4. Gallinas Levee Upgrade Project Financing Options and Zone 7A Special Assessment

In the last year the Advisory Board has considered two types of special assessments, a special tax and a benefit assessment. At this meeting a refined special tax option is being presented that incorporates some of the benefits of both methods of assessment.

Attachment 3: Zone 7a Special Tax Study

Recommended Action: Approve special tax scenario #1 and recommend the District Board of Supervisors call for an election to impose a special tax upon parcels located within a conditionally established Zone 7A for the purpose of funding the Gallinas Levee Upgrade Project.
