Regulations on Fire Pits

The following regulations apply to all fire pits located on residential lots within the City of Montgomery:

- 1. A fire pit is defined as a below ground pit or a manufactured portable device intended to contain and control outdoor wood fires.
- 2. Fire pits shall be no larger than 16 square feet in size or 4 feet in diameter. Below ground fire pits shall be a minimum of 4 inches in depth and shall be surrounded on the outside, above ground, by a non-combustible material such as steel, brick or masonry. Manufactured portable fire pits shall be used in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.
- 3. Fire pits shall maintain a minimum setback of 25 feet from any structure or combustible material, unless in an approved container. Fires in an approved container shall maintain a 15 foot setback from any structure or combustible material.
- 4. Conditions which could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition.
- 5. Fire pits shall maintain a minimum setback of 10 feet from the side and rear property lines.
- 6. Fire pits are not permitted in the front yard of any residential lot.
- 7. Open burning, bonfires or recreational fires shall be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher complying with paragraph (F)(906) of rule 1301:7-7-09 of the Administrative Code with a minimum 4-A rating or other approved on-site fire-extinguishing equipment, such as dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose or water truck shall be available for immediate utilization.
- 8. The fire code official is authorized to order the extinguishment of open burning that creates or adds to a hazardous or objectionable situation.
- 9. Open burning that is offensive or objectionable because of smoke or odor emissions or when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires hazardous shall be prohibited.
