Tabled Legislation

a. An Ordinance Agreeing To Adjust The Boundaries Between The City Of Montgomery, Ohio And The City Of The Village Of Indian Hill, Ohio Pursuant To Ohio Revised Code Section 709.37—(Vice Mayor Margolis, 3rd Reading-TABLED) Information has been previously supplied on this Ordinance that, if approved, would grant a request from Amy M. and Christopher Gilles, Property Owners on Remington Road, to approve a boundary adjustment for their property to relocate a portion of their lot from the Village of Indian Hill into the City to then be consolidated to create a larger, buildable lot. This Ordinance is the first step in the statutory process to adjust the boundary between the City and the Village. The Village of Indian Hill is passing a similar Ordinance, after which the legislation will

be presented to the Board of Commissioners of Hamilton County, Ohio to approve the boundary adjustment between the two communities.

This Ordinance will remain on the table until Council later adds it to the Agenda for the third reading.

New Legislation

a. A Resolution Amending Resolution No. 26, 2019 Authorizing The City Manager To Enter Into A Contract With Dental Care Plus, Inc. To Provide Dental Insurance <u>Coverage For Full-Time Employees</u>—Please see the attached correspondence from Julie Prickett, Human Resource Manger requesting City Council to approve this Resolution that, if approved, would authorize extending the current contract with Dental Care Plus, Inc. for an additional three months (October 1 through December 31, 2021). You may recall last year the City contracted with Humana for a 15-month period to provide employee group medical insurance with a zero percent increase in premium costs. This resulted in additional cost savings for the City but also resulted in group dental and group medical contract periods having different end dates. With the assistance of Julie Tople (HORAN), Dental Care Plus was contacted and is willing to extend its existing contract for employee group dental insurance an additional three months from October 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 at current rates. Extending the contract with Dental Care Plus an additional three months would sync the employee group dental insurance contract end period with the employee group medical insurance contract end period, resulting in administrative efficiencies for the City and greater convenience for the employees. Earlier this year the members of the HealthCare Benefits Committee were consulted, and all members of the Committee were supportive of syncing the dental insurance contract end date with the medical insurance contract end date.

b. A Resolution Authorizing an Assessment for The Removal of Dead Trees—Please find attached correspondence from Tracy Roblero, Assistant City Manager/ Acting Community Development Director, requesting that City Council authorize an assessment for the removal of dead trees at 8817 Castleford Drive. Due to negligence by the owner of the property, the City has been forced to remove dead trees in order to bring the property into compliance with our property maintenance code. Section 93.23 provides a prohibition against dead trees. Section 93.16 of the code allows the Community Development Director to have these nuisances abated by contract and the cost to be charged against the real property and a lien to be placed upon the property. After providing the required notices, staff contracted with Davey Tree to have the dead trees removed. The total cost of tree removal was \$4,740. The City now desires to assess a lien upon the property for the cost

incurred by the City to remove the dead trees, and an additional administrative fee of \$25. The adoption of this Resolution will allow for the assessment to be included in the upcoming property tax bills that will be mailed in January.

This request, if approved, would authorize an amount not to exceed \$200,000. The services are consistent with the terms and conditions established under previous Resolutions associated with the project. Funds would be drawn for from the Downtown Improvement Fund 480.000.5365.

authorize a maximum purchase of 1400 tons of deicing rock salt in the amount of \$94,528.00 (\$67.52 per ton).

AN ORDINANCE AGREEING TO ADJUST THE BOUNDARIES BETWEEN THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, OHIO AND THE CITY OF THE VILLAGE OF INDIAN HILL, OHIO PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE SECTION 709.37

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 709.37, two adjoining municipal corporations may, by Ordinance adopted by their respective legislative authorities, agree to adjust their boundaries, provided that such adjustment does not involve the transfer of land inhabited by more than five voters; and

WHEREAS, property owners, Amy M. and Christopher Gilles, are the record owners of two plats located on Remington Road, Hamilton County, Ohio, which lots border the common corporation line between the City of Montgomery, Ohio ("Montgomery") and the City of the Village of Indian Hill, Ohio ("Indian Hill"); and

WHEREAS, to create appropriately buildable lots for this land, the property owners have petitioned both Montgomery and Indian Hill to adjust the corporation line to move .3362 acres from Hamilton County Auditor's parcel number 619-0190-0082 from Indian Hill, and to consolidate such lot with lot 603-0004-0093 located within Montgomery. A copy of the proposed survey plat is attached hereto as **Exhibit A-1** and the former legal description for the remaining lots are attached hereto **Exhibit A-2**; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Montgomery hereby finds and determines that a boundary adjustment of a portion of the property from Indian Hill to Montgomery will allow the adjusted and consolidated property to be governed by the laws of only one municipality, it will allow for the effective enforcement of the appropriate municipal codes in each jurisdiction, and it will avoid confusion regarding the provision of

municipal services by properly adjusting the boundary line to recognize these as two distinctive lots in their respective jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the City of Montgomery is willing to adjust its municipal boundary line with the Village of Indian Hill as graphically depicted in Exhibit A-1 and described in Exhibit A-2 attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the proposed boundary adjustment would not affect any voters in either municipality and would be in the best interest of both municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Montgomery desires to zone the new lot as consolidated and adjust it to the City of Montgomery as Residential A.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Montgomery, Hamilton County, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. The Council of the City of Montgomery, Ohio does hereby agree to a boundary adjustment with the City of the Village of Indian Hill to consolidate a portion of Hamilton County Auditor's parcel number 619-0190-0082 to Hamilton County parcel number 603-0004-0093, and to adjust the new corporation line as appropriate and as depicted on the attached Exhibit A-1. Council hereby requests that the Board of Commissioners of Hamilton County, Ohio adjust the boundaries for the City of Montgomery, Ohio and the City of the Village of Indian Hill in the manner as provided by law and as depicted in Exhibit A-1 and described in Exhibit A-2 attached hereto.

SECTION 2. The territory that is becoming a part of the City of Montgomery shall be zoned Residential A and subject to all laws generally applicable to properties in the City. The Community Development Director shall cause the official zoning map of the City of Montgomery to be amended in accordance with this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall go into effect and become law from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 4. The Clerk of the City is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance to the Hamilton County Recorder.



Legislation Request to Extend Contract with Dental Care Plus, Inc.

Introduction

It is requested that a recommendation be made to City Council to adopt this Resolution which would authorize extending the current contract with Dental Care Plus, Inc. for an additional three months (October 1 through December 31, 2021) for employee group dental insurance.

Background

As you know, last year the City contracted with Humana for a 15-month period to provide employee group medical insurance with a zero percent increase in premium costs. This resulted in additional cost savings for the City but also resulted in group dental and group medical contract periods having different end dates.

With the assistance of Julie Tople (HORAN), Dental Care Plus, Inc. was contacted and is willing to extend its existing contract for employee group dental insurance an additional three months from October 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 at current rates. Extending the contract with Dental Care Plus, Inc. for an additional three months would sync the employee group dental insurance contract end period with the employee group medical insurance contract end period. Not only would this result in an additional three months of guaranteed group dental insurance rates, it would also provide administrative efficiencies for the City and greater convenience for the employees by allowing the City to have one open enrollment period for all group benefits. This format would be consistent with open enrollment procedures the City has typically followed in the past, with one annual open enrollment period for all employee benefit options.

Earlier this year the members of the HealthCare Benefits Committee were consulted, and all members of the Committee were supportive of syncing the dental insurance contract end date with the medical insurance contract end date.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that City Council adopt a Resolution that would authorize extending the current contract with Dental Care Plus, Inc. for an additional three months (October 1 through December 31, 2021.)

Additional Notes

Recommendations from the HealthCare Benefits Committee regarding proposals from carriers for group insurance coverages, as well as recommendations from the City Administration regarding City "caps" on insurance premium contributions, will be presented to City Council later this year.

WHEREAS, extending the existing contract with Dental Care Plus an additional three months would match the employee group dental insurance contract end period date with the employee group medical insurance contract end period date, resulting in administrative efficiencies for the City and greater convenience for the employees.

Authorizing an Assessment for Property Maintenance

Request

It is requested that City Council adopt a Resolution Authorizing an Assessment at 8817 Castleford Lane.

Background

Due to negligence by the owner the property, the City has been forced to remove dead trees to bring the property into compliance with the Property Maintenance Code.

Section 93.23 of the Property Maintenance Code provides a prohibition against dead trees. Section 93.16 of the Code allows the Community Development Director to have these nuisances abated by contract and the cost to be charged against the real property and a lien to be placed upon the property.

The City, after providing the required notice, contracted with Davey Tree to have the dead trees removed. The total cost of tree removal was \$4,740.

The City now desires to assess a lien upon these properties for the cost incurred and an additional administrative fee of \$25 as allowable by law.

Recommendation

At this time, it is necessary to certify to the Hamilton County Auditor the costs of this maintenance so they may be assessed on the property for this location. Therefore, it is Staff's recommendation that this resolution be placed on the agenda for the August 4, 2021 Business Session. This timing will allow for the assessment to be included in the upcoming property tax bills that will be mailed in January.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN ASSESSMENT FOR THE REMOVAL OF DEAD TREES

WHEREAS, the City of Montgomery, in Chapter 93 of the Code of Ordinances has provided a prohibition against dead trees within the City, a method of notifying non-complying property owners to remove such trees, and a procedure by which the City may cut and remove the trees if the owner fails to take action within the time allowed; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code allows a City to place a lien against real property for the charges for the services in removal of dead trees and the fees incurred administratively to provide notice to the non-complying property owner; and

WHEREAS, the City has followed its Code of Ordinances in notifying the owner of the real property at 8817 Castleford Lane, Montgomery, Ohio 45242, being Auditor's Parcel Number 603-0013-0414-00 as set forth in the attached copies of Affidavits; and

WHEREAS, the owner has failed or refused to take action within the time allowed pursuant to such notices; and

WHEREAS, the City, after submitting such notices, has entered upon the real property to cut and remove the trees at a cost of \$4,765; and

WHEREAS, the City now desires to assess a lien upon said real property for the cost incurred by the City to cut and remove such trees and an additional administrative fee of \$25.00 as allowable by law.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Montgomery, Ohio:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code and the Ordinances of the City of Montgomery, Council hereby makes this written return to the Auditor of Hamilton County, Ohio, and requests that the Auditor place a lien against the real property located at 8817 Castleford Drive, Montgomery, Ohio 45242, being Auditor's Parcel Number 603-0013-0414-00, in the amount of \$4,765.00, which includes the administrative fee. The Auditor is requested to place said special assessment against the real property upon the tax duplicate as is authorized by Ohio law to collect the same according to law and to return such collections to the City.

Request

It is necessary for City Council to consider a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to amend Resolution #4, 2020 and Resolution #32, 2020 for the purchase of certain design and engineering services for the development of the Montgomery Quarter project specifically transitioning from Sequence III of Phase I into Phase II of the overall development.

Financial Impact

This request, if approved, would authorize an amount not to exceed \$200,000 to purchase certain design and engineering services for the development of the Montgomery Quarter project from McGill Smith Punshon, Inc. (MSP) estimated at \$83,500, MKSK Studios (MKSK) estimated at \$110,000 and Berding Surveying estimated at \$6,500. The services are consistent with the terms and conditions established under previous Resolutions associated with the project. Funds would be drawn for from the Downtown Improvement Fund 480.000.5365. These costs will qualify as reimbursable expenditures associated with the Montgomery Quarter project and will be recovered through the Tax Increment Finance (TIF) agreement structured for the development.

<u>Background</u>

Gateway Partners Montgomery, LLC who has been contracted by the City as our Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) continues to work with engineering firms to advance Construction Drawings, engineering and site plan drawings, and surveying as part of the public and private improvements within the Montgomery Quarter project. Payments will allow the City to acquire and Gateway Partners Montgomery, LLC to

assign to the City all plans, reports, engineering drawings, concepts and designs, and survey reports prepared by MSP, MKSK and Berding Surveying.

Recommendation

Staff recommends City Council adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to amend Resolution #4, 2020 and Resolution #32, 2020 for the purchase of certain design and engineering services completed by MSP, MKSK and Berding Surveying for the development of the Montgomery Quarter project in an amount not to exceed \$200,000.

Project, and to begin the initial phase to engineer and design Phase 2 of the project in an amount not to exceed combined expenditures of \$200,000.00, including reimbursement for services previously authorized and billed, and services to be billed through the next stage of the development of these Public Improvements. Such expenditures shall include reimbursement for professional services as well as subcontractor costs including surveying necessary from their contractor, Berding Surveying, Inc.

Request

It is necessary for City Council to adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into Contract with Prus Construction to complete the 9305 - 9321 Montgomery Road Access Consolidation Project.

Financial Impact

The 9305 - 9321 Montgomery Road Access Consolidation Project will be funded through the 480-000-5401 Downtown Improvements Fund. It is requested that the project be approved in the amount of \$232,960.00, which is the amount of the Base Bid plus 10% contingency.

Background

The project will consolidate and relocate the driveway access serving 9305 through 9321 Montgomery Road. The consolidated access will be located directly across from Roosa Street of the Montgomery Quarter Development, and will become the "west leg" of the traffic signal being constructed by John R. Jurgensen as part of the roundabout project.

The project was publicly advertised, and a bid opening was held on Wednesday, July 14th at 9:00 AM. A total of three (3) bids were received for this project. The lowest and best bid received was provided by Prus Construction. A complete bid summary of the three (3) companies that submitted a bid is attached, summarized as follows:

Recommendation

Staff has reviewed the bids received and determined that the bid received from Prus Construction is the lowest and best bid for the 9305 - 9321 Montgomery Road Access Consolidation Project.

It is recommended that City Council adopt legislation to authorize City Manager Brian Riblet to enter into a Contract with Prus Construction to construct the project.

The amount of the recommendation includes \$21,178 in project contingency funding, which is an amount equal to 10% of the Base Bid amount.

Request

It is necessary for City Council to adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into Contract with Compass Minerals America Inc. pursuant to a joint purchasing bid with Hamilton County for 2021 – 2022 deicing rock salt.

Financial Impact

The purchase of deicing rock salt for the 2021-2022 winter season is included in the City budget in the 261.000.5380 Street Maintenance, 265.000.5380 State Highway Fund, and 266.000.5380 Permissive MVL Fund. If approved, the request would authorize a maximum purchase of 1400 tons of deicing rock salt in the amount of \$94,528.00 (\$67.52 per ton). This represents a 15% increase in cost per ton when compared to the 2020/2021 winter season, however it is 25% less per ton when compared to the 2019/2020 winter season.

<u>Background</u>

Each year the City enters into a contract for the purchase of deicing rock salt for the winter season. The past several winter seasons the City of Montgomery has entered into a joint purchasing bid with Hamilton County. This year, staff was able to secure once again a commitment through the Hamilton County Engineer's Office to enter into a joint purchasing bid for the purchase of deicing rock salt for the upcoming 2021/2022 winter season.

Recommendation

It is recommended that City Council adopt legislation to authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with Compass Minerals America Inc. pursuant to a joint

purchasing bid for the 2021/2022 winter season for a maximum purchase of 1400 tons of deicing rock salt in the amount of \$94,528.00 (\$67.52 per ton).

Mr. Suer explained that, if approved, this Resolution would adopt the 2022 Tax Budget. Mr. Messer explained that, if approved, this Resolution would designate GovDeals.com as internet auction agents for the disposal of surplus property for the period of August 1, 2021 through July 31, 2022. Ohio law authorizes the City to dispose of surplus and abandoned personal property through internet auction. Section 50.02 of the Code of Ordinances sets forth a procedure for the sale and disposition of lost, abandoned, stolen, seized, or forfeited property ("Surplus Property") through internet auction agents. This Resolution will also authorize the City Manager to enter into appropriate contracts with GovDeals.com.

A Resolution Designating Records Managers And Training Designees For Public Officials In The City Of Montgomery

Mr. Messer explained that, if approved, this Resolution will designate records managers and training designees for Public Officials for the City of Montgomery. This Resolution will designate the Clerk of Council, Connie Gaylor and alternately Finance Specialist Derek Morgan, as designated representatives of City Council to attend Ohio public records training and to serve as Records Managers for the City. Ohio law requires all public officials to either attend the training or to designate a person to attend on their behalf.

Mr. Suer explained that, if approved, this Resolution will formally ratify and approve the Internal Control Policies for the Law Enforcement Trust Funds managed by the City. These accounts receive funds from various forfeitures including federal forfeitures in cooperation with the Department of Justice. The management and use of these funds are controlled by the State and Federal programs, particularly the program for Equitable Sharing. This legislation formalizes those internal policies.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT

Mr. Riblet reported the following items:

- City Council Work Session is scheduled for Wednesday, July 7 at 7:00 p.m.
- The Parks and Recreation Committee meeting has been rescheduled for Thursday, July 15 at 3:30 p.m. The Government Affairs and Public Works Committees of Council have cancelled their meetings for the month of July.
- The City had record attendance at the BAMSO concert as well as the July 4th Parade and Festival this past weekend. The weather was fantastic, and it was very evident people were ready to celebrate these events as in years past. Thanks to all of the staff and volunteers who work so hard to make these events so special. Special thanks to Julie Machon and Sarah Fink and also to Ms. Roesch for her extensive work with the BAMSO concert.
- Assistant Chief Vonden Benken, Officer Janszen, and Sergeant Shreve presented to Cincinnati Police
 Department's Youth Police Academy Cadets on Tuesday and Wednesday. The Cadets saw a K9
 demonstration from Officer Janszen and Ricky, a tour from Asst Chief Vonden Benken, and a drone and
 training simulator presentation with Sergeant Shreve.
- As part of the 2021 Street Resurfacing Program, JK Meurer will begin milling existing pavement of the streets tomorrow. They plan to begin on Adventure Lane close to Storybook Drive and then continue to Thumbelina, Shadowhill Way, and the adjacent cul-de-sac streets.
- Staff is putting a schedule together to conduct an RFQ/RFP process to design the inner circle and surrounding areas of the roundabout at Montgomery Road and Ronald Reagan Highway. Staff will provide ample opportunity for City Council, the Development Team and other key stakeholders to provide input.
- Staff is working on a DORA event with an identified date of Saturday, August 21. Stay tuned for additional
 details.
- Belated Birthday wishes go to Council Member Bissmeyer (7/2) and Council Member Messer (7/3). Also, Ms. Henao will be celebrating on 7/24.
- City Council is invited to attend a "beam" signing at the Montgomery Quarter on Tuesday, July 13 at 2:00 p.m. He asked those able to attend to confirm with Ms. Gaylor.

Mr. Riblet requested an Executive Session for matters related to the compensation of a public employee or official and collective bargaining matters.

Vice Mayor Margolis stated that he seen the City was advertising for the 9305-9321 Montgomery Road Curb Consolidation Project and asked what that work included.

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- Mr. Riblet explained that it was for the consolidation of multiple curb cuts between those addressed into one. He explained that it all fits within the work that John R. Jurgenson is performing within the Montgomery Quarter. Mr.
- Riblet explained that staff has been working on this project for two years.
- Mayor Dobrozsi asked if that time was working on obtaining right of ways.
- Mr. Riblet replied that yes, it was to obtain easement agreements with the property owners. He stated that he hoped to get the project completed by early fall. He added that excess TIF funds would be utilized for the project.
- Vice Mayor Margolis asked if this would consolidate the Delicio, Houdini's and Avis curb cuts.
- Mr. Riblet replied that the Avis curb cut would be removed and that the curb cut for Dunkin Donuts, formerly Delicio's, would be used. He stated that would provide for a safer environment for motorists.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- 220 Mayor Dobrozsi asked for a motion to approve the June 23, 2021 Public Hearing and Work Session minutes.
- Mr. Cappel made a motion to approve the June 23, 2021 Public Hearing and Work Session minutes as written. Mrs. Bissmeyer seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

MAYOR'S COURT REPORT

- Mayor Dobrozsi asked for a motion to disburse the June Mayor Court collections in the amount of \$10,305.
- Vice Mayor Margolis moved to disburse the June Mayor Court collections. Mr. Cappel seconded. City Council unanimously agreed,

OTHER BUSINESS

- Mayor Dobrozsi asked if there were any items for other business.
- Mr. Donnellon explained that City Council may remember their vote to join the One Ohio coalition regarding a lawsuit filed against opioid manufacturers and distributors to pursue a settlement to recoup money spent responding to the opioid crisis. He explained that since that time Purdue Pharma one of the Defendants has filed bankruptcy. He explained that they were the manufacturers of oxycontin. Mr. Donnellon explained that there is a reorganization plan within their bankruptcy upon which we as a creditor have been asked to vote. He stated that if accepted, the settlement could designate several billions of dollars be allocated to the State then the State would allocate locally to the communities for abatement and treatment programs. He explained that Montgomery is a Class 4 Creditor with thousands of other jurisdictions across the country He explained that the ballots are due by July 13. He stated we are trying to get direction from One Ohio as to how to vote and we will follow their recommendation. He stated that if we get direction from One Ohio to vote he would request Council to make a motion to vote our ballot at their direction as our leader in negotiations. He stated that if we get no direction in time from them that we would abstain from voting. He explained that the judge could approve the reorganization even if it is opposed. Mr. Donnellon stated that he felt the plan would get approved.

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Mr. Cappel made a motion to authorize the City Manager to vote the ballot on the advisement of One Ohio or to abstain. Vice Mayor Margolis seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

Mr. Suer explained that at the July 6 Financial Planning Committee meeting the proposed memorial project honoring Council Member Harbison was discussed. He explained that there were four specific recommendations that the Committee adopted concerning the memorial. He stated that ultimately a motion by Council would be needed to accept the recommendations. He explained the recommendations as follows:

- Finance accepts the proposed concept to install a Memorial Statute in Montgomery Park as proposed by the separate Chamber Committee honoring Gerri Harbison. The final location of the installation will be upon the recommendation of the Administration with Finance, Public Works and Parks and Rec being informed as well.
- Consistent with Ordinance 14, 2004, funds may be received into the Montgomery Living Memorial Fund
 designated specifically for the Gerri Harbison Memorial Statute. Only those funds will be expended for the
 sculpture and the installation of the sculpture. It is the responsibility of the outside committee to raise all
 funds necessary for the Memorial.
- Any expenditures from the Fund must be consistent with the City approved contract for the sculpture. The
 contract shall provide no liability to the City if the contract is terminated other than funds which may be
 available in the designated Memorial account.
- Consistent with the City's Memorial policy, \$2,300 will be contributed to either cash or in-kind goods for the Memorial. The Administration shall track the cost of goods purchased by the City or drawn from the City's inventory to be charged against this contribution. Any additional cash available up to the limit may be applied to the sculpture and related installations associated with the sculpture.

Mr. Cappel made a motion to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee. Mrs. Bissmeyer seconded. City Council unanimously agreed.

Vice Mayor Margolis thanked staff for their work in handling and providing the July 4th events.

Ms. Roesch stated that Public Works did a fantastic job in setting up for the concert and festival. She stated that Julie Machon and Sarah Fink and all staff worked hard in make the events special.

Mrs. Bissmeyer stated that she heard members of the crowd praising staff for a wonderful event.

Mayor Dobrozsi thanked staff, BAMSO and Council Member Roesch for their work in making all the events of the July 4th holiday so special.
