2024 Park Survey

DESCRIPTION:

Receive, consider, and discuss the 2024 park survey for park projects to consider in a Park and Open Space Master Plan.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Parks, trails, and recreation amenities are an essential part of a city and important to everyday community life. They provide an opportunity and place for gathering relaxation, exercise, and play. Such amenities promote the health of residents, provide social and educational activities for all ages, and help preserve and enhance the natural environment. A quality parks, trails and recreation system that responds to the needs and values of residents contributes to the community's livability while also attracting visitors to the area and supporting local economic development.

The New Fairview Parks and Recreation Board tasked city staff to create a Citizen Survey instrument to seek input from citizens to determine the community's current and future needs for improving our parks, trails, and open spaces, and to provide for adequate areas and facilities to meet both the short- and long-term needs of the community. The input received from this will be used in the creation of a Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Master Plan. Once adopted, the Plan will serve as a guide for city staff, the Parks and Recreation Board, and the City Council in their efforts to enhance the community.

The 2024 Park Survey consists of twelve (12) questions, of which some include photos of the park feature or amenity to help the survey taker understand what is being asked. On February 2, the survey was placed on the city website and was pushed out on the City's Facebook page. The survey was initially going to be closed on March 1, but was kept open until March 29 due to lack of surveys submitted. City Council and Parks Board members also successfully promoted the park survey at the 2024 Easter Egg Hunt. There were ninety-one (91) surveys submitted in total, and attached are the results of the survey.





How often do you, or your family, visit our City Park at 150 Stewart Street?








If we received the funds to build a court on the remaining acreage at our city park, which ONE (1) of the following would you like to see us build?










If we received the funds to add some motion features on the remaining acreage at our city park, which TWO (2) of the following would you like to see us add?

















Park and Open Space Master Plan

DESCRIPTION:

Receive, consider, and discuss a Park and Open Space Master Plan.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Parks, trails, and recreation amenities are an essential part of a city and important to everyday community life. They provide an opportunity and place for gathering relaxation, exercise, and play. Such amenities promote the health of residents, provide social and educational activities for all ages, and help preserve and enhance the natural environment. A quality parks, trails and recreation system that responds to the needs and values of residents contributes to the community's livability while also attracting visitors to the area and supporting local economic development.

The New Fairview Parks and Recreation Board recently conducted a 2024 Park Survey to solicit input from citizens on the community's current and future needs for improving our parks, trails, and open spaces, and to provide for adequate areas and facilities to meet both the short- and long-term needs of the community. The input received can be used in the creation of a Parks and Open Space Master Plan. A Parks and Open Space Master Plan provides a framework for the creation and adaptation of parks and green spaces in order to provide necessary amenities for the future. It is intended to be a guide for the residents of the City as well as for the City Council and staff.

The types of Master Plan are typically for a ten (10) year timeframe and some goals that can be included in this type of Master Plan are:

- 1. Preserve and maintain a viable and balanced open space network
- Provide leisure opportunities for all ages and meet the recreational needs of the city's growing population
- 3. Expand recreational opportunities in floodplains
- 4. Build and enhance community partnerships

- 5. Preserve and enhance the City's open space, and natural, historical, and cultural resources
- 6. Improve and ensure park safety and security
- 7. Continue to maintain all park and recreational facilities in a superior and sustainable condition
- 8. Ensure that park and open space needs of the City are met currently as well as in the future

A Parks and Open Space Master Plan also assists when applying for funding for various components within the plan, including Texas Parks and Wildlife Department grants. It also need to be aligned with the City's Strategic Plan and Comprehensive Plan.
