 TWDB DWSRF Water System Improvements Loan Forgiveness \$1,890,000 (2005)

UF Feed Prefilters for backwashing with all components for operation, 2 Model HF-56 Potable Water UF Units with all components for operation including membrane filters and pass kits and I HACH Filter Trak 660 Laser Nephelometer and panel. CIP Components, Back Flush Components, Chemical Dose Package, Compressed Air Package, Main Control Panel, Auxiliary Field Panel, Unit Electrical/Pneumatic Field Panel, V1072 module lifter and fiber repair station. Fire Hydrant Replacement Project, Turbidity Meters, Sewer Vac Machine, Sludge Trailer.

TDA TCDP Sewer Plant Improvements \$250,000 (2006)

Rehab portion of berms, replace aerators, install 3 flow meters, install perimeter fence, demolition, lift station repair, slab, mobile zation, electrical service to 600amp, grounding at control panel, replace gates at headworks, rehab walls at bar screen, replace grating at headworks, install handrails at headworks, reset anchors on aerators, pesticide rig and reset valve stems and concrete pads.

This grant provided for SCADA Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition System for wastewater plant and six lift stations, upgrades to Park Lift Station including three air release valves, one jib crane, two sump pumps, backup generator and raise three upstream manholes.

TWDB ARRA Water Main/Elevated Storage Tank Project \$4,000,000 (2009)

New Elevated Storage Tank at Mesquite and Foster and Water Main replacements to improve pressure planes.

Lines installed were as follows: 18" Water Main, 12" waterline on Charles, Depot, Island, Quaid, Royal, Anders, Winter, Capps, Ward, Coleman, Heritage Row, Wood and Commerce Streets, 6" waterlines on Rose, George, Rickleman, Rockdam, Mistletoe and Lorene Lane. There lines are chosen by the amount of prior maintenance issues.

CJD USDJ NATIONAL INCIDENT BASED REPORTING SYSTEM \$ 7,500 (Police)

This grant will assist the City to convert crime statistics from simple summary counts of eight types of crime murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and the recently added arson offenses to a new and more sophisticated system of incident-based data, detailing many of the elements of crimes recorded at the scene by the investigating officer. BJS and the FBI are encouraging nearly 18,000 law enforcement agencies to adopt NIBRS.
