Key concept:

Public trees vs.

privately-owned trees

Public Trees

- On city property/grounds
- City parks
- Boulevards

*Does not include right-of-way area adjacent to private property

Privately-owned Trees

- Everything else!
- On private property
- Tree lawns/right-of-way

City responsibilities

- Maintenance of public trees
- Code enforcement
 - -Property Maintenance Code
 - -General Offenses Code
 - -State laws
- Street maintenance

Homeowner responsibilities

- Maintenance of privatelyowned trees
- Special situation: right-ofway trees
 - -8'/14' clearance requirements
 - -Signage

Common tree situations

- Utility line clearance
- Determining ownership
- Property line issues
- Falling tree/limbs/branches

Utility Line Clearance

- Lines located in easements
- Standards: PUCO/OSHA
- City does not control trimming on private property

Determining ownership

- Trunk location generally determines ownership
- Can be varied by agreement/past practice
- When in doubt: Survey, agreement

Tree overhangs property line

- Common-law right to trim
- "Reckless injury" limitation

Tree straddles property line

- Co-ownership (unless varied by agreement/past practice)
- "Reckless injury" limitation still applies
- Halved vs. shared maintenance

Falling tree material

- General rule: "Act of God" and traditional legal negligence principles
- Responsibility for clearing debris/repairing property
- Putting a neighbor "on notice"
- City immunity

Bushes, shrubs, and other vegetation

- Ownership determined in same manner as for trees
- Must be trimmed and clear of all rights-of-way
- Must maintain tree lawn
- Max 8" grass/weed height

Disputes and Concerns

Best advice:

Talk to your neighbors!

 Private civil issue: consider mediation, small claims court, or consult private attorney
