STAFF REPORT

Item 1. Approval of Meeting Minutes: April 27, 2022

Item 2. Open Time for Items Not on the Agenda

Comments will be heard for items not on the agenda (limited to three minutes per speaker). (While members of the public are welcome to address the Advisory Board, under the Brown Act Board members may not deliberate or take action on items not on the agenda, and generally may only listen.)

Item 3. Update on Zone 4 and 4A 2022 Maintenance

a. Pump Stations

Preventive maintenance at all pump stations takes place every year and includes the inspection, testing, and as needed replacement of electrical and mechanical components. Additionally, individual pumps and motors are typically removed and serviced for *major* maintenance on a sixyear interval at each of the Zone's three stations. The #1 pump at Pamela Ct Pump station was removed for service this summer and reinstalled the week of September 12th. This work was completed on schedule and budget.

b. Vegetation Maintenance

The East Creek access road was mowed in the spring. The week of September 19th the Conservation Corps North Bay trimmed cattails and removed low/downed branches in the channel at East Creek, and cleaned debris from West Creek and the Karen Way Trash Rack.

c. Sediment Removal

Sediment and cattail root removal was completed this fall in East Creek. Sediment was removed at 8 key locations along East Creek between the Karen Way outfall and approximately 100 feet downstream of the Cecilia Way crossing. Excavation extended approximately 2 feet deep to remove cattail root mass.

Item 4. Evaluation of Channel Capacity Improvement Options at East and West Creek

At the prior meeting the advisory board requested a presentation on the hydraulics and geomorphology of Zone 4 watersheds. Civil engineer and geomorphologist Matt Smeltzer reviewed existing work, conducted field geomorphic assessment, and updated hydraulic model simulations of the creek. He will present his findings to the advisory board at this meeting. Recommended Action: Recommend preparing a Request for Proposals for design and environmental review of a project at East Creek that includes top of bank barriers and feasible removal of obstructions, as well as feasible removal of obstructions in West Creek.

At April meeting advisory board began discussing potential to include properties on the west side of

East Strawberry Drive in Flood Zone 4A. The board will have the opportunity to continue that

discussion.
