He asked Vice Mayor Roesch to preside over the meeting. 23

Vice Mayor Roesch asked for a motion to excuse Mayor Dobrozsi from the discussion and to excuse Ms. Bissmeyer who had a family commitment. Mr. Margolis made a motion to approve the recusal of Mayor Dobrozsi. Mr. Cappel seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

Proposal to Create a Tax Increment Incentive District

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Mr. Donnellon, law director, explained that the proposed Incentive Districts are a part of the overall Tax Increment Financing area which will support public improvements in the Montgomery Quarter. He stated that property improvements within the District would be exempt, although the property owners would continue to pay an amount equivalent to the property taxes based upon existing levies. The monies are then retained by the City after compensation to the schools and the County, and the monies are then used to pay for bonds to finance the improvements and/or future public improvements within the District.

Mr. Donnellon stated that before creating an Incentive District the City is required by §5709.40(C) to hold a public hearing, and in advance of that public hearing send notice to property owners within the Incentive District that Council intends to create such a District and allow them to raise their questions or concerns. He stated the only property owner within the intended Incentive Districts is the City. He stated that while it may seem odd, the City is sending notice to the City of this intended action. We are required to hold this public hearing as a first step in the TIF process.

Mr. Donnellon explained that included in the packet are drafts of upcoming legislation to formalize the Tax Increment Financing Districts. He stated there are three (3) separate pieces of legislation creating two Incentive Districts and one Commercial TIF District. He explained that the two Incentive Districts encompass the entire condominium site of the project, and the Commercial District encompasses the remainder of the project. He added that there are two separate Incentive Districts as the compensation formula for the school provides two different levels of compensation for each of the two Districts. The District abutting the commercial development is identified as Phase I of the School Compensation Agreement, which compensates Sycamore at 10% of the tax revenues generated with an additional structured formula to pay them additional compensation as the TIF develops based upon accumulated excess. The second Incentive District is the southeast corner of the site intended to be developed in Phase II, which compensates the school at 5% of the collected tax revenues.

Vice Mayor Roesch stated that there was no need for any type of a vote but rather a motion is needed to take the information provided by Mr. Donnellon under advisement.

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Mr. Cappel made a motion to take the information regarding the Tax Increment Incentive District under advisement. Mr. Margolis seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

Vice Mayor Roesch asked if there was any further business to be heard in the Public Hearing. There being none she asked for a motion to adjourn from the Public Hearing.

Mr. Cappel made a motion to adjourn from the Public Hearing. Mr. Margolis seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
