The final details of the project include landscaping, playground safety surfacing, lighting and asphalt paving in the North Parking lot as well as the re-alignment of the bike path on top of the levy. We are excited for this 20+ year vision for downtown Miamisburg to come to life this summer with concerts, events and all the laughing and playing that will be sure to come on the new playground. There are so many members of the community to thank for the years of momentum-building, designing, and supporting this important project. The Miamisburg Community Foundation has raised over \$750,000 in support of the improvements, and we are incredibly grateful for their efforts and community-building that has occurred because of this park. As we

said when the construction was announced, this project is about building a park, but it's so much more than that. The Riverfront Park Improvement Project will provide opportunities for economic development, quality of life enhancements, infrastructure improvements, regional attraction, and value to the community. As we open the park to the public, we are grateful for this example of our community coming together to see this 20+ year vision come to life. Miamisburg Transportation Plan Update



In August of 2023, the City of Miamisburg, along with our private sector partner CT Consultants, launched an effort to update the City's 1993 Major Thoroughfare Plan to better reflect the transportation needs of a 21st Century community by incorporating advancements in infrastructure deployment and design. Since initiating the update, staff from the Miamisburg Development Department and CT Consultants have worked to collect the background information necessary to develop the plan, including conversations with local stakeholders and the general public. The plan is currently being drafted and will be presented to

the community this spring. In the meantime, the public is invited to continue engagement with the project through the City's website at: www.cityofmiamisburg.com/miamisburgtransportation-plan. The website includes a general comment form at the bottom to submit any specific or general comments about transportation in Miamisburg. Any comment received will directly feed the final document conclusions and recommendations. A second Public Engagement Meeting will be held prior to formally presenting the plan to the Planning Commission and City Council. Stay tuned for an announcement on the future meeting date. 

Updates from the Police Department

The Miamisburg Police Department is offering suggestions to counter thefts from open or unsecured areas and methods to assist with the return of property in the event something is stolen. Often, garages and sheds are left open and unsecure while no one is present. A good rule of thumb to follow when not within view of one of these spaces is to close and lock it. Officers will notify residents of open garage doors during overnight hours in case it may have been an oversight. In the event an item is taken, having a photograph of the object along with applicable identifying information (make, model, serial number, distinguishing features, etc.) will assist us in returning your items should they be recovered. Here are some important fire safety tips to keep in mind as we transition into the spring season.

1. Be prepared for Storms: Spring often brings severe weather, including thunderstorms, tornadoes, and flash flooding. Stay informed about weather forecasts and have an emergency preparedness kit stocked with essentials such as food, water, flashlights, and batteries in case of power outages or evacuation.

2. Spring Cleaning: Spring cleaning is a popular tradition that allows us to declutter our homes and welcome the new season with a fresh start. However, it's also an excellent opportunity to address potential fire hazards within your home. Water main/hydrant flushing begins April 15

The City of Miamisburg will be flushing area water mains during daytime hours beginning the week of April 15 and lasting approximately two weeks.

Flushing will not affect most residents, but water could be discolored at times in the neighborhoods where flushing is taking place. The discolored water is safe for

drinking and bathing, but can stain clothes while laundering. Therefore, residents are cautioned to draw a glass of water to check for discoloration before doing laundry in the affected areas. If laundry is inadvertently stained, keep clothing wet until rust remover can be used. Residents can obtain a free packet of rust remover weekdays at the Miamisburg Civic Center between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. and at the Service Center from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Flushing of mains is necessary to ensure that water quality is maintained at its optimal level. The Public Works Department performs this uni-directional flushing procedure every spring.

City tax returns due on April 15

Residents of Miamisburg should note that the deadline for filing their 2023 city income tax returns will be Monday, April 15, which is the same date Federal and State returns are due.

Filing is required for all residents ages 18 to retirement and for all individuals with business income within the City. Retirement status can be received by providing the Tax Office with a copy of your 1040 showing retirement income only.

Forms are available on the City's website https://cityofmiamisburg.com/, under the Taxes button. Forms can also be obtained from the Income Tax office in the Civic Center located at 10 North Main Street. To request a form sent please call (937) 847-6462 or email us at incometax@ cityofmiamisburg.com.

To provide taxpayers additional time to file local returns and pay any amount due, penalties and/or late fees will not be assessed before May 15.

Please note the following important information about filing online, in person, or by mail/drop-off:

 Income tax payments can be made online by using your checking account or credit card (convenience fee applies with a credit card).

Required tax documents include:

- All W-2s If your W-2s are marked "various" or "all cities" for the Local Tax Withheld, box 18, please request an itemized breakdown of wages & income tax withheld for each City from your employer(s).
- A copy of your Federal Return (Federal Form 1040)
- Copies of applicable Federal Schedules such as 1, A, C, E, F, 2106 (if filed with Federal return)
- Copies of W-2G, 1099-MISC, and/or Cancellation of Debt (COD), if applicable

As always, the Income Tax office staff is available at no cost to assist with the preparation of the City form. We are unable to assist with federal or state filings.

Quarterly due dates

Estimated taxes must be paid quarterly if the annual tax liability is \$200 or more.

Due dates for quarterly estimated payments are April 18, June 15, September 15, and January 15.
