Mr. Bosnik had a citizens comment but he wanted to wait until later to address it

6. Discussion and or take action to approve contract with Lou Portillo for the Nanostone Membrane Pilot Study.

Lou Portillo told the council that once TCEQ approves the plans that it will take 6-8 weeks to assess the needs of the study. TCEQ has approved a 40-day study instead of the 90-day traditional. It was clarified that the pilot study is different from the other work being done (separate project) so that it can move forward faster. Discussion was held on used replacement filters for the time being. Lou is still talking to others he has worked with to try to find good used filter for the plant. The retrofit will start with skid 100 since it is the one that is down. It will take 6-8 months to complete skid 100, then skid 200 will be fitted, which will take a month and a half to finish. The effects of producing more water were discussed. It was stated that the Psi would not change since that is controlled by the elevated storage tanks in town. The Nanostone filters come with a 20-year warranty, and they recirculate which will save on energy and electricity.

The EPA requires a more extensive study to be done. Money will be moved from contingency funds to cover the cost. A consultant has been hired to conduct the study. This project is separate from the rest, so that the other projects once the Categorical exclusions are approved can proceed.

Gill Gregory gave updates to the council. On the drinking water project, the tanks will level out pressure so the filters will not create more pressure on the lines. The small line are an issue when they have to many houses on them. The ones that have a few houses, even though the lines are small and bigger lines fee them, they will be ok. One of the big things is the categorical exclusion that was posted on the city web site, in two weeks this should be approved and an amendment will be done. Things have already been started on that project.

13. Consider and take action on resolution calling for a bond election in the city on November 2, 2021

James Gilly told the council that he needed the amount the city wanted the bond to be for and the terms of the bond to get it on the ballot. Chris Suttle (via phone) told the council that he has provided the council with important dates for the bond election if it is to be held in November. The last day to call for the election is August 16th. He stated that once the bond is issued there is a ten-year time line, but if one bond is issued for a portion and then another the next year the bond would reset the 10-year timeline. James said that the city did not want to, for terms, go past the life of the roads for years to pay back. Discussion was held on gathering a list of roads that need to be repaired and getting an engineer out to estimate the fixes and the price. Chris said that he would handle all the paperwork, language, and would be working with the City Secretary to get it all done. The next available election would be May 2022.
