Abandoned Motor Vehicles

Vehicles left unattended on a public roadway or public property for 48 hours or longer are subject to removal by the Miamisburg Police Department. In addition, any vehicle that is illegally parked or constitutes a hazard or obstruction to the normal movement of traffic will be removed. Vehicles may not be left unattended on private property for more than four hours without the permission of the person having the right to the possession of the property.

Banners

The City hangs over-the-street informational banners at three high-traffic locations: Central Avenue near Twelfth Street, Heincke Road near Central and N. Main Street near Sycamore Street. Community groups wishing to utilize these visible locations to promote an upcoming event, should put their request in writing to the City Manager's Office at least two weeks in advance of the desired display dates. Requests are approved on a first-come, first-served basis. Groups are responsible for making their own banner per City specifications, while the City provides installation. Banners can hang for a maximum of two weeks, and a list of the exact specifications necessary for installation can be obtained from the Municipal Service Center.

Block Party

Residents interested in holding a block party in their neighborhood should request approval from the City Manager's Office in writing at least two weeks in advance of the event. The Public Works Department will deliver barricades to the ends of the affected street on the Friday before the block party, and residents should place them in the appropriate place to deter traffic just prior to the party. Residents are then responsible for removing the barricades following the party. Streets may not be blocked for parties at individual residences.

The energy industry in Ohio is deregulated. The billing for local electric service and the maintenance of distribution lines are provided by Dayton Power and Light Co. (DP&L), the long-time supplier in this region. Under state law, the City of Miamisburg received voter approval in 2003 to have the option of serving as a municipal energy aggregator, which would enable the City to negotiate energy rates and select a supplier on behalf of its residents who wish to participate in a purchasing pool.

Garage Sales

Residents interested in having a garage sale should register the event by calling **847-6532**. The following conditions are among those set forth by City ordinances:

- Garage sales may be held only between 8 a.m. and sundown for no more than three consecutive days.
- No more than three garage sales are permitted per dwelling in any calendar year.
- A non-illuminated advertising sign may be placed only on the property where a garage sale is being held. Signs illegally posted in the public right-of-way, including placement on telephone poles or street signs, will be removed by City crews.
- Failure to comply with any ordinance could result in a fine.

Parking

Parking of motor vehicles is generally prohibited in the following locations:

- On a sidewalk.
- In front of a public or private driveway.
- Within an intersection.
- Within 10 feet of a fire hydrant.
- On a crosswalk.
- Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection.
- Within 30 feet of any flashing beacon, stop sign or traffic control device.
- Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb.
- Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing.
- Within 20 feet of an entrance to a fire station and on the side of the street opposite the entrance to a fire station.

- Alongside any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge of curb.
- Upon any bridge.
- At any place where signs prohibit stopping, standing or parking, or where the curbing is painted yellow.
- Within one foot of another parked vehicle.


