Talk abstract: Large springs in north-central Ohio such as Castalia Blue Hole discharge copious amounts of highly mineralized water to surface streams. This supports several private and state-owned fish hatcheries, and is a beautiful aspect of the landscape. But, could these waters be contributing to harmful algal blooms (HABs) in Lake Erie? The area is also within and adjacent to the Bellevue-Castalia Karst Plain, which has suffered severe water quality impacts from sewage disposal in the past. The talk will share recent findings from geochemical studies, as well as a surprising link to Ohio's glacial past.
