ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP – LEAVE NO TRACE

As we continue with beautification work including the monthly city-wide clean-ups and enhanced recycling services such as at R.O.C. Park, we will also continue reminding our residents, businesses, and visitors to ensure all trash/waste ends up in the proper containers particularly when visiting our sand. Also please remember: No dogs on the Sand, No glass on the Sand. Fines are \$250 for littering and \$93 for dog on the sand/beach:



Beach Ordinances

Sec. 42-37 - Leave no trace

- Any unattended tent or property left on the Public Beach at night shall be deemed discarded by the owners and become the property of the City of Madeira Beach and may be removed and disposed of by the appropriate authority.
- . All holes on the beach are to be filled in the same day they are created.
- · Camping, bonfire, grilling and glass are prohibited.

Sec. 42-38 - Enforcement

- Violation of any provision of this article shall be subject to the following penalties:
 - ⇒ First violation: \$100.00 fine.
 - ⇒ Second violation: \$200.00 fine.
 - ⇒ Third violation: Fine not to exceed \$500.00 pursuant to F.S. § 162.22.

Sec. 10-5 - Animals banned from Public Beaches

 It shall be unlawful for any dog, cat, other animal, whether running at large, on a leash, or being carried, to be on any public beach within the city.


Sanitation-Trash Collection

REMINDER: Trash containers need to be stored somewhere other than curbside, and wheeled out to the curb for collection no earlier than 5:30 pm the day prior to collection, and removed away from the curb by sunset the day of collection. If your container is damaged or missing please contact the City of Madeira Beach Public Works/Sanitation department at 727.543.8154. Additionally, please remember that on your trash collection day only the 64 (or 96) gallon trash container will be emptied. Any trash including larger items, bulk, yard, or anything else that does not fit in the trash container, will be collected only on WEDNESDAYS (BULK & YARD WASTE COLLECTION DAY).

RECYCLING

Please remember the following items may be recycled:

PAPER newspaper, magazines, junk mail, computer/printer paper, catalogs, brown/white/colored paper bags, paperboard cartons, wrapping paper

CARDBOARD cereal boxes (without plastic liner), soda cartons (without plastic wrap), cardboard boxes (flattened, no larger than a 4' x 4' square)

GLASS all clear, brown, green glass FOOD and BEVERAGE bottles (must be rinsed out with no residue and lids/caps removed

PLASTIC all plastic FOOD and BEVERAGE containers that have the Recycle symbol

and a number 1 or 2 (must be rinsed out with no residue and lids/caps removed

METAL

aluminum FOOD and BEVERAGE cans (rinsed out with no residue and lids/caps removed), tin FOOD and BEVERAGE cans (rinsed out with no residue and lids/caps removed), clean aluminum foil & pie pans, empty aerosol cans

ITEMS NOT RECYCLABLE:

plastic bags, egg cartons, Styrofoam, pizza boxes (normally only the top/lid may be recycled if it is super clean-no cheese/grease/toppings)

ANY & ALL TRASH – please dispose of trash in appropriate trash bags and receptacles.







<u>HURRICANE SEASON BEGINS – JUNE 1</u>

The Atlantic Hurricane Season begins June 1. Are you prepared?

Some important reminders include:

- Keep a hurricane kit stocked with food, water, meds, flashlights, battery-powered radio, etc.
- Make an evacuation plan for your family (remember to include your pets)
- Gas up vehicles
- Physically prepare/protect your home clear yard of furniture, debris, and potential projectiles
- Board up windows, put up shutters
- Be ready to turn off power in case of flooding
- Place important documents and valuables in watertight containers
- Keep calm & stay alert

Ready Pinellas Emergency Planning Mobile App

Introducing the new and improved Ready Pinellas mobile app!

Ready Pinellas is designed to help residents prepare themselves and their families before, during and after a storm. It is available for free download on the Apple <u>App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u> store.

Note: Android device users who already had the previous Ready Pinellas app installed will need to download the new app from the Google Play store and remove the old app from their devices. Apple device (iPhone and iPad) users will see the app automatically updated.

The new app features a refreshed design and user experience, additional information and tips, and convenient checklists to make sure you and your family are prepared. App users can use emergency supply checklist, home inventory and emergency contacts tools to build a personal emergency plan.

As a storm approaches, the app will provide real-time updates to help keep you safe, including detailed information that is available at your fingertips even if you lose internet connectivity. It will provide resources to contact us year-round and during a disaster and give you tips to Stay Informed.

Ready Pinellas App Features

- Know Your Zone: If you have your locator services on, the app will tell you
 if you are in a designated evacuation zone. You can also look up other
 addresses to see if they are in an evacuation zone. Remember:
 Evacuation zones were updated for the 2022 hurricane season, so you
 may have a new zone. When a storm is approaching, it will tell you if
 Pinellas County is in the 5-day or 3-day cone and if an evacuation order
 has been issued.
- Make a Plan: Use our emergency supply checklist, home inventory and emergency contacts tools to build a personal emergency plan that you can share. You can take pictures of items for your home inventory.
- Push Notifications: Through the app, you will receive informational and emergency notifications from Pinellas County Emergency Management, the National Weather Service and <u>Alert Pinellas</u>.
- Special Needs: You can learn more about special needs assistance, which
 is intended for those who need transportation or require minimal medical
 assistance while seeking public shelter. You can register from the app.
- Preparedness Tips: Learn how to prepare your family, pets, home, condo, mobile home, boat and more.
- Safety Tips: Find information on What to Do Now before, during, and after an event. Learn about year-round preparedness, how to clean up after a flood or food safety if power has been out.
- · Report Damages after a storm has hit Pinellas County.



City Building Official, Frank DeSantis reports that City redevelopment/economic development continues at a steady pace including several large condominium projects on-going and/or under current plan review.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

Plan review is getting caught up. We currently have less than 10 in the queue.

Joe and Jay have been covering open hours on Wednesdays and have been doing great. Traffic has been steady.

Three public workshops covering John's Pass Village Zoning in April. They were held on 4/13, 4/18, and 4/20. City residents were very engaged in the process, and we gained valuable information from them. We are now in the process of creating walking tours for commissioners and residents.

Staff is working with MGO to transition BTRs. The final demo is scheduled for 5/8/2024 and we should be moving to the testing phase from there. We have sent letters to property managers and property owner letters should be going out in the next two weeks.

Community Development Engineer attended Florida Flood Managers Association in Destin.

MARINA DEPARTMENT

The warmer weather has triggered the boating season. The Marina has seen a lot of activity due to the rising water temperatures and increase in fishing activity. Spring break, fishing tournaments, and weekend sandbar parties have really boosted business over the weekends. We look forward to keeping the momentum going into the Memorial Day weekend.

We have started the Digital Sign project. The digital sign is in place and operational. The project will be completed after the contractor finishes the replacement of the aluminum coverings over the I-beams. We also plan to replace the faded permanent decals on the upper part of the sign.

The Marina has a new staff member, Cody Dawson. Cody is our new part time Marina Attendant and has fit in seamlessly over the last month. He has impeccable customer service skills and is a fast learner. We are fortunate to have Mr. Dawson aboard our Marina team.

We will be releasing the RFP for the Marina Seawall Project in May. The Project will include the replacement of 360ft of seawall, from the boat ramp to the fuel dock. We are looking into some further improvements during the project construction, mainly the addition of another Gas pump to help increase revenue and customer service on busy days.



Project Updates

Patriot Park Dock Replacement

Project consist of the removal of both the East and West docks and replace with new in. The new docks are in the same footprint as the old but will consist of composite decking and aluminum handrails that will have drops for fishing.

- BOC Approved \$156,465.00 (Base contract price \$119,715.00 with possible unknown cost of \$750 per piling 48 total if drilling was needed) to Speeler Foundations on January 10, 2024
- Handrails have been provided from Gator Dock & Gator Bridge separately for the amount of \$20,257.94 to save cost on tax.



Beach Groin Renourishment Project

The project will consist of 22 of the 37 existing beach groins to be fortified with vinyl sheets (seawall sheets) set on each side and through bolted to the beach groin and poured with concrete. Speeler Foundations was awarded the contract by the BOC at the April 10, 2024 BOC regular meeting for a total of \$3,838,677.99. The City has received a grant from FDEP for \$1,750,000. The contractor will work on the water or land side at a time leaving a pedestrian walk path open at all times.

- Project Start May 6, 2024
- Schedule: Start North and work South Skipping Archibald Park and Tom & Kitty Stuart Park until August / September.

<u>Area 3 – E Parsley, W Parsley, Marguerite, A Street, B Street, and Lynn Way. Roadway and Drainage improvement Project.</u>

The project will consist of removing and replacing all stormwater infrastructure, replacement of the concrete curbs, and Mill and Resurface the roadway. The BOC approved the Scope of work for Deuel & Association now known as Transystems to start the engineering on February 24, 2022, for the amount of \$165,000.00. A grant has been received from FDOT for \$549,400 for the construction portion of the project.

- Working on Temporary Construction Easements for the removal and replacement of all stormwater pipes.
- Permits received from SWFWMD March 2024
- Working on Putting the RFP together and plan to place out to bid in by June 2024

Area 5-131st Ave E and 129th Ave Roadway and Drainage improvement project.

The project will consist of removing and replacing all stormwater infrastructure, replacement of the concrete curbs, and Mill and Resurface the roadway. The BOC approved the Scope of work for Transystems to start the engineering on April 12, 2023, for \$52,000.00.

• Project is still in design at 90% plans and waiting on review and comments from Pinellas County for their utility replacement.

Gulf Lane and Beach Access roadway and drainage improvements

The project consists of Gulf Lane, Johns Pass Park, and the Public Beach Accesses from 130th North to 135th to be milled and resurfaced. The portion of the road from 130th parking lot north to 131st has pervious concrete along with a small section from 133rd South to the Bare Foot Entrance due to elevation and the remainder of the project is asphalt. The project was awarded to Keystone Excavators by the BOC on June 14, 2023, for a total cost of \$2,188,903.50.

- 1 repair remining from 133rd South to Barefoot Entrance
 - o The remainder of the project is complete.

Gulf Blvd Utility Undergrounding

This Project will consist of the Final Phase of Gulf Blvd undergrounding from 144th Ave South to Johns Pass. Once permits and all signed easement documents are received the contractor will start a boring conduit along Gulf Blvd. There will be temporary land closures depending on the location and MOT will be set up. This project is funded by the Penny for Pinellas https://www.pennyforpinellas.org/

- Anticipated to start construction June 2024
- Paid Duke Energy BCE June 2023 for \$2,574,433.93 Approved by the BOC at a special meeting on February 13, 2023.
- The Engineering Firm for this Project who is responsible for the oversight of the boring contractor is Utility Consultants of Florida.
 - Phase 1 proposal for the Design, planning, pre construction phase was approved by the BOC on 2-9-22 for \$99,670.00.
 - Phase 2 Proposal for the Construction phase Approved by the BOC 9-14-22 for \$2,348,589.31.

Area 6A Roadway and Drainage Improvement project

The project will consist of removing and replacing all stormwater infrastructure, replacement of the concrete curbs, and Mill and Resurface the roadway. The BOC approved the Scope of work for Transystems to start the engineering on April 12, 2023, for \$141,500.00. A grant has been received from FDOT for \$1M for the construction and construction engineering phase of this project.

• Engineering has begun, and estimated construction will start August 2024.

Branches & Palm Fronds

- · Must be placed at the curb by 7 AM Wednesday
- Branches must be cut to 4 feet or less in length and 4 inches in diameter
- Piles larger than 4' in height and 8' in length will be charged an additional fee
- Do not place any debris on the street, curb, or on top of stromdrains
- Leaves, Grass Clippings, and Small debris should be placed in a bag or garbage can not to weigh more than 50 pounds.
