- 1. <u>OHIO'S DRAINAGE LAWS, HB 340</u>: To revise the state's drainage laws. EFFECTIVE DATE: March 24, 2021
- 2. <u>FIREFIGHTING FOAM FOR TESTING/TRAINING, HB 158</u>: To prohibit the use of Class B firefighting foam containing intentionally added PFAS chemicals for testing and training purposes.
- 3. <u>EPHEMERAL WATER FEATURES</u>, HB 175: To deregulate certain ephemeral water features under various water pollution control laws.
- 4. <u>EPA TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE BROWNFIELD LOCATIONS</u>, <u>SB 83</u>: To require the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency to conduct a study to determine where brownfield sites are located in this state and to make an appropriation.
