

CITY DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT LUCAS FIRE-RESCUE

This month, the Lucas Leader is highlighting the City of Lucas Fire-Rescue Department. Lucas Fire-Rescue and their dedicated staff are an essential part of ensuring safety for our residents. Their service to our community includes responding to emergency calls regarding grassland, residential or other fires, along with EMS health emergencies and water based emergencies on Lavon Lake. They also provide various educational experiences for students and adults alike regarding fire safety and emergency response and preparedness.

The Lucas Fire-Rescue team consists of 18 career emergency response professionals who maintain the daily functions of the Lucas Fire-Rescue Department. The professional staff are cross trained as paramedics & EMTs as well as professional firefighters, giving them a diverse range of skills to respond to multiple types of emergency situations. If a Lucas resident is interested in helping Lucas Fire-Rescue, Fire Chief Ted Stephens recommends joining the Lucas Fire-Rescue Rehab group. This volunteer organization makes themselves available with equipment and supplies to provide rehabilitation services to our first responders. Lucas Fire-Rescue would also like to remind the community that they offer, CPR and "Stop the Bleed" classes, along with scheduled opportunities to teach children about fire safety along with showing them the Lucas Fire Station. THIS FOURTH OF JULY, LET THE PROS LIGHT THE SKY

The City of Lucas wants everyone to have a safe Fourth of July, but please do not include discharging fireworks as part of your festivities. We want to remind everyone that the use of fireworks is prohibited. More importantly, the City of Lucas prides itself on being animal friendly and fireworks can be very dangerous to our pets and livestock. Discharging fireworks can also cause problems for our veterans and families with young children as well. Using fireworks is prohibited by City ordinance in the city limits of Lucas. Law Enforcement and Code Enforcement Officers will be patrolling throughout the Fourth of July holiday weekend and any person found in violation will have their fireworks confiscated and may also receive a citation. Here are some helpful tips about the use of fireworks.

- **Q** What should I do if my neighbor is setting off fireworks?
- A Call 972-547-5100 and press option "2" to reach the non-emergency dispatch operator.
- **Q** Can I shoot fireworks from land that I own in the City of Lucas?
- A No. This is a violation of City ordinance.
- **Q** Can I shoot fireworks from a public roadway, public park, or U.S. Army Corps of Engineers property?
- A No. This is a violation of City ordinance and/or U.S. Corps 36 CF R 327.13(b) and a citation may be issued.
- **Q** I have lived in Lucas for years and discharged fireworks, is this a new regulation?
- A No. Fireworks have been prohibited since November 6, 1979.
- **Q** What will happen if I start a fire by shooting fireworks?
- A If the fire is found to be started intentionally and damages the property of another, you may be subject to the charge of Arson. If the fire is found to be started accidentally and damages the property of another, you may be subject to a fine. In either case, you may be held civilly liable for damages.

Residents are encouraged to celebrate the Fourth of July without the use of fireworks. There are many Independence Day celebrations that include a professional fireworks display nearby. CITY OF LUCAS SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

If you are planning on being outdoors on a hot summer day you can take simple precautions to keep you and your family members safe from the summer heat. Stay cool and make simple changes in your fluid intake, activities and clothing during hot weather to help reduce the risk of hyperthermia and heat stroke.

- Hydration is key to staying safe in the Texas heat. Drink plenty of water throughout the day, even if you don't feel thirsty. Dress for the heat in loose, light colored clothing, wear a hat and use sunscreen.
- Don't over-exercise, take breaks and seek the shade or air conditioning to cool yourself down.
- Keep an eye on children, pets and the elderly for signs and symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke.
- Never leave children unattended near water, even if it's a shallow pool or bathtub. Drowning can happen quickly and silently, so designate a responsible adult to actively watch children while they are swimming or playing in or around water.

Learn to recognize the symptoms, such as excessive sweating, dizziness, headache, nausea and confusion. If you or someone around you experiences these signs, move to a cooler environment, hydrate, and seek medical assistance if necessary. Remember, heat stroke is a medical emergency that requires immediate attention. Call 9-1-1 immediately.

UPDATE - PERSONAL PROTECTION AND HOME DEFENSE CLASS PRESENTED BY COUNCILMEMBER PHILIP LAWRENCE

Lucas City Councilmember Philip Lawrence will be hosting free personal protection and home defense seminars for residents of Lucas to learn more about how to keep themselves, their family, and their belongings safe from harm. Councilmember Lawrence is currently certified by the United States Concealed Carry Association (USCCA) and the National Rifle Association (NRA) as a Handgun Instructor, Firearm Safety Trainer and a Home Defense Instructor. His current career in the Corporate Security and Investigation field provides him a wealth of knowledge working directly with various law enforcement agencies on best practices for personal defense.

These highly informative classes will cover topics related to firearms safety, home defense, license to carry information, the "Run Hide Fight" method, and how to ensure firearms are stored safely whenever there are kids in your home. Councilmember Lawrence will also answer any questions related to the best firearms to purchase for personal carry and home defense along with things to consider before purchasing and carrying a firearm.

These FREE sessions will take place on Saturday, June 24 and Saturday, July 8, 2023 from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm (right after the Lucas Farmers Market) in the Community Center behind Lucas City Hall. SPEEDING IN LUCAS - WHAT DRIVES SPEEDING?

Speeding is a type of aggressive driving behavior. Several factors have contributed to an overall rise in aggressive driving:

- **Traffic** Traffic congestion is one of the most frequently mentioned contributing factors to aggressive driving, such as speeding. Drivers may respond by using aggressive driving behaviors, including speeding, changing lanes frequently, or becoming angry at anyone who they believe impedes their progress.
- **Running Late** Some people drive aggressively because they have too much to do and are "running late" for work, school, their next meeting, lesson, soccer game, or other appointment.
- Anonymity A motor vehicle insulates the driver from the world. Shielded from the outside environment, a driver can develop a sense of detachment, as if they are an observer of their surroundings, rather than a participant. This can lead to some people feeling less constrained in their behavior when they cannot be seen by others and/or when it is unlikely that they will ever again see those who witness their behavior.
- **Disregard for Others and For the Law** Most motorists rarely drive aggressively, and some never do. For others, episodes of aggressive driving are frequent, and for a small portion of motorists it is their usual driving behavior. Occasional episodes of aggressive driving, such as speeding and changing lanes abruptly, might occur in response to specific situations, like when the driver is late for an important appointment but is not the driver's normal behavior.

If it seems that there are more cases of rude and outrageous behavior on the road now than in the past, the observation is correct - if for no other reason than there are more drivers driving more miles on the same roads than ever before. Speeding behavior and aggressive drivers may not only affect the speeder, it can also affect other drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists.

The Lucas Deputies will be issuing citations for speeding... PLEASE SLOW DOWN!

DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS IN LUCAS IS PROHIBITED

In Texas if you are at least 21 years of age, and are not otherwise prohibited from carrying a handgun, you can carry a handgun in most public places, either in a concealed manner or openly in a holster, with or without a license. If you are at least 18 years of age, and not otherwise prohibited from carrying a long gun, you can carry a rifle or shotgun in most public places. However, if you fire, shoot, or discharge your firearm, whether it is a handgun, long gun, or any other type of gun or firearm, you may face charges in municipal court.

In the City of Lucas, discharging a firearm is prohibited under the Code of Ordinances Section 8.01.006, Discharge of Firearms. Section 8.01.006 states that it is unlawful for any person to discharge, fire, or shoot, or cause to be discharged, fired, or shot, a firearm or shotgun within the city limits. However, there are certain exceptions to the prohibition on discharging a firearm. The first exception covers the discharge, firing, or shooting of a firearm or shotgun for personal protection or defense or for the protection or defense of livestock or pets. The second exception applies to peace officers engaged in the lawful performance of their duties or a citizen lawfully defending themselves or property in accordance with applicable state law. Further, state law allows for the discharge of shotguns, air soft guns, and other devices on property with greater than 10 acres meeting very specific criteria and in a manner not reasonably expected to cause a projectile to cross the boundary of the tract.

The Lucas Code of Ordinances defines a firearm as any rifle, automatic rifle, semi-automatic rifle, revolver, pistol, or any other gun used or designed for the purpose of firing or discharging a bullet, cartridge or projectile. The term "firearm" does not include air rifles or handguns designed to be used or designed to discharge projectiles by means of compressed air, gas or pumps at a rate of 300 feet per second or less. A shotgun is a weapon or gun designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the shoulder and designed or redesigned or made or remade to use the energy of the explosive in a fixed shotgun shell to fire through a smooth bore a number of projectiles (ball shot or pellets) for each pull of the trigger, and shall include any such weapon or gun which may be readily restored to fire a fixed shotgun shell.

The City of Lucas recommends those wishing to shoot firearms for recreation, practice, or training do so at a shooting range.
