Agenda Description:

Accept the May 2021 Financial Report.

Background Information:

The annual revenues are currently at \$1,313,596 of the budgeted \$1,079,708 which is approximately 121.6% of anticipated revenues with 30% of the fiscal year still ahead. This is largely due to the \$224,000 in excess revenues, over budget, from building permits.

The annual expenditures are currently at \$446,955 of the budgeted \$937,451 which is approximately 47.7% of the budgeted expenditures with approximately 70% of the year already completed. We anticipate that these numbers will increase substantially in the upcoming months as we received the new equipment purchases, executed the agreement for the new website, distributed the citizen satisfaction survey, are beginning the groundwork for establishing the Municipal Development District, and have started the transportation impact fee study which are still largely outstanding.

Background Information:

Over the last several council meetings, the City Council and staff started the budget discussion at a fairly high-level, not focusing on dollars but the issues that the City is facing and started to discuss the prioritization of the issues. In the June 7, 2021 meeting staff presented estimates on the costs to fund the streets throughout the community, not including many of the private roads that were previously thought to be city owned and maintained. Staff presented the engineer's estimate on the right-sizing cost for the water and wastewater systems that would need to be developed in partnership with the Constellation Lake and Shoop Ranch developments. Further, staff discussed what the budget would potentially reflect if they decide to move forward with a budget that keeps service levels the same.

Agenda Description:

Discuss, consider, and act on a resolution of the City of New Fairview, Texas, awarding the streets improvement project to Jagoe-Public Construction, including alternative A, C, D, E, F, G, and H; establish a not-to-exceed project contingency of \$632,000; approve the transfer and expenditure of \$300,000 of General Fund Balance to the Capital Improvement project; and authorize the City Administrator to enter into interlocal agreements with Wise County for the improvement of Wilson and Aydelotte Courts, as well as CR 4717.

Background Information:

Council and staff have been working on a long-term solution for the streets improvement in New Fairview for over 12 months. The financial audits were completed for the last five-years, policies and procedures put in place to ensure conservative fiscal practices, and New Fairview issued its first bonds for approximately \$3 million. The bids came in as follows:

In consultation with our city engineers, Pacheco Koch, and Wise County, staff has developed an alternative path forward that may provide the funding necessary to complete the initial project. This will require many things to work in our favor, including obtaining the \$350,000 Community Development Block (CDBG) Grant; and appropriate funding of approximately \$300,000 of the General Fund Balance; and enter into an interlocal agreement with Wise County for Wilson and Aydelotte Court as well as adding funding for CR 4717; and we do not experience significant unknowns consuming all contingency fees.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF NEW FAIRVIEW, TX AWARDING THE STREETS IMPROVEMENT PROJECT TO JAEGO-PUBLIC CO. AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR ALTERNATIVES A, C, D, E, F, G, H, AND ESTABLISHING A NOT TO EXCEED CONTINGENCY FOR THE PROJECT OF \$632,000.

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview is an incorporated city in the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City of New Fairview is a General Law city as classified by the Texas Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the City of New Fairview engaged Pacheco Koch to bid out the streets improvement project; and

WHEREAS, the City of New Fairview received bids from several contractors that are both qualified and able to complete the project; and

WHEREAS, the staff and engineers have reviewed their references and work in other cities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds this to be in the best interest of the citizens of New Fairview.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY NEW FAIRVIEW:


- 1. That, all matters stated in the recitals herein above are found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference as if copied in their entirety.
- 2. That the City Council does hereby award the streets improvement project as bid in alternatives A, C, D, E, F, G, H to Jaego-Public Co and authorizes the City Administrator

to enter into an agreement for the completion of work.

- 3. That the City Council authorizes the City Administrator to enter into an interlocal agreement with Wise County for the improvement of CR 4717 with a not-to-exceed cost of \$100,000.
- 4. That the City Council establishes a not-to-exceed project contingency of \$632,000.
- 5. That the City Council approves the transfer of \$300,000 of the General Fund Balance to the Capital Improvements Fund for the streets improvement project.
- 6. That, if any portion of this resolution shall, for any reason, be declared invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions hereof and the Council hereby determined that it would have adopted this Resolution without the invalid provision.
- 7. That this Resolution shall become effective from and after its date of passage.
