### **MINUTES – May 24, 2021**

# Regular Monthly Meeting – Monday May 24, 2021, 7:00 p.m. Municipal Building, 70 College Street, Munford, Tennessee.

Members present: Mayor Dwayne Cole, Alderman Sue Arthur, Jack Bomar, Ray Deneka, Lonnie Glass, and Glenn Turner.

Absent: Alderman Deborah Reed

Department Heads in Attendance: Public Works Director Sherry Bennard, Chief Randal Baskin, Chief Alan Barkelew, and Code Enforcement Officer Glenn Stringfellow.

### I. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Cole called the May 24, 2021 meeting of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Munford to order at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Dwayne Cole gave the invocation.

### II. ESTABLISH A QUORUM

Mayor Cole noted the Board had a quorum with six members present and one absent.

Several residents of Wooten Oaks were present at the meeting in protest of Ordinance 2021-05-02. Stephen Pickett, Nida Lambert, and Steve Childress all spoke against the proposed zoning change requested by a developer with plans for a gas station. They cited lessened property values, increased drug use and crime, and the possibility of other less desirable businesses to a neighborhood "family" community opening if the zoning was changed to General Business. Mr. Childress stated all households in Wooten Oaks reject this idea and ask you to vote this down.

**May 2021 Library Report** 

### **Overview:**

- The library has sold \$43.00 in books with the ongoing book sale.
- The library has collected \$41.25 in library fines, overdue fees, and lost items.
- The monthly collection for copies and faxing was \$279.10.
- The Library had **123** people use our computers and **86** requiring computer help. In addition we had **190** use the Wi-Fi. The library had **600** reference questions asked and answered.
- Library staff provided 25 one-on-one technology device sessions lasting more than 10 minutes.
- Library staff served as proctors for **14** TWRA Boat Tests.
- The Library has gained **30** new users, with **1,616** materials checked out (including books, movies, audio, R.E.A.D.S circulation, etc.). We have a total of **4,235** patrons.

- ❖ We continue to offer curbside services to patrons. **7** patrons were assisted curbside.
- May 3, 2021 the library resumed its normal operating hours. There are still only 4 computers open at a time to provide proper space for safe social distancing.

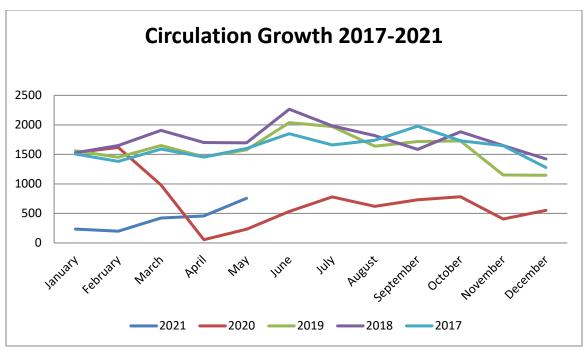

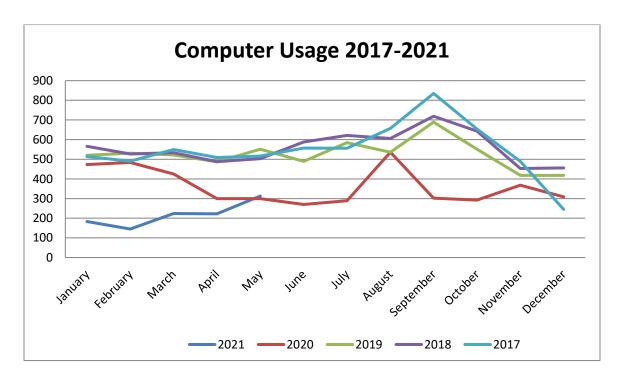

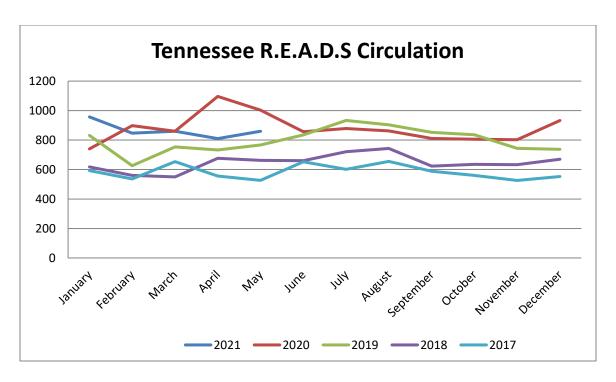

Mayor's Report June 28, 2021

Many have asked about the property located at 1256 Munford Avenue and the activity there. The City purchased this 2.7-acre parcel recently for the purpose of providing an additional entrance into the water plant, future expansion of water plant operations, and storage for natural gas operations. Demolition of the house and site prep are being done by local contractor Dozertrax USA of Drummonds, TN, who was the low bidder on this project. We are excited to add this acreage to our public works site.

We have been consulting with engineering firm Kimley-Horn on a Transportation Master Plan, focusing on Munford Avenue (SR206) and Tipton Road (SR178). This community mobility study includes traffic patterns, future projections, and recommendations for improvements on these routes. The study is necessary to be considered for grant funding and will be used as a guide for future grant applications. Funding is provided by a 95/5 grant from TDOT. We are now in the final stages, and I hope to be able to present this study for Board approval in August.

The full-depth reclamation, comprehensive repair and repaving of Park Street and the west end of Plum Tree Circle is now complete. These emergency repairs were necessary due to extensive damage caused by the arctic temperatures we experienced during the winter storm of February 2021. This was unexpected and unplanned but was imperative to maintain the integrity of our road system. The additional cost to perform these repairs is around \$345,000. As a reference, our usual annual paving budget is around \$225,000. We apologize for the dust, gravel and inconvenience to all residents affected.

Tonight, it is my honor to recognize Ms. Alice Green for her long-term volunteer service to our senior citizens at the Munford Senior Center. Ms. Alice has worked in various capacities by serving meals at the center as well as delivering meals to homebound seniors. In total, Ms. Alice has served approximately 50,000 meals. She has been a regular fixture at the senior center for 13 years and is now retiring and looking forward to spending more time with her family. I am pleased to present the "My Kind of Town Volunteer" award to Ms. Alice Green.

Celebrate Independence will be held on July 1 at Poplar Park. The fireworks extravaganza will begin around 8:55 PM and will be outstanding as always. This event draws thousands to our town and the show can be seen throughout South Tipton County. Food trucks will be located in Poplar Park and various other places for your convenience. Bring your lawn chairs to Poplar Park, located in downtown Munford, or gather anywhere around downtown for a great night of celebrating 245 years of American freedom! This event is the cooperative effort of Celebrate Munford and the City of Munford.

Finally, Congratulations to the 2021 Graduating Class of Munford High School. MHS graduated 300 seniors who received in excess of \$10.5M in scholarships and nine seniors have committed to serve our nation in the military. Among the graduating seniors are Macy Glass, daughter of Alderman Lonnie Glass, and Molly Hutton, my granddaughter. May God bless each one as they embark on their next great adventure!

### **ORDINANCE: 2021-05-01**

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MUNFORD, TENNESSEE ADOPTING THE 2018 EDITION OF THE INTERNATIONAL FUEL GAS CODE

**WHEREAS** regulating and governing fuel gas systems and gas-fired appliances in the City of Munford, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees; therefore, and

**WHEREAS,** repealing Ordinance No. 2016-02-07 of the City of Munford, Tennessee and all other ordinances or parts of laws in conflict therewith:

# NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF MUNFORD, THAT:

**Section 1.** That a certain document, one (1) copy of which are on file in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Munford, Tennessee , being marked and designated as the *International Fuel Gas Code*, 2018 edition, including Appendix Chapters (being none) (see *International Fuel Gas Code* Section 101.3, 2018 edition), as published by the International Code Council, be and is hereby adopted as the Fuel Gas Code of the City of Munford, in the State of Tennessee for regulating and governing fuel gas systems and gas-fired appliances as herein provided; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said Fuel Gas Code on file in the office of the City Recorder are hereby referred to, adopted, and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this ordinance, with the additions, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 2 of this ordinance.

**Section 2.** The following sections are hereby revised:

Section 101.1. Insert: City of Munford

**Section 106.6.2.** Insert: The fee schedule specified in Sections 106.6 and 106.6.2 shall be

as periodically set by the City of Munford Board of Mayor and Alderman.

Section 108.4. Insert: "Misdemeanor" a maximum of "fifty dollars" (\$50.00) shall be

specified; all references to imprisonment are deleted.

**Section 3.** That Ordinance No. 2016-02-07 of City of Munford, Tennessee referencing the 2018 International Codes and all other ordinances or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**Section 4.** That if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this legislation is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City of Munford, Board of Mayor and Alderman hereby declares that it would have passed this law, and each section, subsection, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

**Section 5.** That nothing in this ordinance or in the Fuel Gas Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 3 of this ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired, or affected by this ordinance.

**Section 6.** That the City Recorder is hereby ordered and directed to cause this legislation to be published.

**Section 7**. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, the welfare of the city requiring it.

### **RESOLUTION 2021-06-01**

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A PLAN OF SERVICE FOR AREA TO BE ANNEXED INTO THE CITY OF MUNFORD, TENNESSEE: PROPERTY LOCATED ON AT THE INTERSECTION OF MCCORMICK ROAD AND CAMPGROUND ROAD (OWNED BY REI CAPITAL LLC)

- WHEREAS, *Tennessee Code Annotated* 6-51-102 requires that a plan of service be adopted by the governing body of a city prior to annexing an area; and,
- WHEREAS, the Munford Municipal-Regional Planning Commission has recommended that the following Plan of Service for the annexation of an area located on McCormick Drive (Owned By REI Capital, LLC).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF MUNFORD, TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 6-51-102, there is hereby adopted for the proposed annexation area the following Plan of Service:

### A. Police

- (1) Patrolling, radio responses to calls, and other routine police service, using present personnel and equipment, will be provided on the effective date of annexation.
- (2) No additional personnel or equipment will be added during the first year after the effective date of annexation, but as the area develops, additional personnel and equipment may be expanded as needed.
- (3) Traffic signals, traffic signs, street markings, and other traffic control devices will be installed as the need therefore is established by appropriate study and traffic standards.

### B. Fire

(1) Fire protection by the present personnel and the equipment of the fire fighting force, within the limitations of available water and distances from fire

stations, will be provided on the effective date of annexation.

(2) No additional personnel or equipment will be added during the first year after effective date of annexation, but with the growth and development of the area additional personnel and equipment may be expanded as needed.

### C. Water

Potable water will be supplied by Poplar Grove Utility District according to rates and fees approved by the District's Board of Commissioners. Poplar Grove Utility District makes no guarantee of any specific water volumes, flows or pressures to the property. Whether to the District's existing water distribution system or to water system improvements on the property, all such improvements deemed necessary by the District to provide water service to the property shall be the sole responsibility of the owner(s) and/or developer(s) according to the District's Rules and Regulations, Subdivision Policy and Developer's Contract.

### D. Sewer

The installation of a sanitary sewer system for future development will be the responsibility of the developers. The property lies within the sewer service area of Poplar Grove Utility District.

### E. Natural Gas

The necessary natural gas lines will be installed on undeveloped property by developers as development occurs according to current city policies. Gas is currently available to existing property owners.

### F. Refuse Collection

The same regular refuse collection services now provided within the city will be extended to the annexed areas after 30 days of the effective date of annexation.

### G. Streets

There are currently no streets within the Annexation area. After the new streets are inspected and accepted into the City street system by the Board of Mayor and Alderman. The City will provide the following services to new streets constructed in the annexed area:

- (1) Emergency maintenance of streets. (repair of hazardous chuck holes, measures necessary for traffic flow, etc.)
- (2) Routine maintenance, on the same basis as in the present city.
- (3) Reconstruction and resurfacing of streets, installation of storm drainage facilities, construction of curbs and gutters, and other such major improvements, as need therefore is determined by the governing body, will be accomplished under current policies of the city.

### H. Inspection Services

Inspection services are currently provided by the city. Code Enforcement will begin in the annexed areas on the effective date of annexation.

### I. Planning and Zoning

The planning and zoning jurisdiction of the city will extend to the annexed areas on the effective date of annexation. City planning will thereafter encompass the annexed areas. The area will be zoned R-1 (Low Density Residential) District

### J. <u>Street Lighting</u>

Street lights will be installed by developers as development occurs in accordance with standards currently prevailing in the existing city policies.

### K. Recreation

Residents of the annexed areas may use all existing recreational facilities, parks, etc. on the effective date of

annexation. The same standards and policies now used in the present city will be followed in expanding the recreational program and facilities in the enlarged city.
