




100-Year Storm

• BB2 Removal reduces flood risk for ~500 properties









- San Anselmo Creek

For large flood events, water surface generally drops on the streetside, rises in the creek.











Increased flood inundation ≠ impact


Project Update



2024

Highlights:

- Developed FEMA pathway
- Developed California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pathway
- Discovered and closed underground storage tank



MILESTONE

- Postponed CEQA process
- Completed 100% draft PS&E
- Started to investigate abandoned underground storage tank (UST) at site
- San Anselmo required CLOMR for demolition permit

MILESTONE

- Obtained direction from FEMA about CLOMR
- Developed strategy and consulted with FEMA
- Obtained cost estimates to remove UST
- Identified easements

MILESTONE

- Performed hydraulic analyses required for CLOMR
- Obtained permit to closein-place UST


MILESTONE

- Presented preliminary hydraulic modeling results to FEMA
- Postponed close-in-place UST due to adverse weather
- Obtained additional data to address questions from FEMA
- Performed hydraulic analyses using additional data





Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR)



FEMA Approval Process Update

- Initial agreement on using a Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR)
- CLOMR based on FEMA's 1-D hydraulic model
- Initial model runs with select field data reviewed informally by FEMA
- Strong likelihood of CLOMR approval based on FEMA discussions
- Final determination after FEMA's formal review
- CLOMR submission: End of April 2025
- Expected approval: Late 2025

- Response about Redwood Trees:
 - Hiring an arborist to prepare a tree protection and monitoring plan.
 - Speak at San Anselmo town council meeting (early summer).
- Response about Technical Analysis:
 - Notify property owners with modeled rise in Base Flood Elevation (BFE).
 - Present CLOMR information to the Advisory Board after hearing back from FEMA.
 - Offer to meet property owners that experience a rise in BFE, or others.





