NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE MARIN COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Board of Supervisors of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District will hold a public hearing on the Zone 9 Update Report during the regular meeting of the <u>District Board of Supervisors on July</u> 30 2024, at 9:00 a.m. or as soon thereafter.

To continue to provide a portion of the financing of certain storm drainage, flood control facilities and related services within the District's Flood Control Zone No. 9 - Ross Valley ("Zone 9"), the District retained services of a consultant to update the Storm Drainage Fees imposed upon identified parcels within Zone 9, as part of a program commonly referred to as the "Ross Valley Watershed Flood Risk Reduction Program" (the "Zone 9 Program"). The consultant's report (the "Zone 9 Update Report") has been filed with the District and contains, among other things, the recommended amount of Storm Drainage Fees to be imposed for fiscal year 2024-2025 and by separate appendix, the list of identified parcels upon which the Storm Drainage Fees is imposed. Comments may be heard with respect to the Zone 9 Update Report at the July 30, 2024, public hearing. Affected property owners may submit written protests with respect to the Storm Drainage Fees. See instructions at

https://www.marincounty.gov/departments/board/make-comment-board-supervisors-meeting for participating in a meeting and submitting comments. To be counted in determining whether a majority protest is established, such written protests must be *received* by the County Clerk in Room 329 not later than 9:00 a.m. on July 29, 2024. If written protests against the Storm Drainage Fees are presented by a majority of affected property owners (those upon whose property a Storm Drainage Fee would be imposed), then the report shall not be adopted, and the charges shall be collected separately from the tax roll and shall not constitute a lien against any parcel or parcels of land.
