRPORT EXPANSION

At the April 6, 2023 City Council meeting, the Mayor and Lucas City Council passed a resolution opposing any expansion of the McKinney National Airport (TKI). The City Council cited the lack of measurable environmental studies to determine the impact of noise and air pollution as one reason for opposition. Further, the City Council noted that the current air traffic patterns cause a negative impact to the quality of life of Lucas residents. Increased congestion caused by current and future automobile traffic to the airport is also mentioned as a reason for opposition by the City Council. CITY OF LUCAS GENERAL ELECTION CANCELLED

The City of Lucas General Election scheduled for May 6, 2023 has been cancelled due to City Council Seats 1 and 2 being unopposed. City Councilmember Tim Johnson and Planning and Zoning Commission Chairman Dusty Kuykendall are declared elected and will be sworn in at the City Council Meeting on May 18, 2023.

APPLY NOW FOR A CITY BOARD OR COMMISSION MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN YOUR COMMUNITY

The City of Lucas is accepting applications from residents who are wanting to serve the community on a board or commission. The City has several boards and commissions whose duties and tasks range on various topics important to the citizens and everyday functions of the City. Below are brief descriptions of each of these groups, what they do for the City, and when they meet.

Planning and Zoning Commission - The Planning and Zoning Commission serves as an advisory board to the City Council on matters related to development, use of private property and implementation of the Comprehensive Plan. The Commission considers requests for zoning changes, site plan approvals, platting of land, etc. The Commission then provides recommendations to the City Council on these requests. The Commission also reviews rezoning applications, site and development plans and conducts periodic reviews of the Comprehensive Plan. There are seven members, five of which are regular members and two that are alternate members. All members are appointed by the City Council and serve for a two year term. The Planning and Zoning Commission meets on the second Thursday of each month at 6:30 pm.

Board of Adjustment - The Board of Adjustment is a quasi-judicial body with the jurisdiction to grant variances from the City's zoning ordinance and other special variance exceptions. The Board reviews each appeal to determine if a hardship exists to grant a variance. Each request to the Board requires the applicant to demonstrate that a hardship exists. Board members receive training from the City Attorney on what exceptions are acceptable. There are seven members, five of which are regular members and two that are alternate members. Each member serves for a two year term. The Board of Adjustment meets on the fourth Wednesday of each month at 6:30 pm on an as-needed basis.

Parks and Open Space Board - The Parks and Open Space Board serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council on all matters relating to the parks and open areas of our City. The board reviews, studies and makes recommendations to the City Manager for priority of projects or activities to be included in future parks, open space and beautification projects and programs. The City Parks and Open Space Master Plan is also considered, revised and maintained with technical assistance and recommendations to the City Manager. The Board reviews the Master Plan annually. There are seven members, five of which are regular members and two that are alternate members. Each member serves for a two year term. The Parks and Open Space Board meets on the fourth Tuesday every other month at 6:30 pm.
