On Saturday, March 21, 2020, the City of Montgomery made history. Montgomery City Council and Staff conducted our first-ever conference call meeting with a resolution voted on remotely. This is typically not allowed, but the Attorney General granted permission for municipalities to be able to conduct business virtually during the pandemic.

The resolution declared an emergency in the City due to the coronavirus; COVID 19. It passed unanimously. STREET RESURFACING PROGRAM STARTS THIS MAY

The City awarded the 2020 street resurfacing program to JK Meurer Corporation. This year's program includes 2.19 centerline miles of public roadway. The following streets will be completed:

- Fourwinds Drive (Fairwind Drive to Trailwind Drive)
- Gentlewind Drive (Fourwinds Drive to terminus)
- Knollwind Drive (Gentlewind Drive to terminus)
- Trailwind Drive (#7597 Trailwind Drive to south terminus)
- Trailwind Drive (#7615 Trailwind Drive to Southwind Drive)
- Weller Road (Bridgewater Lane to #8699 Weller Road)
- Weil Road (Weller Road to corporation limit)
- Trail Lane (Weil Road to terminus)

The work entails complete milling and asphalt resurfacing, along with "spot" curb replacement and storm drainage inlet repairs. Construction is anticipated to begin in May and will be finished by the end of summer.

INFRASTRUCTURE WORK CONTINUES

In the Stay At Home Order signed by Ohio Department of Health Director Dr. Amy Acton on March 22, 2020, one of the exceptions for individuals to leave their homes was to provide services or perform any work necessary for the construction or repair of essential infrastructure. Essential infrastructure was defined as public works construction, essential business construction, and housing construction, among other services. This exemption was carried forward in the Amended Stay At Home Order signed by Dr. Acton on April 2, 2020.

PHASE 2 OF THE ROUNDABOUT CONSTRUCTION COMING SOON


John R. Jurgensen will begin Phase 2 construction of the roundabout project at the intersection of Montgomery Road and Ronald Reagan Cross County Highway anticipated to start in June, weather permitting. This second phase is anticipated to last four to five months. Phase 2 traffic modifications will consist of:

- Closing the Montgomery Road bridge and routing ALL of Montgomery Road traffic on a bypass (see image)
- The temporary traffic signals installed during Phase 1 will remain in operation for Montgomery Road and Ronald Reagan Cross County Highway. The northerly signal will be for traffic accessing westbound Ronald Reagan Cross County Highway, and the southerly signal will be for traffic exiting the highway.
- A sidewalk will be located on the east side of the by-pass for pedestrians.
- Modifications will be made to the traffic signage and pavement striping on Montgomery Road to arrange this new traffic pattern. Stay alert when driving through this location so you can get into the proper lane based on your destination.

The Phase 2 traffic pattern will allow the contractor to demolish the Montgomery Road bridge and highway lanes under the bridge and perform other activities in the work area.

Expect delays during construction. Please use an alternate route if one is available. More details on the construction phasing and schedule will be provided on the City's website at montgomeryohio. org/montgomery-roundabout-information/ and in future Montgomery Bulletins.

Montgomery Kiwanis will hold its annual children's fishing contest **Saturday, June 6, from 9:00-11:00 a.m**. at Todd Pond in Swaim Park in Montgomery (intersection of Cooper and Zig Zag).

FOLLOW TIPS TO KEEP GRASS GREENER AND WATER CLEANER

Enjoy the benefits of a beautiful green lawn and keep our streams, rivers, and groundwater safe.

Do Not Overapply Fertilizer - To maintain a healthy lawn, we apply fertilizer every year. But how much do we need? The over-application of fertilizer is costly and unnecessary. Obtain a soil test from The Hamilton County Soil and Water Conservation District (hcswcd.org), your local nursery or garden center. Use the test results to apply only the amount of fertilizer your lawn needs.

What Type of Fertilizer to Use? -

Choose a fertilizer with little or no phosphorous- excess phosphorous will wash into storm drains when it rains or if the lawn is overwatered. Excess phosphorus stimulates algae growth, which depletes oxygen from aquatic life.

Other choices are organic or slowrelease nitrogen fertilizers. Slowrelease nitrogen distributes over an extended time, which provides even growth and better root development. And since they last longer than fastrelease fertilizer, they don't need to be applied as frequently.

Increase Fertilizer Efficiency and Reduce Weeds - Annual aeration breaks up compacted soil, which allows more water, oxygen, and fertilizer to get to the plant roots. Aeration enables the plant roots to penetrate deeper into the ground. Deep plant roots produce a more drought-resistant lawn and suppress weeds by preventing seed to soil contact necessary to germinate, which means fewer herbicides!

Set Mower Height to 3 Inches or Higher – Taller grass will yield deeper and denser roots, which will absorb more water, reduce run-off, and shade out weeds.

Grass Clippings - Grass clippings left on your lawn act as an excellent fertilizer. The grass will decompose, which releases water and nutrients back into the soil <u>and will keep grass</u> clippings out of the storm drains.

Water Deeply and Less Often -

Lawns need 1 inch of water a week. If there is less than an inch of rainfall, then water deeply one to two times a week. Daily watering keeps the roots of the grass wet and blocks oxygen, which will suffocate and kill the roots. Deep watering means water penetrates 6 to 8 inches into the soil. One method of deep watering is to water 10-15 minutes, then let it soak in, and then turn on the water for another 10-15 minutes.

Hire Smart - Before you hire a lawn care service, be sure to ask if they will sweep any fertilizer, chemicals, and grass clippings off your driveway, patio, or street and back onto your lawn. If they don't, do it yourself or hire someone else!

WEED CONTROL: THE NATURAL WAY

With all of the recent talk surrounding the safety of weed control products, Mary Ann Folz, an Montgomery Environmental Advisory Committee member, decided to test to compare natural vs. purchased products, right here in Montgomery. Here are her results.

<u>Test</u>: Spray natural vs. purchased solution on driveway and sidewalk cracks.

Results: Both options kill weeds! The purchased product was slower to work, but did keep weeds away longer, up to a month. The natural solution was easier to apply and worked faster but does need to be applied every couple of weeks to keep the weeds at bay. But, it's totally safe!

So, if you want an inexpensive, easy and natural weed control solution, here's an excellent way to do it:

- 1) Start by mixing 1 gallon of white vinegar, 1 cup of table salt, and 1 tablespoon of liquid dish soap
- 2) Next fill an empty dish soap **squeeze** bottle (the bigger the better) with the mixture.

It works best if you wait for a sunny day, then saturate your weeds with the solution. You will likely find that the natural squeeze bottle solution is easier to use than the purchased squirt bottle, and no need to worry about dripping it on your hands or feet! In the morning, you'll see the weeds are brown and within 24-48 hours, they should be totally dried up. Try this simple, natural, and safe approach to weed control this summer, too!
