CITY OF MONTCLAIR ALARM SYSTEM PERMIT INFORMATION

On January 3, 1983, the Montclair City Council unanimously passed Ordinance No. 82-547, codified as Chapter 11 of Title 4 of the Municipal Code which addresses the incidents of false robbery and/or burglar alarms.

Historically, false robbery and/or burglar alarms have hovered at the 97-percentile range, which creates a tremendous drain of police patrol services. This Ordinance will place alarm users under permit and subject them to a reasonable service fee for excessive false alarms.

Provided is some brief information regarding the contents of the Ordinance.
YOU SHOULD READ THE ATTACHED ORDINANCE FOR COMPLETE INFORMATION.

An Alarm System is equipment arranged to signal the presence of a hazard requiring police attention.

"Premises" shall mean any building or group of units within one building.

To have an "alarm system", a person shall get a permit from the Department of Administrative Services, Business Licensing Division.

Alarm permits shall be revoked if: permittee fails to observe the regulations; alarm system emits more than six false alarms in any 365-day period; or false representation was made on any application.

There is currently a \$50.00 false alarm service fee for the fourth and each subsequent false alarm annually.

Revocation of permits may be appealed to the City Council.
