## Pending Legislation

a. An Ordinance Establishing Compensation For Elected Officials— (Mr. Dobrozsi-3<sup>rd</sup> reading) Information has been previously supplied on this legislation that, if approved, would initiate the process to increase compensation for Council Members and the Mayor commencing January 1, 2026. The Charter allows Council to set compensation for Council Members, but the compensation cannot be increased during a Council Member's term. As a result, those Council Members elected in November 2025 will see an increase in compensation January 1, 2026, whereas those Council Members who are elected for a full term of office in November 2027 will see the increase effective January 1, 2028. Since the Mayor is appointed by Council and the Mayor's term does not commence until after the organizational meeting, the additional stipend for the Office of the Mayor will commence January 1, 2026.

Ordinance Request to Amend Appropriations for Current Expenditures

During Fiscal Year 2024

## Introduction

It is necessary for City Council to consider an ordinance to amend the appropriations for current expenditures for FY 2024 to balance the FY 2024 Budget.

## Financial Impact

There are no transfers of cash needed to balance the 2024 Budget. Total reduction in all funds appropriation is \$369,763.10. There is an adequate fund balance in each fund to support the appropriations.

#### Background

The original FY 2024 Budget included a total appropriation of \$36,057,455, as passed on Ordinance #14, 2023. Ordinance #6, 2024 increased appropriations by \$482,000. Ordinance #7, 2024 corrected appropriations as they pertained to fund allocation. Ordinance #9, 2024 decreased appropriations \$2,313,813 for a current total appropriation (including transfers) of \$34,225,642. As of the December 10th review of appropriations, there are appropriations changes requested to align appropriation with estimated year end expenditures.

## Financial Impact

General Fund- Adjustments to the personnel object lines are primarily due to overtime and staffing. The decreases suggested for the non-personal object lines are due to anticipated costs in general operating projects being lower than anticipated. Some operating expenditures were reallocated in the 2025 budget.

Special Revenue Funds- Due to the new 2024 Final Rule for ARPA funds, all funds previously set aside as a result of the 2022 Final Rule are required to be obligated by 12/31/2024. Applicable expenses from the Capital Project Fund have been reclassified to the Pandemic Relief Fund to comply with the newest Final Rule.

Debt Service Funds-Increased Montgomery Quarter TIF taxes received necessitated the school compensation to increase as well. In addition, the issuance legal costs on our Bond Anticipation Notes were lower than expected.

Capital Project Funds- Capital Project funds expended are lower than expected due to the reclassification of some project funds to the Pandemic relief fund to comply with the newest Final Rule for ARPA funds.

Fiduciary Funds- Compensated Absence funds expended were slightly lower than the amounts budgeted.

All funds total appropriation budget for 2024 is reduced to \$33,855,878.90.

## Recommendation

It is recommended that City Council pass the proposed ordinance to amend appropriations for the FY 2024 Budget.

# AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, STATE OF OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2024

whereas, on December 6, 2023, Council adopted Ordinance No. 14, 2023 entitled, An Ordinance To Make Appropriations For Current Expenses And Other Expenditures Of The City of Montgomery, State of Ohio, During The Fiscal Year Ending December 31, 2024, ("Appropriation Ordinance"), appropriating a total of \$36,057,455 for the year 2024; and

WHEREAS, on July 10, 2024, Council passed Ordinance No. 6, 2024 to amend fiscal year 2024 appropriations to balance fund expenditures; and

WHEREAS, on September 4, 2024, Council passed Ordinance No. 7, 2024 to correct such appropriation balances; and

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2024, Council passed Ordinance No. 9, 2024 to amend fiscal year 2024 appropriations to balance fund expenditures; and

WHEREAS, as the fiscal year is being closed, appropriations within certain Funds need to be balanced to match expenditures and appropriations and must be adjusted.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Montgomery, Hamilton County, Ohio, that:

**SECTION 1.** Effective immediately, in order to provide for the ongoing expenses and other expenditures of the City of Montgomery, Ohio for fiscal year 2024 to balance appropriations in certain Funds, the attached Schedule A, Adjustment to

Appropriations, is hereby adopted as if fully set forth herein, and funds are hereby reappropriated consistent therewith.

**SECTION 2.** This Ordinance shall take effect the earliest opportunity as allowable by law.

# ORDINANCE NO. , 2024

# AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS

WHEREAS, Section 3.05 of the Charter of the City of Montgomery, Ohio, requires Council to fix the compensation for City officers and employees, including elected officials; and

whereas, after several years and a review of the compensation paid by other communities to their public officials, Council believes it is appropriate to increase the compensation to be paid to Council Members and the Mayor to better reflect the time commitment and at times the related cost to serve in this public role; and

WHEREAS, the Charter and Ohio law do not permit an increase in compensation by an elected official during his or her term of office, so any increase as provided herein shall be staggered to commence with the new term of office for public officials elected in 2025 and those whose term may commence in 2027.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Montgomery, Hamilton County, Ohio, that:

**SECTION 1.** Commencing January 1, 2026, persons elected to Council for the term commencing at the organizational meeting in December 2025 shall be paid a salary of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) per year, payable in convenient increments consistent with the payroll practices of the City.

**SECTION 2.** Commencing January 1, 2028, persons elected to Council for the term commencing at the organizational meeting in December 2027 shall be paid a salary of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) per year, payable in convenient increments

consistent with the payroll practices of the City.

SECTION 3. Additionally, commencing January 1, 2026, the Council Member chosen by the Members of Council to serve as Mayor for the two-year Council term commencing at the organizational meeting in December 2025 shall receive an additional One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) annual stipend for the additional duties and responsibilities for service as Mayor.

**SECTION 4.** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 5.** This Ordinance shall take effect the earliest opportunity as allowable by law.

# Background

On July 4, 2026, our nation will commemorate and celebrate the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. To commemorate and celebrate the country's 250th anniversary, America 250 was created. The mission of America 250 is "To commemorate and celebrate our 250th anniversary with inclusive programs that inspire Americans to renew and strengthen our daring experiment in democracy. The shared experiences of America250 will have ignited our imaginations, elevated our diverse stories, inspired service in our communities, and demonstrated the lasting durability of the American project".

America 250 – Ohio is a commission charged with preparing the state to participate in the United States of America's 250th anniversary. It is a multi-year commemoration where Ohioans from all 88 counties will be in the spotlight of the impact Ohio's unique role in our nation's story. The effort will tell the story of Ohio, from the Native Americans to people who call Ohio home today. America 250 – Ohio is requesting assistance from communities throughout Ohio to become official America 250 – OH (AM 250-OH) communities and help create exciting and engaging opportunities to celebrate and commemorate the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

AM 250-OH communities will receive special recognition and a designation including signage, website recognition, event promotion, resources, and connections to other AM 250 - OH communities. Additionally, there is an opportunity for grant funding to assist with local activations that are supplemental to the programs that America 250 - Ohio is producing statewide.

## Request

To become an official AM 250-OH community, it is requested that City Council pass a Resolution supporting the initiative and Montgomery's participation in the program. Given the City's history and dedication to historic preservation and education, Staff

believes that becoming an official AM 250-OH community is a natural fit and will aid in drawing more attention and visitors to the City's cherished Heritage District. Therefore, Staff is in support of City Council passing a resolution to become an official AM 250-OH Community and support the efforts of celebrating the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of America.

SUBJECT: ORC 321.34 Advance Payment of Taxes for Collection Year 2025

## Background

The Ohio Revised Code section 321.34 allows for the advance payment of taxes to be drawn on the undivided real estate tax fund of Hamilton County. City Council passed legislation to advance taxes for collection year 2024 on September 4, 2024. Hamilton County requires passage of this legislation for each collection year.

## Financial Impact

In November of 2024, our General Operating Account earned a 4.39 percent annual yield. Our Property Tax Settlement total is approximately 7 million dollars per half year. Currently, we receive these funds in April and September. If the city was to request monthly distributions of these funds in the three months prior to the settlement on the usual settlement dates, this could result in interest income of over \$100,000.00

# A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE COUNTY AUDITOR TO MAKE TAX ADVANCES DURING THE YEAR 2025 PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE § 321.34

WHEREAS, the Ohio Revised Code does allow a municipal corporation to request payment from the County Auditor funds derived from taxes or other sources payable to the County Treasurer which may be held on account of a local subdivision; and

WHEREAS, Council does desire to make this statutory request for fiscal year 2025 and to authorize payment to the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Montgomery, Hamilton County, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. In accordance with R.C. § 321.34, the County Auditor and the County Treasurer are hereby requested to draw, and to pay the City of Montgomery, Ohio, such funds due in any settlement of fiscal year 2025 derived from taxes or other sources payable to the County Treasurer to the account of the City of Montgomery, and lawfully applicable for the purposes of fiscal year 2025. Such payments are to be made from time to time upon the written request to the County Auditor from either Brian K. Riblet, City Manager, or Maura Gray, Director of Finance.

SECTION 2. The Clerk of Council of the City of Montgomery is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Auditor of Hamilton County, Ohio.

This Resolution is required by U.S. Treasury regulations to allow the City to advance certain monies for Stage II of the Montgomery Quarter Redevelopment Project. Under the terms of the current Development Agreement between the City and the Developer, it is anticipated that \$16,000,000 of new bonds will be issued for Stage II. From this bond issue the City is authorized to draw \$1,500,000 to cover the cost for Stage II construction of Public Improvements.

Some of the costs for these Public Improvements in Stage II may be advanced in 2025 and 2026 before the bonds are issued. Some of these costs may include engineering and survey work as well as construction of the streetscape. This Resolution, consistent with Treasury regulations, will authorize the City to advance funds today and to be reimbursed later for those expenditures from the Stage II bond issue.

The City has issued previous reimbursement Resolutions for Stage I and an initial Resolution for Stage II governing calendar years 2023 and 2024. This Resolution will extend the City's right to claim reimbursement during calendar years 2025 and 2026.

Mrs. Mills-Reynolds requested a correction to be made to her Council report in the November 20 minutes. She explained the changes.

Mr. Margolis made a motion to approve the minutes as amended. Mrs. Bissmeyer seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

## MAYOR'S COURT REPORT

Mayor Messer requested a motion to disburse the November Mayors Court collections in the amount of \$5,815.

Vice Mayor Naiman made the motion to disburse the November Mayors Court collections in the amount of \$5,815. Mrs. Bissmeyer seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

# **OTHER BUSINESS**

## New Liquor License

Chief Crowell explained that a notice was received from the Ohio Division of Liquor Control for a new liquor permit for Bengal Beef, LLC dba New York Butcher Shoppe. He explained that the license was for a C1 and C2 license which allows the sale of beer and wine for carryout until 1:30 a.m. He explained that as the business was new and the owners have no record to report there was no reason to request a hearing. He recommended making a motion to not request a hearing with the Ohio Division of Liquor Control.

Mrs. Bissmeyer made a motion not to request a hearing. Vice Mayor Naiman seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

## Other Business

Vice Mayor Naiman reported that the Law and Safety Committee met and were provided an update on Mayors Court. She explained that with the sudden resignation of the Magistrate, a temporary magistrate will be named by the Mayor until a new one is selected in 2025. She stated that there were modifications made to the magistrate and prosecutor contracts to reduce costs, and that staff will be tracking data over 2025 to identify usage of Mayors Court. She added that the court will also be moved to City Hall.

Mrs. Bissmeyer made a motion to appoint Mr. Dobrozsi as Mayor Pro-Tem from December 20 through December 22. Vice Mayor Naiman seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

Mayor Messer asked if there was any further business to discuss in the Public Session. There being none he asked for a motion to adjourn.

Mr. Margolis moved to adjourn. Mrs. Bissmeyer seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.
