PUBLIC NOTICE MANDATORY LANGUAGE CODING Tier 2 violations/ Non-Acute

Mandatory Language for Surface Water Treatment Technique Violation
SURFACE WATER TREATMENT TECHNIQUE: [NON-ACUTE]

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) sets minimum water quality standards for public drinking water. These standards include enforceable treatment technique requirements for drinking water. Inadequately treated water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites that can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches.

The **City of Marlin**, PWS ID **TX0730002**, failed to meet the minimum treatment technique requirements for the month of **April 14 2021**. Specifically, our water system had Failure to achieve at least 99% (2-log) removal of *Cryptosporidium*.

On April 14 2021, a Boil Water Notice was issued for the City of Marlin PWS0730002, a routine maintenance cleaning being done on SKID200 reviled multiple membrane filters needed to be pulled and re-pinned causing us to run low on water levels in our Mesquite tower (we never lost psi in town), the SKID did not pass the required weekly ITest. We put SKID200 into production to build our levels in town and to continue maintenance on the SKID for the next day. The Boil Water Notice was Rescinded on April 17,2021
