

- The library has sold \$25.00 in books with the ongoing book sale.
- The library has collected \$0.10 in library fines, overdue fees, and lost items.
- The monthly collection for copies and faxing was \$41.25.







AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MUNFORD, TENNESSEE ADOPTING THE 2018 EDITION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE

WHEREAS regulating and governing energy efficient building envelopes and installation of energy efficient mechanical, lighting and power systems in the City of Munford, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees; therefore, and

WHEREAS, repealing Ordinance No. 2016-02-06 of the City of Munford, Tennessee and all other ordinances or parts of laws in conflict therewith:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF MUNFORD, THAT:

Section 1. That a certain document, One (1) copy of which are on file in the office of the City Recorder of City of Munford, Tennessee, being marked and designated as the *International Energy Conservation Code*, 2018 edition, as published by the International Code Council, be and is hereby adopted as the Energy Conservation Code of the City of Munford in the State of Tennessee for regulating and governing energy efficient building envelopes and installation of energy efficient mechanical, lighting and power systems as herein provided; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said Energy Conservation Code on file in the office of the City Recorder are hereby referred to, adopted, and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this legislation, with the additions, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 2. The following sections are hereby revised:

Section 101.1. Insert: City of Munford

Section R402.4.1.2 Testing is deleted and replaced with Section 402.4.2.1 Testing Option and Section 402.4.2.2 Visual Inspection Option from 2009 IECC.

Section R403.3.3 Duct Testing (Mandatory) and Section R403.3.4 Duct Leakage (Prescriptive) are optional.

Table 402.1 .2 Insulation and Fenestration Requirements by Component and Table

R402.1.4 Equivalent U-Factors are deleted and replaced with Table 402.1.1 Insulation and Fenestration Requirements by Component and Table 402.1.3 Equivalent U-Factors 2009 IECC.

Section 3. That Ordinance No. 2016-02-06 of City of Munford, Tennessee referencing the 2012 International Codes and all other ordinances or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. That if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this legislation is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City of Munford, Board of Mayor and Alderman hereby declares that it would have passed this law, and each section, subsection, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

Section 5. That nothing in this legislation or in the Energy Conservation Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 3 of this ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired, or affected by this legislation.

Section 6. That the City Recorder is hereby ordered and directed to cause this legislation to be published.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, the welfare of the city requiring it.

Section 1. That a certain document, one (1) copy of which are on file in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Munford, Tennessee, being marked and designated as Regulations for *Swimming* Pool, Spa and Hot Tub Enclosures., is hereby adopted; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees; therefore, and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions, and terms of said Regulations for Swimming Pool, Spa and Hot tub enclosures on file in the office of the City Recorder are hereby referred to, adopted, and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this legislation, with the additions, prescribed in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 101.1. Swimming Pools, Spas and Hot tubs

Swimming pools spas and hot tubs shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, and in good repair.

Section 101.2 Enclosures

Private swimming pools, hot tubs, and spas, containing water more than 24 inches (610 mm) in depth shall be completely surrounded by a fence or barrier at least 48 inches (1219 mm) in height above the finished ground level measured on the side of the barrier away from the pool. Gates and doors in such barriers shall be self-closing and self-latching. Where the self-latching device is a minimum of 54 inches (1372 mm) above the bottom of the gate, the releasing mechanism shall be located on the pool side of the gate. Self-closing and self-latching gates shall be maintained such that the gate will positively close and latch when released

from an open position of 6 inches (152 mm) from the gate post. No existing pool enclosure shall be removed, replaced, or changed in a manner that reduces its effectiveness as a safety barrier.

Exceptions: Spas or hot tubs with a safety cover that complies with ASTM F 1346 shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

Section 3. That Ordinance No. 2018-08-05 of City of Munford, Tennessee referencing the 2012 International Residential Code, appendix G "Swimming Pools, Spas, and Hot Tubs" and all other ordinances or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

The regular monthly meeting of the Munford Municipal-Regional Planning Commission met on Tuesday, March 9, 2021 at 6:30 P.M. With the following:

PRESENT: Chairman Roy Meadors, Vice-Chairman Rick Wilson, Secretary Sue Arthur, John Moren, Mayor Dwayne Cole, David Keeton and Vernon Pairmore.

ABSENT: None

<u>ALSO, PRESENT:</u> Janice Bomar, Pinky Dike, Tony Terhune, Planner Will Radford, Code Enforcement / Building Inspector Glenn Stringfellow and Recording Secretary Barbara Younger.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM by Chairman Roy Meadors. There was a quorum present.

I. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – from February 9, 2021

There was a motion by Vernon Pairmore, seconded by Sue Arthur to approve the minutes from February 9, 2021 as presented, all present voting aye. Motion carried.

II. OLD BUSINESS - None

III. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

A. George Ellis Drive/Glenview Estates Annexation Request

Background

An annexation request has been submitted, by Anthony L. Terhune and Stephen D. Toarmina Trust, to be annexed into the City of Munford. The property can be further identified as Parcel 5.01 on Tipton County Tax Map 112. The property does not appear to be located in a federally identified flood hazard area.

Analysis

According to TCA 6-51-105, a City may annex residential property by resolution and only upon request from the property owner. The City is in possession of a statement from the owners of record requesting the annexation.

Staff has prepared a Resolution to adopt a Plan of Services, a Resolution to Annex, and an Ordinance to Establish Zoning. Staff will present all of the above-mentioned documents for review by the Planning Commission.

The request for zoning upon Annexation is for R-1 (Low Density Residential) District. Staff feels that the requested zone is compliant with the adjacent zoning and R-1 is the appropriate zone upon annexation. The property is currently zoned FAR (Forestry, Agricultural, Residential) District in the Munford Planning Region.

The Plan of Services will show that all City Services will be able to be provided immediately upon annexation with little or no cost to the City. Future Development will be required to install all public utilities in accordance with the Municipal Subdivision Regulations as development occurs.

Recommendation

Staff recommends in favor of zoning the property to R-1 should the City decided the annexation is beneficial to the city.

There was a motion by Rick Wilson, seconded by Mayor Dwayne Cole to send a positive recommendation to the Board of Mayor and Alderman to approve the George Ellis Drive/Glenview Estates Annexation Request. Motion carried, all present voting aye.

B. George Ellis Drive/Glenview Estates Plan of Services

A plan of services has been prepared for the review of the Planning Commission. This plan of service is required when annexation is requested.

There was a motion by David Keeton, seconded by John Moren to send a positive recommendation to the Board of Mayor and Alderman to approve the George Ellis Drive/Glenview Estates Annexation Plan of Service. Motion carried, all present voting aye

C. George Ellis Drive/Glenview Estates Zoning Request

A zoning request has been submitted by Anthony L. Terhune and Stephen D. Toarmina Trust that the property that is the northern 126.772 acre portion of Parcel 5.01 on Tipton County Tax Map 112 be zoned R-1 (Low Density Residential) District. This request will only be valid if the property annexation request is granted.

There was a motion by David Keeton, seconded by Sue Arthur to send a positive recommendation to the Board of Mayor and Alderman to approve the George Ellis Drive/Glenview Estates Zoning Request, upon approval of the Annexation, Changing the zoning from FAR (Forestry, Agricultural, Residential) District to R-1 (Low Density Residential) District. Motion carried, all present voting aye

D. Glenview Estates Preliminary Plat-Section D

Background

A preliminary subdivision plat has been submitted by Apex Homes to create 21 lots and new right of way including the extension of George Ellis Drive. The properties are located near George Ellis Drive in the newly requested annexation area of Munford's Planning Region. The property can be further identified as Parcel number 5.01 on Tipton County Tax Map #112. The area is zoned FAR (Forestry, Agriculture, Residential) District in the Munford Planning Region and is being developed as R-1 (Low Density Residential) District consistent with the proposed zoning of the annexation area. The property does not appear to be located in a federally identified flood hazard area according to FIRM #47167C0305F effective on 12/19/2006.

Analysis

The lots meet the lot area requirements of the R-1 district. Preliminary Approval shall be contingent upon the City Board of Mayor and Aldermen approving the annexation request and the annexation area becoming effective. Annexation becomes effective 30 days after the final reading of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen.

The building setback lines are not shown on the preliminary plat. Staff recommends the setback lines be added to the lots.

Sidewalks, Curb and Gutter are required for new major subdivisions within the City of Munford according to Munford's Municipal Subdivision Regulations:

The developer shall install, at their expense, sidewalks, curbs and gutters, curb cuts and driveway aprons and handicap ramps within the subdivision and within the right of way of all existing streets bordering the subdivision, under conditions specified herein.

Sidewalks shall be required to be installed by the developer on either or both sides of the street within the right of way of all new streets and may be required along any street if so desired by the Planning Commission when the Planning Commission deems it necessary for public safety.

Construction plans are to be required and submitted to the City Engineer after Preliminary Plat approval and must be approved prior to final plat approval.

The Munford Fire Department should approve the layout of the roads and determine if a temporary turnaround is needed at the end of the streets or if the "T" design of the roads will allow for adequate turnaround areas.

Recommendation

Staff recommends approval provided the above-mentioned issues are adequately addressed.

There was a motion by Sue Arthur, seconded by John Moren to approve the Glenview Estates Preliminary Plat as presented. Motion carried, all present voting aye.

E. Discussion of New Pavement Standards

Background/Analysis

The city engineer is requesting changes to the pavement requirements for new subdivisions to be changed in the Municipal Subdivision Regulations. The proposed language is included in the agenda packet for review by the Planning Commission. This language will be presented in the form of a resolution at the April Planning Commission meeting.
