#### Request

It is requested that the Montgomery Community Improvement Corporation consider an application for a historic preservation matching grant from Kerry and Bradley Hull to repair the box gutters on the Cameron Feinthel House located at 7893 Cooper Road.

#### **Financial Impact**

The financial impact will be \$9,493.50 which is fifty percent of the total quote provided by Deer Park Roofing.

#### Background

The Cameron-Feinthel house, as currently configured, dates to around 1892, when Isaac Cameron either remodeled the previous house or built an entirely new house. It was designed with features found in Queen Ann revival architecture. The Carriage House was built by Cameron to be used as a parsonage for the Methodist Church. The home was owned by the Feinthel family for many years before being purchased and renovated by Fred and Marty Miles in 2007. The current owners purchased the property in 2015 and have continued making improvements to the home and property. The proposal is to repair the existing box gutters in order to maintain the architectural integrity of the home. The box gutters are in severe disrepair in some locations and the contractor would make repairs as well as install new liners in order to extend the life of the gutters.

#### Landmarks Commission Action

Last year, the Landmarks Commission recommended that applications which do not require Commission approval should not need to come before the Commission for a recommendation on the Historic Preservation Matching Grant. Therefore, the program was modified to allow for applications for the Historic Preservation Matching Grant which are approvable by Staff to go directly to the Montgomery Community Improvement Corporation for consideration. The application does not require Landmarks Commission approval and therefore, Staff approved the application for a Certificate of Approval.

### **Staff Recommendation**

Staff believes that the proposal is consistent with the intent of the Historic Preservation Matching Grant program and the Heritage District guidelines. Staff appreciates the property owner making the significant investment to repair the existing box gutters in order to preserve the architectural integrity of the home. Staff is in support of the application to repair the existing box gutters at 7893 Cooper Road in the amount of \$9,493.50.

# Box Gutters

Box Gutters are a built-in gutter system that is typically found on older, historical homes in Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky. Unlike aluminum hanging gutters, they are part of the roof structure. Box gutters consist of wood framing with a sheet metal lining. The sheet metal creates a trough for the water to flow to the downspout. Since box gutters are usually over one foot wide, they rarely clog or overflow. Copper and stainless steel box gutter linings require very little maintenance.

\*Box Gutters are important to the historical and architectural integrity of your home. Each box gutter system requires precise measurements and custom fabrication. Our design staff must also accommodate the thermal movement of the metal liner to ensure longevity.

# 3 Reasons NOT to remove Box Gutter Systems

# Stay Cool

Eliminating the eaves from a residential structure will cause greater exposure to sunlight on the walls of the house during the summer months. This will increase the interior temperature of your home when the sun is high in the sky.

# Save The Walls

The overhang that is created by the box gutters protect the walls of the house from moisture. Eliminating the overhang can enable water to infiltrate through the windows or siding.

# Avoid the Flood

The overhang also keeps water away from the foundation of the house. Eliminating 1-2 feet of roofline on a house will have negative implications on the moisture levels in the ground near the basement walls.

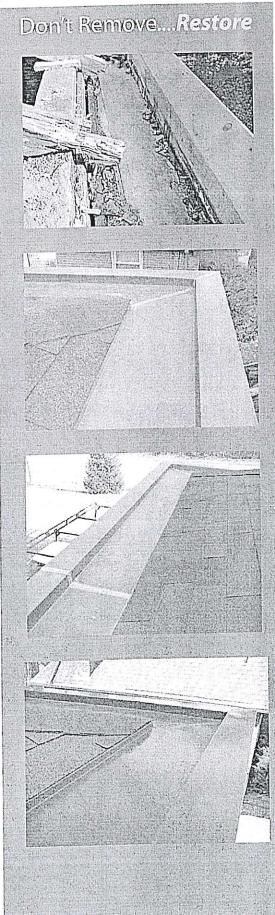

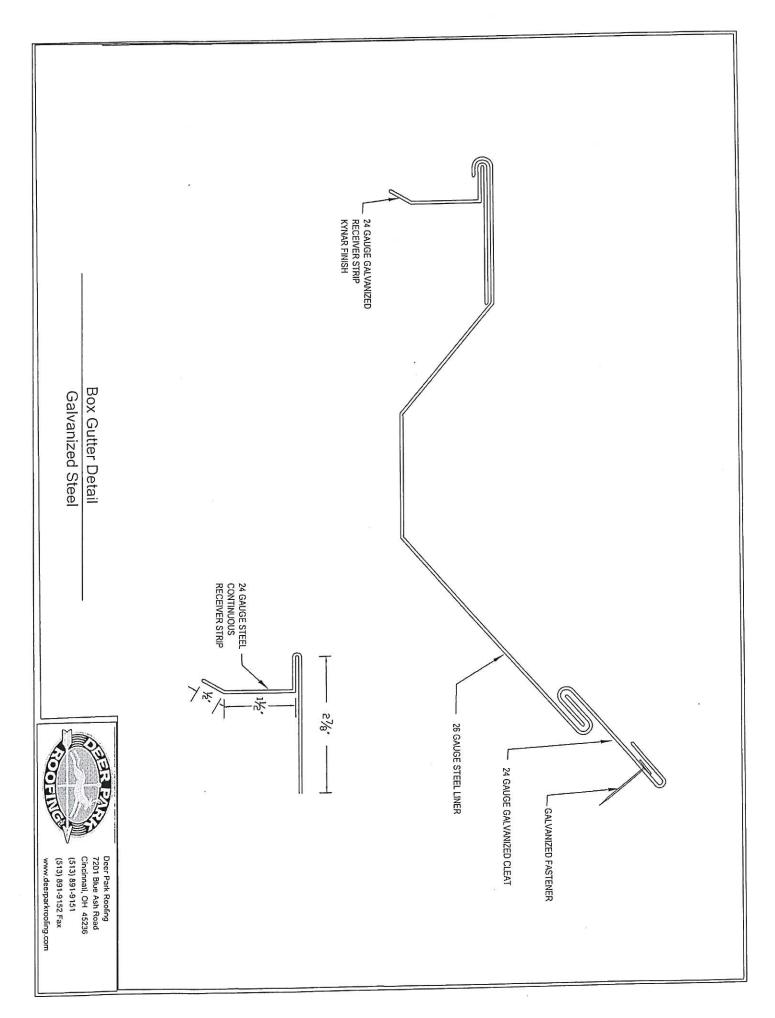

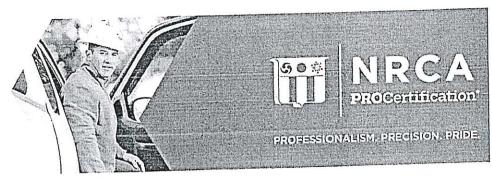

President Margolis called the meeting of the Trustees of the Community Improvement Corporation (CIC) to order at 6:45 p.m. at Montgomery City Hall.

Mr. Margolis stated that Trustee, Lynda Roesch was absent as noted at a previous meeting.

#### **New Business**

# Board Resolution approving a Development Agreement and Cooperative Agreement for the Montgomery Ouarter Project

Mr. Dobrozsi recused himself from the discussion of this Resolution as it relates to the Montgomery Quarter. He stated that although he has no ownership interest in Neyer Properties, Inc., nor any in the limited liability companies in partnership to develop the Montgomery Quarter, he will continue to recuse himself from discussion and abstain from voting upon legislation related to the Montgomery Quarter project.

Mr. Donnellon explained that this Resolution in a companion piece to the last Board Resolution for the Development Agreement. He stated that since passing of the Development Agreement and Assignment Agreement with Gateway Partners Montgomery, LLC, the financial model has changes to more clearly focus upon the amount of Special Revenue Bonds to be issued in support of the garage improvements in the project, as well as joining the Port of Greater Cincinnati Development Authority as a partner in construction, ownership and operation of the public garages.

Mr. Cappel moved to approve the Board Resolution as written and incorporated in the attached statement. Mrs. Bissmeyer seconded. The Trustees unanimously agreed.

#### **Historic Matching Grant Program**

Ms. Roblero explained that the program was discussed at the January 6, 2020 Planning, Zoning and Landmarks Committee at which time the Committee made a motion to support staff's recommendation to renew the program.

Ms. Roblero stated that in 2018, the CIC awarded a total of \$5,600 in grant monies to the property owners of the Sycamore Messenger Building, a contributing structure on Shelly Lane to replace vinyl siding with hardi-plank. She added that in 2019, the CIC once again reinstituted the Historic Preservation Matching Grant Program for the remainder of calendar year. In 2019, the CIC awarded one grant in the amount of \$2,106.44 for exterior storm windows on the Wooley Kelsch House.

Ms. Roblero stated that she felt that the program has been successful in the past and she has already received a request for this year if the program is approved to be extended. She explained that staff recommends extending the program with a cap of \$40,000 and a maximum of \$15,000 per property through 2021.

- Mr. Cappel asked if the money carries over from year to year.
- Ms. Smiddy replied the funds stay in the CIC account and follow the approved program amount.
- Mr. Suer explained the background of the program for the benefit of several boy scouts in the audience.
- Mr. Cappel moved to approve staff's recommendation to extend the Historic Matching Grant program through 2021 as detailed by Ms. Roblero. Mrs. Bissmeyer seconded. The Trustees unanimously agreed.
