SUBJECT: Consideration of an Amendment to the Clean Water Plan for the Wayne County

Lincoln Way Facilities Planning Area (FPA) and the Orrville FPA to modify the FPA boundary and update the wastewater treatment prescriptions to enable the Wayne County Office of Environmental Services to provide sewer service to select unsewered parcels on the west side of Wadsworth Road (State Route 57),

just north of U.S. Route 30

What's being requested:

The Wayne County Office of Environmental Services (WCOES) is requesting an amendment to the Clean Water Plan for the Wayne County Lincoln Way Facilities Planning Area (FPA) Appendix 3-54, by adding to the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA twelve parcels, which are currently in the Orrville FPA Appendix 3-46 (see attached list of affected parcels and Figure 1). Nine of these twelve parcels are already entirely in orange: "Areas Expected to be Served with Sanitary Sewers within the next 20 years" in the existing Orrville FPA (see list below and Figure 2) and will remain orange in the proposed Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA (Figure 3). Portions of Parcel 26-00033.000, which is mostly in cream: "Areas that will be Served by Home Sewage and Semi-Public Sewage Disposal Systems" in the existing Orrville FPA will be orange in the proposed Wayne County Lincoln Way FPAs. Small portions of Parcels 26-00011.001 and 26-00011.002 in the existing Orrville FPA, will change from "cream" to "orange" in the proposed Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA. Three additional parcels that are currently split by the existing FPA boundary would be added to the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA, and portions of those three parcels would change from "cream" to "orange" (see list below and Figures 2 and 3). The amendment would affect a total of fifteen parcels, by placing them entirely within the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA, all with an "orange" wastewater treatment prescription (Figure 3).

Background (adapted from information provided by the Wayne County Office of Environmental Services):

The owner of Parcels 26-00029.000 and 26-00029.001 on the west side of Wadsworth Road (State Route 57) requested sewer service from WCOES. These parcels are currently in the Orrville FPA, but the nearest existing sanitary sewer is tributary to the Riceland Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) in the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA. The Riceland WWTP has capacity to accept the additional flow. Since a 208 Plan amendment would be needed to extend the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA boundary north along the west side of Wadsworth Road into the Orrville FPA, WCOES investigated how far north the line should be extended based on the condition of the existing septic systems along the west side of State Route 57 and the topography in that area. Also, the north boundary line extending to Kansas Road would be extended north, to the north property line of Parcels 26-00013.000 and 26-00033.000 to include the location of the existing mobile home park WWTP (for a future lift station) and to include the parcel on which the existing WCOES sanitary sewer force main for the Riceland Golf Course is located. These factors determined the extent of the proposed FPA boundary that is shown on Figure 3. The proposed FPA boundary was discussed with and found to be acceptable to the City of Orrville.

Facilities Planning Area (FPA) boundary change:

The proposed change to the Facilities Planning Areas (FPA) would involve the extension of the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA boundary north into the Orrville FPA along the west side of State Route 57. The FPA Boundary would then extend west along the northern property boundary lines for parcels 26-00013.000 and 26-00033.000. The boundary would travel south along the western boundary line for parcel 26-00033.000, and then west along the northern boundary line for parcel 26-00120.000 (the majority of which is already located within the Lincoln Way FPA) until reaching Kansas Road.

Wastewater prescription change:





Figure 2 - Clean Water Plan Amendment Wayne County Lincoln Way Facilities Planning Area (FPA)

Portions of Parcel 26-00033.000, which is mostly in cream: "Areas that will be Served by Home Sewage and Semi-Public Sewage Disposal Systems" in the existing Orrville FPA will be "orange" in the proposed FPA. Small "cream" portions of Parcels 26-00011.001 and 26-00011.002 in the existing Orrville FPA, will be "orange" in the proposed Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA. Three additional parcels that are currently split by the existing FPA boundary would be added to the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA, and portions of those three parcels would change from "cream" to "orange" (see list below and Figures 2 and 3).

Local governments/agencies affected (sample request-for-comments email attached): The City of Orrville, East Union Township, Wayne County Health Department, Wayne County Planning Department, Wayne Soil and Water Conservation District, Wayne County Office of Environmental Services, Ohio Department of Transportation - District 3. The attached responses from all seven of these affected local government entities indicate that they either have "no concern" with the requested amendment or that it "appears to be consistent with local plans".

Public notification efforts:

The public notice was published in the Wooster Daily Record on January 24, 2022 (attached). No comments or inquiries were received by the Wayne County Office of Environmental Services during the 15-day required comment period or to date.

Specific proposed changes to the current FPA Appendix in the Clean Water Plan: Changes only pertain to the FPA map on Page 3-54-2 of Appendix 3-54 (attached).

Staff recommendation:

At the ERTAC meeting on May 4, 2022, staff recommended approval of the amendment.

Environmental Resources Technical Advisory Committee (ERTAC) Recommendation to the NEFCO General Policy Board:

The ERTAC unanimously recommended approval of the amendment.

Memo Revision:

After this Board item was sent to members on May 11, 2022 as part of the board mailout, the third WHEREAS on page 2 of Resolution FY2022-012 (of item #4) was revised for clarity as shown in italics. The original WHEREAS from the transmitted resolution is shown with strikeouts. This revision will have no effect on the requested action.

WHEREAS, NEFCO is the designated water quality management planning agency for Portage, Stark, Summit and Wayne Counties; and

WHEREAS, as part of that designation it is NEFCO's responsibility to coordinate the use, amendments to, and updates of its Clean Water Plan, also known as the 208 Plan; and

WHEREAS, NEFCO has been requested by the Wayne County Office of Environmental Services (WCOES) to consider an amendment to the Clean Water Plan for the Wayne County Lincoln Way Facilities Planning Area (FPA) and the Orrville FPA to modify the FPA boundary and update the wastewater treatment prescriptions to enable WCOES to provide sewer service to select unsewered parcels on the west side of Wadsworth Road (State Route 57), just north of U.S. Route 30; and

WHEREAS, the owner of Parcels 26-00029.000 and 26-00029.001, which are in the existing Orrville Facilities Planning Area and on the west side of Wadsworth Road (State Route 57), has requested sewer service from the Wayne County Office of Environmental Services; and

WHEREAS, the amendment shifts twelve specific parcels from the Orrville Facilities Planning Area (FPA) and adds them to the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA; and

WHEREAS, nine of the twelve specific parcels being shifted from the Orrville Facilities Planning Area (FPA) and added to the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA are already entirely in "Areas Expected to be Served with Sanitary Sewers within the next 20 Years" (orange) in the existing Orrville FPA, will keep that wastewater prescription in the proposed FPA; and

WHEREAS, three of the twelve specific parcels being shifted from the Orrville Facilities Planning Area (FPA) and added to the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA that are partially in "Areas that will be Served by Home Sewage and Semi-Public Sewage Disposal Systems" (cream) in the existing Orrville FPA, will be "Areas Expected to be Served with Sanitary Sewers within the next 20 Years" (orange); in the proposed FPA; and

WHEREAS, three additional parcels (26-00120.005, 26-00120.000, 26-00087.000) that are currently split by the existing Facilities Planning Area (FPA) boundary will be added to the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA, and portions of those three parcels will change from "Areas that will be Served by Home Sewage and Semi-Public Sewage Disposal Systems" (cream) to "Areas Expected to be Served with Sanitary Sewers within the next 20 Years" (orange); and

WHEREAS, in summary, a total of fifteen parcels will be affected by the amendment by placing them entirely within the Wayne County Lincoln Way Facilities Planning Area, all with the wastewater treatment prescription "Areas Expected to be Served with Sanitary Sewers within the next 20 Years" (orange); and

WHEREAS, the affected local, county, and state governments and all affected agencies have been contacted regarding the proposed amendment and none have objected to it; and

WHEREAS, a legal advertisement that described the proposed amendment and sought comments on it, yielded no comments or questions during the public comment period; and

WHEREAS, this amendment only changes the map and not the text from the current Clean Water Plan Appendix 3-54 Wayne County Lincoln Way Facilities Planning Area (FPA); and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) has requested NEFCO's approval of this amendment as a step in its permitting process; and

WHEREAS, the NEFCO Environmental Resources Technical Advisory Committee (ERTAC) performed a technical review of this request and recommended approval of the amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the NEFCO General Policy Board approves this amendment to the Clean Water Plan for the Wayne County Lincoln Way Facilities Planning Area (FPA) and the Orrville FPA to modify the FPA boundary and update the wastewater treatment prescriptions to enable the Wayne County Office of Environmental Services (WCOES) to provide sewer service to select unsewered parcels on the west side of Wadsworth Road (State Route 57), just north of U.S. Route 30. Furthermore, the Board directs staff to incorporate this amendment into NEFCO's Clean Water Plan and to transmit pertinent amendment materials to WCOES, the City of Orrville, East Union Township, Wayne County Health Department, Wayne County Planning Department, Wayne Soil and Water Conservation District, Ohio Department of Transportation – District 3, and Ohio EPA.

Amendment Location



The Wayne County Office of Environmental Services is requesting an amendment to the NEFCO Clean Water Plan for the Wayne County Lincoln Way Facilities (FPA) Planning Area Appendix 3-54, by adding to the Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA Parcels 26-00006.000, 26-00028.000, 26-00011.001, 26-00011.002, 26-26-00029.001, 26-00029.000, 00078.000, 26-00003.000, 26-00077.000, 26-00079.000, 26-00013.000, and 26-00033.000, which were previously in the Orrville FPA Appendix 3-46. Parcels 26-00006.000, 26-00028.000, 26-00011.001, 26-00011.002, 26-00029.000, 00029.001, 26-00078.000, 26-00003.000, 26-00077.000, 26-00079.000, 26-00013.000 which already orange in "Areas Expected to Served with Sanitary Sewers within the next 20 years" in the Orrville FPA will remain orange in the FPA proposed boundary change. Portions of Parcel 26-00033.000, which mostly in cream "Areas that will be Served by Home Sewage and Semi-Public Sewage Disposal Systems" in the existing Orrville FPA will be orange the proposed Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA. Small portions of Parcels 26-00011.001 and 26-00011.002 Orrville in the existing FPA, will change from cream to orange in the proposed Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA. Additionally, upon approval of amendment by the NEFCO Board, Parcels 26-00120.005, 26-00120.000, and 26-00087.000, which currently divided by the **FPA** existing boundary, would be added to Wayne County Lincoln Way FPA, and portions of these three parcels would change from cream to orange. 

II. Wastewater Treatment Planning Prescription and Wastewater Planning Options

Original source information provided by the Wayne County Office of Environmental Services, September 24, 2003. Prescriptions modified by the Wayne County 201 Committee in November/December 2017 and January 2018.

Wayne County Office of Environmental Services Jurisdiction

Areas Currently Served with Sanitary Sewers (yellow):

These areas are identified in the Wayne County Comprehensive Plan as Growth Areas. A common policy of these areas is that public water and sanitary sewer service shall be required and sewage treatment systems (STS) and/or semi-public systems should be prohibited. These areas are currently served with sanitary sewers. Development within these areas shall be subject to the following:

1. New Development:

a. New development in this area shall be required to connect and/or provide necessary sanitary sewer infrastructure to connect to the existing sanitary sewer system to ensure that wastewater will be treated at a County or Municipality-owned Wastewater Treatment Plant. The cost to connect and/or furnish and install the necessary sanitary sewer infrastructure to connect to the existing sanitary sewer shall be borne by the developer.

2. Existing (developed) Properties:

a. Existing sewage treatment systems shall be abandoned and required to connect to the existing sanitary sewer system to ensure that wastewater will be treated at a County or Municipality-owned Wastewater Treatment Plant when sanitary sewer becomes available and accessible, as determined by the Ohio EPA and/or the Wayne County Board of Health. The cost to connect to the existing sanitary sewer shall be borne by the property owner.

3. Existing (developed) Properties (not required to tie into the sanitary sewer when the system was initially constructed):

a. Failing or illegal sewage treatment systems shall be abandoned and required to connect to the existing sanitary sewer system when sanitary sewer becomes available and accessible as determined by the Ohio EPA and/or the Wayne County Board of Health. The cost to connect to the existing sanitary sewer shall be borne by the property owner.

Areas Expected to be Served with Sanitary Sewers within the next 20 Years (orange):

These areas are identified in the Wayne County Comprehensive Plan as the Future Expansion and Transitional Areas. The infrastructure policy in these areas is that public water and sanitary sewer service is preferred where logical extensions are recommended by the appropriate utility facilities plan, however, private water and sewage treatment systems are expected (with County Health Department and Ohio EPA approvals). Centralized Spray Irrigation is prohibited as a wastewater treatment option in these areas. Development within these areas shall be subject to the following:

1. New Development:

- a. <u>Major Subdivisions</u>, as defined by the Wayne County Planning Subdivision Regulations, shall be required to connect to the existing sanitary sewer system, fully observing all regulations of governing agencies. The cost to connect and/or furnish and install the necessary sanitary sewer infrastructure to connect to the existing sanitary sewer shall be borne by the developer.
- b. <u>Minor Subdivisions</u> and metes and bounds lots for single-family and multi-family (three units or less) development, where existing sanitary sewer is not available and accessible, may be developed, as determined on a case-by-case basis by the Board of County Commissioners for using Sewage Treatment Systems (STS's), in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 3701-29.
- c. Multi-Family (four units or more), Commercial, and Industrial Development shall be classified as either low density/low flow or high density/high flow, as determined by the Ohio EPA. High density/high flow development shall be required to connect to the existing sanitary sewer system, fully observing all regulations of governing agencies. The cost to connect and/or provide the necessary sanitary sewer infrastructure to connect to the existing sanitary sewer shall be borne by the developer. Low density/low flow development may occur using non-discharging Semi-Public Sewage Disposal Systems (SPSDS), in accordance with Ohio EPA requirements.

2. Existing (developed) Properties:

a. Existing sewage treatment systems shall be abandoned and required to connect to the existing sanitary sewer system as sanitary sewer as it becomes available and accessible, as determined by the Ohio EPA and the Wayne County Board of Health. The cost to connect to the existing sanitary sewer shall be borne by the property owner.

3. Existing (developed) Properties (not required to tie into the sanitary sewer when the system was initially constructed):

a. Failing or illegal sewage treatment systems may be replaced and/or upgraded as necessary until such time as the sanitary sewer is available and accessible, as determined by the Ohio EPA and/or the Wayne County Board of Health, at which time the existing system shall be abandoned and the property owner shall be required

to connect to the existing sanitary sewer system. The cost to connect to the existing sanitary sewer shall be borne by the property owner.

Areas expected to remain on be served by private household sewage treatment systems or semi-public systems, and where local officials are oriented to maintaining an unsewered status for the foreseeable future (cream):

These areas are identified in the Wayne County Comprehensive Plan as the Conservation Areas. The infrastructure policy in the Conservation Areas is that private water and sewage treatment systems are expected (with County Health Department and Ohio EPA approvals) with alternative wastewater technologies supported where meeting current health standards and practices. The extension of central sewers to these areas is prohibited. Centralized Spray Irrigation is prohibited as a wastewater treatment option in these areas. Development within these areas shall be subject to the following:

1. New Development:

a. These are rural areas with large undeveloped tracts of land. These are areas in which new development is expected to be large-lot, low density with STS's per OAC 3701-29 and SPSDS's as approved by the Ohio EPA. The primary method of treatment of wastewater is an on-site system.

2. Existing (developed) Properties:

- a. Existing STS's and SPSDS's which fail to operate or are illegal may be replace and/or upgraded, as necessary.
- b. A proposed expansion of an existing Multi-family (four units or more), Commercial, and Industrial development that will result in an increase in discharge loadings of the facility's NPDES Permit may be considered provided the receiving stream has adequate assimilative capacity, as determined by the Ohio EPA.

If the receiving stream of the discharge does <u>not</u> have adequate assimilative capacity for the resulting increase in discharge loadings from the proposed expansion, utilization of alternative wastewater technologies resulting in a "no net gain" of discharge loadings may be considered, as determined by the Ohio EPA.
