Request

In accordance with ORC Section 5709.85, it is necessary for City Council to adopt legislation to approve the August 15, 2022, finding of the Montgomery Tax Incentive Review Council. The Tax Incentive Review Council has determined that all current tax increment financing districts are in compliance with the requirements of the legislation that created the districts.

Background

The City of Montgomery Tax Incentive Review Council meets annually to review all existing tax increment financing districts to ensue their compliance with all requirements of the agreements that created the districts. This Tax Incentive Review Council is comprised of one representative from the Hamilton County Auditor's Office, one representative of the Sycamore Community Schools, one representative of the Great Oaks Joint Vocational School District, one Montgomery City Council Member, and the City Manager.

Recommendation

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Montgomery, Ohio has approved tax increment financing districts to encourage economic development of certain properties within the City limits; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery Tax Incentive Review Council meets annually to review these districts for compliance with payments in lieu of real estate taxes and other requirements as set forth in the legislation which created the districts; and

Several years ago we updated the Hamilton County records to reflect various streets within the City which had been dedicated on the various subdivision plats. However, the Developer had not followed through to have the streets accepted after construction was complete. These various streets had been titled in the name of the City of Montgomery, and while we had not paid taxes on those parcels, they did not reflect appropriate acceptance, which is the second of the two-step process to create a public street.

In a recent review of community records, the Director of Public Works discovered that there were a number of streets within developed subdivisions where portions of the streets had not been appropriately accepted and which were still titled in the name of the Developer. Some of these streets date back only a few years and one street within Fairwind Acres dates back decades. It has never been an issue for the City to maintain these streets, but this clears up the record that the streets have been dedicated, as noted on the County plats, and are now being accepted as public improvements.

Attached for you are CAGIS images of those portions of the streets which had not been accepted, which images identify the street by Auditor parcel number and identify the portion of the street which is now being accepted.

ORDINANCE NO. , 2022

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING DEDICATED STREETS WITHIN THE CITY

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 6, 2016, recorded in Hamilton County Official Records at Book 13356, Page 02025, the City did accept various streets throughout the community which had been dedicated in various subdivision plats filed with the City and the County, but had not been properly documented as accepted; and

WHEREAS, in a comprehensive review of streets within the City, it was discovered that there were additional dedicated, but not accepted streets within the City, which parcels were dedicated by the subdivision developer, but remained in the name of the subdivision developer; and

WHEREAS, Council does desire by enacting this Ordinance to take the appropriate steps to accept these streets which have been inspected and recommended for acceptance by the Director of Public Works.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Montgomery, Hamilton County, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. The following parcels identified in the records of the Hamilton County Auditor and properly dedicated on a recorded plat for the City of Montgomery are hereby accepted as public improvements to be retained and maintained by the City of Montgomery, Ohio:

SECTION 2. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute such additional documentation as may be necessary to implement the dedication and acceptance of these public streets.



The City's contribution to employees' Health Savings Accounts is recommended to be continued at \$1050 for a family plan and \$750 for a single plan for the twelve-month period of September 1, 2022 through August 31, 2023.
