





- There are gaps in the northeast and southern portion of the city







Existing Parks: Half-Mile Parksheds












splash pad, dog park, or recreation pool









Existing and Potential New Playgrounds








Existing Sports Fields


San Antonio Creek Trail

 - Exercise equipment
 - Picnic areas and benches
 - Public art



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
Detention Basins

- Park #2 (0.31 acres)
 - Northern Montclair near Richton Street
- Park #3 (0.45 acres)
 - Northern Montclair near Fremont Avenue and Olive Street
- Park #4 (0.54 acres)
 - Northern Montclair near Moreno Street and Plaza Lane
- Park #5 (1.45 acres)
 - Northern Montclair near Moreno Street and Vernon Avenue
- Park #6 (4.75 acres)
 - Southern Montclair near Vernon Ave and Clair Street
- Park #7 (4.46 acres)
 - Southern Montclair near Fremont Avenue and South of Saddleback Street






New School Joint Use Agreement Opportunities

School Opportunities

- Monte Vista Elementary School (2.59 acres)
 - Easy and direct access from Monte Vista Ave
 - Good visibility from street
 - Easier opportunity to add fencing to separate public use from school areas
- Montera Elementary School (2.04)
 - Easy and direct access from Holt Blvd
 - Good visibility from street
 - Easier opportunity to add fencing to separate public use from school areas




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
Recreation Opportunities


- Walking paths (linear recreation)

- Gaps remain in few small pockets near residential land uses






Potential New Park System and Parkshed

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- Gaps remain in few small pockets near residential land uses





Programs Overview

 While many programming activities have been impacted because of COVID, historically, the department provided a wide variety of activities such as:



Program Recommendations

- Continue expanding teen and adult sports and recreation programs as staffing becomes more available.
- Consider providing adaptive or therapeutic programs for special needs or disabled patrons.
- Expand cultural programming to focused groups within the community as well as provide multilingual options for marketing of programs.
 - Cultural events have resonated well with the community, so continue providing yearly cultural events
- Integrate virtual programming for arts and gathering meetings that patrons can participate in at home.
 - Safety is a concern for some residents and virtual programming would provide in-home safety while providing community participation.
- Consider partnerships with community organizations, neighboring communities, and school districts to support program offerings such as use of pools for swimming or tracks around fields for walking.

Park Infill Opportunity Areas: Moreno Vista Park Example

General Comments

- Playground would be helpful
- Trail access
- Why can't anything go here? (pointing to southern portion of the park)
- Think of more revenue-generating facilities (tennis, basketball, soccer)
- Field rentals or contract classes
- Amphitheater for concerts/movies in the park
