Septic System Requirements

DESCRIPTION:

Receive and consider possible amendment to Ordinance 2010-04-152 governing on-site sewage facilities.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

An On-Site Sewage Facility (OSSF), also known as a private septic tank system, stores, treats, and disposes of wastewater generated on the site where the OSSF is located.

The state of Texas regulates OSSFs by setting minimum standards, and local authorities must have equivalent or more stringent rules that are approved by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). State-level regulations on OSSFs can be found in the Texas Administrative Code, Title 30, Chapter 285.

The current City of New Fairview order to regulate OSSF's was approved by Ordinance (2010-04-152) on May 18, 2010. The City adopted more stringent Rules for OSSF by requiring a permit for all OSSF installations in the city limits. Also, requiring a maintenance contract for all aerobic and advanced treatment OSSF's.

Maintenance

Proper OSSF maintenance usually involves septic tank pumping every three to five years and inspections at least every three years by a septic service professional. However, depending on the type of OSSF, maintenance contracts and regular, more frequent inspections may be required. For example, all aerobic OSSF systems require a maintenance contract and must be inspected by a maintenance provider three times per year.

Maintenance also includes monitoring what goes down your drains. Using water efficiently and reducing the amount of fats, oils, and grease that go into your septic tank can improve the operation of your system and reduce the risk of failure. You can learn more about OSSF

Regular maintenance of OSSFs keeps them in working order and reduces the probability of system malfunction. Septic system failure could result in the discharge of effluent into the storm sewer system and local waterways. Such pollution can impair water quality, having harmful effects on the environment and human health.

This item was requested by council.

ORDINANCE ADOPTING RULES OF THE CITY OF NEW FAIRVIEW, TEXAS FOR ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITIES PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has established Rules for on-site sewage facilities to provide the citizens of this State with adequate public health protection and a minimum of environmental pollution; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has enacted legislation, codified as Texas Health and Safety Code (THSC), Chapter 366, which authorizes a local government to regulate the use of on-site sewage facilities in its jurisdiction in order to abate or prevent pollution or injury to public health arising out of the use of on-site sewage facilities; and

WHEREAS, due notice was given of a public meeting to determine whether the City Council of the City of New Fairview, Texas should enact an ordinance controlling or prohibiting the installation or use of on-site sewage facilities in the City of New Fairview, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of New Fairview, Texas finds that the use of on-site sewage facilities in the City of New Fairview, Texas is causing or may cause pollution, and is injuring or may injure the public health; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of New Fairview, Texas has considered the matter and deems it appropriate to enact an Ordinance adopting Rules regulating on-site sewage facilities to abate or prevent pollution, or injury to public health in the City of New Fairview, Texas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW FAIRVIEW, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. THAT the matters and facts recited in the preamble hereof are hereby found and determined to be true and correct;

SECTION 2. THAT the use of on-site sewage facilities in the City of New Fairview, Texas is causing or may cause pollution or is injuring or may injure the public health;

SECTION 3. THAT an Ordinance for the City of New Fairview, Texas be adopted entitled "On-Site Sewage Facilities", which shall read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITIES

SECTION 4. CONFLICTS.

This Ordinance repeals and replaces any other On-site Sewage Facility (OSSF) Ordinance for the City of New Fairview, Texas.

SECTION 5. CHAPTER 366.

The City of New Fairview, Texas clearly understands that there are technical criteria, legal requirements, and administrative procedures and duties associated with regulating on-site sewage facilities, and will fully enforce Chapter 366 of the THSC and Chapters 7 and 37 of the Texas Water Code (TWC), and associated rules referenced in Section 8 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. AREA OF JURISDICTION.

The Rules shall apply to all the area lying within the incorporated limits of the City of New Fairview, Texas.

SECTION 7. ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITY RULES.

Any permit issued for an on-site sewage facility within the jurisdictional area of the City of New Fairview, Texas must comply with the Rules adopted in Section 8 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITY RULES ADOPTED.

The Rules, Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 30, Subchapters A and G, and Chapter 285, promulgated by the TCEQ for on-site sewage facilities are hereby adopted, and all officials and employees of the City of New Fairview, Texas having duties under said Rules are authorized to perform such duties as are required of them under said Rules.

SECTION 9. INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE.

The Rules, 30 TAC Chapter 30, Subchapters A and G, and Chapter 285 and all future amendments and revisions thereto are incorporated by reference and are thus made a part of these Rules.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENTS.

The City of New Fairview, Texas wishing to adopt more stringent Rules for its OSSF Ordinance understands that the more stringent local Rule shall take precedence over the corresponding TCEQ requirement. Listed below are the more stringent Rules adopted by the City of New Fairview, Texas:

- (A) Permit Requirements: All on-site sewage facilities installed in New Fairview, Texas must be permitted.
- (B) Maintenance Requirements: Any on-site sewage disposal system using aerobic treatment and advanced treatment shall have a maintenance contract on that system. All contracted maintenance of an on-site sewage facility using aerobic treatment and advanced treatment shall be conducted by a TCEQ registered maintenance provider. There shall be no homeowner/property owner maintenance of an on-site sewage disposal system using aerobic treatment and advanced treatment unless the property owner/homeowner is certified by the manufacturer of that system or is an OSSF licensed maintenance provider who has been certified by the manufacturer for their system. Testing and reporting requirements specified in Title 30, TAC, Section 285.7 shall be in effect.

SECTION 11. DUTIES AND POWERS.

The OSSF Designated Representative (DR) (30 TAC § 285.2(17)) of the City of New Fairview, Texas, must be certified by the TCEQ before assuming the duties and responsibilities.

SECTION 12. COLLECTION OF FEES.

All fees collected for permits and/or inspections shall be made payable to the City of New Fairview, Texas. A fee of \$10 will also be collected for each on-site sewage facility permit to be paid to the On-Site Wastewater Treatment Research Council as required by the THSC, Chapter 367.

SECTION 13. APPEALS.

Persons aggrieved by an action or decision of the designated representative may appeal such action or decision to the City Council of the City of New Fairview, Texas.

SECTION 14. ENFORCEMENT PLAN

The City of New Fairview, Texas clearly understands that, at a minimum, it must follow the requirements in 30 TAC § 285.71 Authorized Agent Enforcement of OSSFs.

This Ordinance adopts and incorporates all applicable provisions related to on-site sewage facilities, which includes, but is not limited to, those found in Chapters 341 and 366 of the THSC, Chapters 7, 26, and 37 of the TWC and 30 TAC Chapter 30, Subchapters A and G, and Chapter 285.

SECTION 15. SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of New Fairview, Texas, that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the

same would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this Ordinance of such unconstitutional phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections.

SECTION 16. RELINQUISHMENT OF ORDINANCE

If the City Council of the City of **New Fairview**, Texas decides that it no longer wishes to regulate on-site sewage facilities in its area of jurisdiction, the City Council, as the authorized agent, and the TCEQ shall follow the procedures outlined in 30 TAC § 285.10 (d) (1) through (4).

After relinquishing its OSSF authority, the authorized agent understands that it may be subject to charge-back fees in accordance with 30 TAC § 285.10 (d) (5) and §285.14 after the date that delegation has been relinquished.

SECTION 17. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of approval as required by law and upon the approval of the TCEQ.

_ the Executive Director of the Texas Commission DEC 28 2007 on Environmental Quality ("Commission" or "TCEQ"), considered the application of the County of Denton, ("Applicant" or "Denton"), for an Order pursuant to §366.031, Texas Health and Safety Code ("Code"), and 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §285.10 of the rules of the Commission.

No person has requested a public hearing on the application, therefore the Executive Director, on behalf of the Commission, is satisfied that the Applicant has satisfied the requirements of §366.031 of the Code and, therefore, the Commission finds that the Denton County Order should be approved.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- The County of Denton drafted a proposed amendment to its order which 1. regulates on-site sewage facilities.
- On October 11, 2007 the County of Denton caused notice to be published, 2. in a newspaper regularly published and of general circulation, in the Applicant's area of jurisdiction, of a public meeting to be held on Tuesday, October 16, 2007.
- The County of Denton held a public meeting to discuss the proposed 3. amendment to its order on October 16, 2007.
- Denton County's Order regulating on-site sewage facilities was adopted 4. on October 16, 2007.
- A certified copy of the minutes was submitted to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.
- A certified copy of the Denton County Order was submitted to the Texas 6. Commission on Environmental Quality.
- The order is at least equivalent to the standards of the Texas Commission 7. on Environmental Quality.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The above facts are conditions sufficient to issue this order pursuant to §366.031 of the Code.
- 2. Section 5.102 of the Texas Water Code authorizes the Commission to issue orders and make determinations necessary to effectuate the purposes of Chapter 366 of the Health and Safety Code and / or within the Commission's jurisdiction and who provides no comment on other statutory authority.
- 3. Issuance of this order will effectuate the purposes of Chapter 366 of the Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY THAT:

- 1. The County of Denton is hereby authorized to implement its Order which regulates on-site sewage facilities.
- 2. Any amendments to the Denton County Order must be approved by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.
- 3. The Chief Clerk of the Commission is directed to forward a copy of this Order and the Applicant's adopted order, ordinance, or resolution, marked as Exhibit "A", to the Applicant and all other parties and to issue the Order and cause it to be recorded in the files of the Commission.

SECTION 4. CONFLICTS.

This Order repeals and replaces any other On-site Sewage Facility order for Denton County.

SECTION 5. CHAPTER 366.

The County of Denton, Texas clearly understands that there are technical criteria, legal requirements, and administrative procedures and duties associated with regulating on-site sewage facilities, and will fully enforce Chapter 366 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (H&SC) and Chapters 7 and 37 of the Texas Water Code (TWC), and associated rules referenced in Section 8 of this Order.

SECTION 6. AREA OF JURISDICTION.

- (A) The Rules shall apply to all the area lying in Denton County, Texas, except for the area regulated under an existing Rule and the areas within incorporated cities.
- (B) These Rules shall apply to those incorporated cities or towns that have executed intergovernmental contracts with Denton County, Texas.

SECTION 7. ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITY RULES.

Any permit issued for an on-site sewage facility within the jurisdictional area of Denton County, Texas must comply with the Rules adopted in Section 8 of this Order.

SECTION 8. ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITY RULES ADOPTED.

The Rules, Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 285 and Chapter 30, attached hereto, promulgated by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for on-site sewage facilities are hereby adopted, and all officials and employees of Denton County, Texas having duties under said Rules are authorized to perform such duties as are required of them under said Rules.

SECTION 9. INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE.

The Rules, 30 TAC Chapters 30 and 285 and all future amendments and revisions thereto are incorporated by reference and are thus made a part of these Rules. A copy of the current Rules is attached to these Rules as Appendix I.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENTS.

The County of Denton, Texas wishing to adopt more stringent Rules for its On-Site Sewage Facility Order understands that the more stringent conflicting local Rule shall take precedence over the corresponding Texas Commission on Environmental Quality requirement. Listed below are the more stringent Rules adopted by Denton County, Texas:

- (A) All single family dwellings located on a land tract regardless of acreage size, requires a permit to construct, alter, or repair an on-site sewage facility.
- (B) All new lots for single family dwellings shall be one acre minimum when serviced by a public water supply. Environmental protection must be demonstrated in flood hazard areas.
- (C) All new lots for single family dwellings shall be two acre minimum when serviced by a private water well. Environmental protection must be demonstrated in flood hazard areas.
- (D) Only a registered professional engineer or registered professional sanitarian with a site evaluator certification will perform site evaluations.
- (E) Permit applications will be made in person by the property owner, the installer, or a mutually agreeable third party.
- (F) All maintenance of an on-site-sewage disposal system using aerobic treatment shall be conducted by a TCEQ registered maintenance company unless:
 - (1) The homeowner/property owner is a TCEQ registered maintenance provider for their aerobic treatment unit; or
 - (2) Prior to September 1, 2007, the effective date of HB 2482 [80(R)], the homeowner/property owner received specific on-site maintenance training for their aerobic treatment unit from either their installer or the manufacturer of their unit pursuant to TAC Chapter 285, effective August 3, 2006; or
 - (3) On or after September 1, 2007, the effective date of HB 2482 [80(R)], the homeowner/property owner received specific on-site maintenance training for their aerobic treatment unit from either their installer or the manufacturer of their unit pursuant to TAC Chapter 285, effective August 3, 2006 or successfully completed the basic maintenance provider course provided by a TCEQ approved training provider; or
 - (4) The homeowner/property owner obtains a valid wastewater Class D or higher license.
- (G) The required maintenance inspection and test report, conducted by the above described qualified homeowner/property owner or the TCEQ registered maintenance company, which must be submitted three times a year to the permitting authority, shall:
 - (1) Meet all inspection requirements as set by TCEQ Rules, Denton County Policy and Procedural Requirements, as well as, the inspection requirements outlined by the manufacturer for the brand being inspected; and
 - (2) Address all testing requirements as set by the TCEQ Rules, Denton County Policy and Procedural Requirements, as well as, the testing requirements outlined by the manufacturer for the brand being inspected; and
 - (3) Report the sludge levels in the pump tank, and the condition of the spray area.

SECTION 11. DUTIES AND POWERS.

The Denton County Health Department of Denton County, Texas is herewith declared the designated representative for the administration and enforcement of these Rules within its jurisdictional area. The appointed individual(s) must be certified by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality before assuming the duties and responsibilities as Designated Representatives of Denton County, Texas.

SECTION 12. COLLECTION OF FEES.

All fees collected for processing fees, late fees, penalty fees, permit renewal fees, permits, inspections, and/or re-inspections shall be made payable to Denton County, Texas.

SECTION 13. APPEALS.

Persons aggrieved by an action or decision of the designated representative may appeal such action or decision to the Commissioners Court of Denton County, Texas.

SECTION 14. PENALTIES.

This Order adopts and incorporates all applicable penalty provisions related to on-site sewage facilities, which includes, but is not limited to, those found in Chapters 341 and 366 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapters 7, 26, and 37 of the Texas Water Code and 30 TAC Chapters 30 and 285.

SECTION 15. SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Commissioners Court of Denton County, Texas, that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Order are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Order should be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Order, since the same would have been enacted by the Commissioners Court without incorporation in this Order of such unconstitutional phrases, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

Section 6.09 Public and Private Sewer Systems

General

All subdivisions developed subsequent to this Court Order shall be provided with an approved sewage disposal system conforming to the current criteria, the current Wise County On-Site Sewage Facility Order and the current requirements of Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ).

2. On-site Sewage Facilities

An Authorization to Construct is required prior to any on-site sewage facility construction. A site evaluation, performed by a certified OSSF Site Evaluator, Professional Sanitarian, or Professional Engineer, any required Planning Materials, and application are required in accordance with the rules and regulations of Wise County and TCEQ and shall be submitted, along with the appropriate application fee, to the Wise County Department of Public Works. Submittal of Application, Planning Materials and installation for all On-Site Sewage Facilities shall be in accordance with TCEQ Title 30 TAC Chapter 285 as well as any more stringent rules adopted by the County. Wise County has adopted by Court Order the following more stringent rules:

- 1. Platted or unplatted subdivisions served by a public water supply shall have individual lots with surface areas of at least one (1) acre.
- 2. Platted or unplatted subdivisions served by individual water systems shall have individual lots with surface areas of at least two (2) acres.
- 3. A vicinity map should be submitted with planning materials.
- 4. All on-site sewage facilities are required to obtain a permit including land tracts that are ten (10) acres or larger.



Civil Rights Policy for the City's TxCDBG Program

DESCRIPTION:

Receive, consider, and act to approve a Resolution regarding Civil Rights and related policies for the City's TxCDBG program.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The City recently received a Texas Department of Agriculture, Texas Community Development Block Grant No. CDV21-0100 in the amount of \$350,000. The funds are for the reconstruction of Wilson Ct. and Creasser Lane. As a condition of funding, the City must comply with Section 109 of the Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act. (24 CFR 6); the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. 6101-6107); and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and for construction contracts greater than \$10,000, must take actions to ensure that no person or group is denied benefits such as employment, training, housing, and contracts generated by the CDBG activity, on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or disability.

In consideration for the receipt and acceptance of federal funding, the City agrees to comply with all federal rules and regulations including those rules and regulations governing citizen participation and civil rights protections, in accordance with Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, and 24 CFR Part 135, is required, to the greatest extent feasible, to provide training and employment opportunities to lower income residents and contract opportunities to businesses in the TxCDBG project area.

The City agrees to comply with Section 104(1) of the Housing and Community Development Act, as amended, and State's certification requirements at 24 CFR 91.325(b)(6), and must adopt an excessive force policy that prohibits the use of excessive force against non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, to not discriminate on the basis of disability and agrees to ensure that qualified individuals with disabilities have access to programs and activities that receive federal funds. The City agrees to comply with Section 808(e)(5) of the Fair Housing Act (42 USC 3608(e)(5)) that requires HUD programs and activities be administered in a manner affirmatively to further the policies of the Fair Housing Act, agrees to conduct at least one activity during the contract period of the TxCDBG contract,

to affirmatively further fair housing; and agrees to maintain written standards of conduct covering conflicts of interest and governing the actions of its employees engaged in the selection, award and administration of contracts.

- B. Code of Conduct Policy (Form A1002-22)
- C. Excessive Force Policy (Form A1003)

THE CITY OF NEW FAIRVIEW, TEXAS CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

These complaint procedures comply with the requirements of the Texas Department of Agriculture's Texas Community Development Block Grant (TxCDBG) Program and Local Government Requirements found in 24 CFR §570.486 (Code of Federal Regulations). Citizens can obtain a copy of these procedures at City of New Fairview, 999 Illinois Ave., New Fairview, Texas 76078, 817-638-5366, during regular business hours.

Below are the formal complaint and grievance procedures regarding the services provided under the TxCDBG project.

- 1. A person who has a complaint or grievance about any services or activities with respect to the TxCDBG project, whether it is a proposed, ongoing, or completed TxCDBG project, may during regular business hours submit such complaint or grievance, in writing to the City of New Fairview, Mayor at 999 Illinois Ave., New Fairview, Texas 76078 or you may call 817-638-5366.
- 2. A copy of the complaint or grievance shall be transmitted by the Mayor to the entity that is the subject of the complaint or grievance and to the City Attorney within five (5) working days after the date of the complaint or grievance was received.
- 3. The Mayor shall complete an investigation of the complaint or grievance, if practicable, and provide a timely written answer to person who made the complaint or grievance within ten (10) days.
- 4. If the investigation cannot be completed within ten (10) working days per 3 above, the person who made the grievance or complaint shall be notified, in writing, within fifteen (15) days where practicable after receipt of the original complaint or grievance and shall detail when the investigation should be completed.
- 5. If necessary, the grievance and a written copy of the subsequent investigation shall be forwarded to the TxCDBG for their further review and comment.
- 6. If appropriate, provide copies of grievance procedures and responses to grievances in both English and Spanish, or other appropriate language.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

When requested, the City shall provide technical assistance to groups that are representative of persons of lowand moderate-income in developing proposals for the use of TxCDBG funds. The City, based upon the specific needs of the community's residents at the time of the request, shall determine the level and type of assistance.

PUBLIC HEARING PROVISIONS

For each public hearing scheduled and conducted by the City, the following public hearing provisions shall be observed:

- 1. Public notice of all hearings must be published or posted at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to the scheduled hearing. If published, the public notice must be published in a local newspaper. Each public notice must include the date, time, location, and topics to be considered at the public hearing. A published newspaper article can also be used to meet this requirement so long as it meets all content and timing requirements. Notices should also be prominently posted in public buildings and distributed to local Public Housing Authorities and other interested community groups.
- 2. When a significant number of non-English speaking residents are a part of the potential service area of the TxCDBG project, vital documents such as notices should be published in the predominant language of these non-English speaking citizens.
- 3. Each public hearing shall be held at a time and location convenient to potential or actual beneficiaries and will include accommodation for persons with disabilities. Persons with disabilities must be able to attend the hearings and the City must make arrangements for individuals who require auxiliary aids or services if contacted at least two days prior to the hearing.
- 4. A public hearing held prior to the submission of a TxCDBG application must be held after 5:00 PM on a weekday or at a convenient time on a Saturday or Sunday.
- 5. When a significant number of non-English speaking residents can be reasonably expected to participate in a public hearing, an interpreter should be present to accommodate the needs of the non-English speaking residents.

The City shall comply with the following citizen participation requirements for the preparation and submission of an application for a TxCDBG project:

- 1. At a minimum, the City shall hold at least one (1) public hearing to prior to submitting the application to the Texas Department of Agriculture.
- 2. The City shall retain documentation of the hearing notice(s), a listing of persons attending the hearing(s), minutes of the hearing(s), and any other records concerning the proposed use of funds for three (3) years from closeout of the grant to the state. Such records shall be made available to the public in accordance with Chapter 552, Texas Government Code.
- 3. The public hearing shall include a discussion with citizens as outlined in the applicable TxCDBG application manual to include, but is not limited to, the development of housing and community development needs, the amount of funding available, all eligible activities under the TxCDBG program, and the use of past TxCDBG contract funds, if applicable. Citizens, with particular emphasis on persons of low- and moderate-income who are residents of slum and blight areas, shall be encouraged to submit their views and proposals regarding community development and housing needs. Citizens shall be made

- aware of the location where they may submit their views and proposals should they be unable to attend the public hearing.
- 4. When a significant number of non-English speaking residents can be reasonably expected to participate in a public hearing, an interpreter should be present to accommodate the needs of the non-English speaking residents.

The City must comply with the following citizen participation requirements in the event that the City receives funds from the TxCDBG program:

- 1. The City shall also hold a public hearing concerning any substantial change, as determined by TxCDBG, proposed to be made in the use of TxCDBG funds from one eligible activity to another again using the preceding notice requirements.
- 2. Upon completion of the TxCDBG project, the City shall hold a public hearing and review its program performance including the actual use of the TxCDBG funds.
- 3. When a significant number of non-English speaking residents can be reasonably expected to participate in a public hearing, for either a public hearing concerning substantial change to the TxCDBG project or for the closeout of the TxCDBG project, publish notice in both English and Spanish, or other appropriate language and provide an interpreter at the hearing to accommodate the needs of the non-English speaking residents.
- 4. The City shall retain documentation of the TxCDBG project, including hearing notice(s), a listing of persons attending the hearing(s), minutes of the hearing(s), and any other records concerning the actual use of funds for a period of three (3) years from closeout of the grant to the state. Such records shall be made available to the public in accordance with Chapter 552, Texas Government Code.

These procedures are intended to serve as guidelines for the procurement of supplies, equipment, construction services and professional services for the Texas Community Development Block Grant (TxCDBG) Program. The regulations related to conflict of interest and nepotism may be found at the Texas Government Code Chapter 573, Texas Local Government Code Chapter 171, Uniform Grant Management Standards by Texas Comptroller, 24 CFR 570.489(g) & (h), and 2 CFR 200.318.

CODE OF CONDUCT

As a Grant Recipient of a TxCDBG contract, the City of New Fairview, Texas shall avoid, neutralize or mitigate actual or potential conflicts of interest so as to prevent an unfair competitive advantage or the existence of conflicting roles that might impair the performance of the TxCDBG contract or impact the integrity of the procurement process.

For procurement of goods and services, no employee, officer, or agent of the City of New Fairview, Texas shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by TxCDBG funds if he or she has a real or apparent conflict of interest. Such a conflict could arise if the employee, officer or agent; any member of his/her immediate family; his/her partner; or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the parties indicated herein, has a financial or other interest in or a tangible personal benefit from a firm considered for a contract.

No officer, employee, or agent of the City of New Fairview, Texas shall solicit or accept gratuities, favors or anything of monetary value from contractors or firms, potential contractors or firms, or parties to sub-agreements, except where the financial interest is not substantial or the gift is an unsolicited item of nominal intrinsic value.

Contractors that develop or draft specifications, requirements, statements of work, or invitations for bids or requests for proposals must be excluded from competing for such procurements.

For all other cases, no employee, agent, consultant, officer, or elected or appointed official of the state, or of a unit of general local government, or of any designated public agencies, or subrecipients which are receiving TxCDBG funds, that has any CDBG function/responsibility, or is in a position to participate in a decision-making process or gain inside information, may obtain a financial interest or benefit from the TxCDBG activity.

The conflict of interest restrictions and procurement requirements identified herein shall apply to a benefitting business, utility provider, or other third party entity that is receiving assistance, directly or indirectly, under a TxCDBG contract or award, or that is required to complete some or all work under the TxCDBG contract in order to meet the National Program Objective.

Any person or entity including any benefitting business, utility provider, or other third party entity that is receiving assistance, directly or indirectly, under a TxCDBG contract or award, or that is required to complete some or all work under the TxCDBG contract in order to meet a National Program Objective, that might potentially receive benefits from TxCDBG awards may not participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by CDBG funding.

Any alleged violations of these standards of conduct shall be referred to the City of New Fairview, Texas City Attorney. Where violations appear to have occurred, the offending employee, officer or agent shall be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to dismissal or transfer; where violations or infractions appear to be substantial in nature, the matter may be referred to the appropriate officials for criminal investigation and possible prosecution.

Exhibit "C" Excessive Force Policy

Exhibit "F" Section 3 Policy

In accordance with 12 U.S.C. 1701u, the City of New Fairview agrees to implement the following steps, which, to *the greatest extent feasible*, will provide job training, employment and contracting opportunities for Section 3 residents and Section 3 businesses of the areas in which the program/project is being carried out.

- A. Introduce and pass a resolution adopting this plan as a policy to strive to attain goals for compliance to Section 3 regulations by increasing opportunities for employment and contracting for Section 3 residents and businesses.
- B. Assign duties related to implementation of this plan to the designated Civil Rights Officer.
- C. - E. Maintain a list of those persons who have identified themselves as Section 3 residents and contact those persons when hiring/training opportunities are available through either the Grant Recipient or contractors.
- F. Require that all Prime contractors and subcontractors with contracts over \$100,000 commit to this plan as part of their contract work. Monitor the contractors' performance with respect to meeting Section 3 requirements and require that they submit reports as may be required by HUD or TDA to the Grant Recipient.
- G. Submit reports as required by HUD or TDA regarding contracting with Section 3 businesses and/or employment as they occur; and submit reports within 20 days of the federal fiscal year end (by October 20) which identify and quantify Section 3 businesses and employees.
- H. Maintain records, including copies of correspondence, memoranda, etc., which document all actions taken to comply with Section 3 regulations.

Section 504 Policy Against Discrimination based on Handicap and Grievance Procedures

In accordance with 24 CFR Section 8, Nondiscrimination based on Handicap in federally assisted programs and activities of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 794), and Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended (42 U.S.C. 5309), the City of New Fairview hereby adopts the following policy and grievance procedures.

- 1. <u>Discrimination prohibited.</u> No otherwise qualified individual with handicaps in the United States shall, solely by reason of his or her handicap, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
- 2. The City of New Fairview does not discriminate on the basis of handicap in admission or access to, or treatment or employment in, its federally assisted programs and activities.
- 3. The City of New Fairview's recruitment materials or publications shall include a statement of this policy in 1. above.
- 4. The City of New Fairview shall take continuing steps to notify participants, beneficiaries, applicants and employees, including those with impaired vision or hearing, and unions or professional organizations holding collective bargaining or professional agreements with the recipients that it does not discriminate on the basis of handicap in violation of 24 CFR Part 8.
- 5. For hearing and visually impaired individuals eligible to be served or likely to be affected by the TxCDBG program, the City of New Fairview shall ensure that they are provided with the information necessary to understand and participate in the TxCDBG program.

6. Grievances and Complaints

- a. Any person who believes she or he has been subjected to discrimination on the basis of disability may file a grievance under this procedure. It is against the law for the City of New Fairview to retaliate against anyone who files a grievance or cooperates in the investigation of a grievance.
- b. Complaints should be addressed to: Mayor, 999 Illinois Ave., New Fairview, Texas 76078, 817-638-5366, who has been designated to coordinate Section 504 compliance efforts.

- c. A complaint should be filed in writing or verbally, contain the name and address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation of the regulations.
- d. A complaint should be filed within thirty (30) working days after the complainant becomes aware of the alleged violation.
- e. An investigation, as may be appropriate, shall follow a filing of a complaint. The investigation will be conducted by the Mayor. Informal but thorough investigations will afford all interested persons and their representatives, if any, an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint.
- f. A written determination as to the validity of the complaint and description of resolution, if any, shall be issued by the Mayor and a copy forwarded to the complainant with fifteen (15) working days after the filing of the complaint where practicable.
- g. The Section 504 Administrator shall maintain the files and records of the City of New Fairview relating to the complaint files.
- h. The complainant can request a reconsideration of the case in instances where he or she is dissatisfied with the determination/resolution as described in f. above. The request for reconsideration should be made to the City of New Fairview within ten (10) working days after the receipt of the written determination/resolution.
- i. The right of a person to a prompt and equitable resolution of the complaint filed hereunder shall not be impaired by the person's pursuit of other remedies such as the filing of a Section 504 complaint with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Utilization of this grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit of other remedies.
- j. These procedures shall be construed to protect the substantive rights of interested persons, to meet appropriate due process standards and assure that the City of New Fairview complies with Section 504 and HUD regulations.
