#### STAFF REPORT

#### Item 1. Approval of Meeting Minutes: May 29, 2013

Recommended Action: Approve minutes.

#### Item 2. Open Time for Items Not on the Agenda

Comments will be heard for items not on the agenda (limited to three minutes per speaker).

#### Item 3. Elect Zone 6 Advisory Board Chairperson and Vice-chairperson

Article VI of the Advisory Board's bylaws stipulate that officers of the Advisory Board be elected to a one-year term by a majority vote of the Advisory Board. There are two officers – chairperson and vice-chairperson.

**Recommended Action:** Elect chairperson and elect vice-chairperson.

#### **Item 4. Current Activities**

#### a. Yard Waste

Last fall 300 informational flyers concerning proper leaf disposal were distributed within Zone 6. Staff will seek input from AB regarding this program.

#### b. Maintenance Contract with San Rafael

The third year for the program between the District and the City of San Rafael for Conservation Corps North Bay (CCNB) critical creek and ditch maintenance work was conducted (cost not to exceed \$6,000 per year). Maintenance work was completed from the confluence of the Gallinas Creek tributary along the SMART Rail and the lower drainage reach that parallels Merrydale Road to approximately 400-feet up stream of the Mirada Avenue crossing. Staff will ask AB for a recommendation as to whether to continue this program and/or increase available funding to \$8,000.

#### c. SMART Civic Center Station

Although there were some stormwater runoff concerns of the construction site expressed by AB members, there are no known flooding/drainage issues attributed to the Civic Center SMART station once construction is completed. Staff will continue to review for drainage issues as site plans are developed. Detailed information about the status of the station construction can be viewed at the following web address:

#### d. Watershed Program

Gallinas Watershed Program staff will provide an update on the program, including participation by the City of San Rafael, program schedule and deliverables, and upcoming stakeholder and community meetings. Staff and AB will review the attached proposed Gallinas Watershed Program final report draft table of contents.

#### Item 5. Zone 6 Budget FY 15-16

Staff and AB will review the proposed Zone 6 FY 15-16 budget.

#### Item 6. Proposed Zone By-Laws



### MARIN COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT

#### BY-LAWS OF THE FLOOD CONTROL ZONE NO. 6 ADVISORY BOARD

#### ARTICLE I: NAME

This organization shall be called "The Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (MCFC&WCD) Flood Control Zone No. 6 Advisory Board" existing by virtue of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Act (Act), Water Code Appendix 68-6, and exercising the powers and authority and assuming the responsibilities delegated to it under said Act.

#### ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

The Flood Control Zone 6 Advisory Board shall respond to and issue a report on all matters such as annual zone budget, annual work plan or capital projects for that zone, referred to it by the Board of Supervisors of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District through the District Engineer. Said report shall be made within 30 days of receipt. The Advisory Board shall not have any authority to consider matters beyond those referred by the Board of Supervisors of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.

#### ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

The Advisory Board shall consist of five (5) members, who shall be residents of Flood Control Zone No. 6, appointed by the Board of Supervisors of Flood Control.

#### ARTICLE IV: TERM OF OFFICE

#### 1. Term of Appointment

Each member shall be appointed for a four year term. Notwithstanding said term, any member may be removed without cause at any time by a majority vote of the Board of Supervisors of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.

#### 2. Vacancy

If a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a new Advisory Board member to serve for the remaining duration of the resigning member's four-year term, at which time the appointment shall be reviewed every four years thereafter.

#### 3. Resignation

A resignation of an Advisory Board member shall be in writing and filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

#### ARTICLE V: MEETINGS

#### 1. General

All meetings of the Advisory Board shall comply with all applicable laws including the provisions set forth in California Government code 54950-54962, the Brown Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

#### 2. Meeting Frequency

Annual meeting shall be held on the first Tuesday of the month of March. At the annual meeting, the Advisory Board and District Engineer shall schedule all other regular meetings to be held that year. If there is no business to be conducted, regular meetings may be canceled by the District Engineer by noticing the Advisory Board and providing a written update on Zone activities. Special meetings may be called by the District Engineer when Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District business needs so dictate. Special meetings may also be called at the request of the Advisory Board Chairperson.

#### 3. Meeting Time and Place

Meetings shall be held at a place within or near the boundaries of Flood Control Zone No. 6, or at the principal office of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.

#### 4. Quorum

Three (3) members of the Advisory Board shall constitute a quorum for the response and issuance of report on all referred items.

#### 5. Conduct of Meetings

All meetings shall be conducted and governed by the rules set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.

#### ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS AND DUTIES

The officers of the Advisory Board shall be the chair and vice-chair.

#### 1. Election and Term

Officers shall be elected to a two-year term by a majority vote of the Advisory Board.

#### 2. Resignations

An officer may resign at any time upon giving written notice to the Advisory Board.

#### 3. Vacancies

Any vacancies of the chair or vice-chair shall be filled by a majority vote of the Advisory Board.

#### 4. Chair

The chair shall preside at all meetings of the Advisory Board consistent with Robert's Rules of Order. The chair shall perform such duties necessary to run meetings.

#### 5. Vice-chair

The vice-chair shall carry out the duties of the chair during her/his absence or disability, or during a vacancy in the office of the chair.

#### ARTICLE VII: BYLAWS

These bylaws may be recommended for amendment by a majority vote of all Advisory Board Members only if said proposed amendment does not conflict with any provisions of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Act.

No amendment to these bylaws shall take effect or be binding until said amendment(s) are approved by the Board of Supervisors.

## MARIN COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT BY-LAWS OF THE FLOOD CONTROL ZONE NO. 6 ADVISORY BOARD

#### **ARTICLE I: NAME**

This organization shall be called "The Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Flood Control Zone No. 6 Advisory Board." existing by virtue of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Act (Act), Water Code Appendix 68-6, and exercising the powers and authority and assuming the responsibilities delegated to it under said Act.

#### ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

The Flood Control Zone No. 6 Advisory Board shall be consulted by the Board of Supervisors of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (BOS) in all matters affecting Flood Control Zone No. 6.

#### ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

The Advisory Board shall consist of five (5) members, who shall be residents of Flood Control Zone No. 6, appointed by the BOS.

#### ARTICLE IV: TERM OF OFFICE

#### 1. Term of Appointment

Each member shall be appointed by the BOS and said appointment shall be reviewed July 1, 1985 and every four years thereafter.

#### 2. Vacancy

If a vacancy occurs, the BOS shall appoint a new Advisory Board member to serve for the remaining duration of the resigning member's four-year term, at which time the appointment shall be reviewed, and then reviewed every four years thereafter.

#### 3. Resignation

A resignation of an Advisory Board member shall be in writing and filed with the Clerk of the BOS.

#### ARTICLE V: MEETINGS

#### 1. General

All meetings of the Advisory Board shall comply the provisions set forth in California Government Code 54950-54962, the Brown Act.

#### 2. Meeting Frequency

Meetings shall be held once a year on the second Tuesday in April. Additional meetings may be called by the chair of the Advisory Board or staff when there are specific items to discuss.

#### 3. Meeting Time and Place

Meetings shall be held at a place within the boundaries of Flood Control Zone No. 6, or at the principal office of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.

#### 4. Quorum

Three (3) members of the Advisory Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and the adoption of action items.

#### 5. Conduct of Meetings

Proceedings of all meetings shall be governed by rules set forth by the chair of the Advisory Board.

#### 6. Voting

An affirmative vote of the majority of all the members of the Advisory Board present at the time shall be necessary to approve any action item before the Advisory Board. If requested by any member in attendance, a roll call vote must be held.

#### ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS AND DUTIES

The officers of the Advisory Board shall be the chair and vice-chair.

#### 1. Election and Term

Officers shall be elected to a one-year term by a majority vote of the Advisory Board.

#### 2. Resignations

An officer may resign at any time upon giving written notice to the Advisory Board.

#### 3. Vacancies

Any vacancies of the chair or vice-chair shall be filled by a majority vote of the Advisory Board.

#### 4. Chair

The chair shall preside at all meetings of the Advisory Board. The chair shall exercise such other powers and perform such duties as necessary to run meetings, and to carry out the business of the Advisory Board.

#### 5. Vice-Chair

The vice-chair shall carry out the duties of the chair during her/his absence or disability, or during a vacancy in the office of the chair.

#### **ARTICLE VII: BYLAWS**

These bylaws may be recommended for amendment by a majority vote of all Advisory Board Members only if said proposed amendment does not conflict with any provisions of the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Act. No amendment to these bylaws shall take effect or be binding until said amendment(s) are ratified by the BOS.
