

## 2022 Flood District Zone 6 News and Updates



You live in the Flood Control District's **Zone 6**. Established in 1953, the Marin County Flood Control & Water Conservation District is a political subdivision of the State of California and is a separate agency but staffed by the County Department of Public Works. San Rafael Meadows and Redwood Village comprise Zone 6 which was established after construction of the San Rafael Meadows subdivision in the 1960s. This area was later annexed into the City of San Rafael, which now owns and maintains the public drainage facilities.

Zone 6 receives annual revenues from property tax and has an **Advisory Board** of 5 residents appointed by the Board of Supervisors (BOS). The Advisory Board reviews Zone budgets and master plans and advises the BOS on these matters. Zone 6 Advisory Board meets once or twice a year. There is currently one vacancy on the Zone 6 Advisory Board.
