

Oakwood, Ohio
June 1, 2022

The Planning Commission of the city of Oakwood met in a special session at 4:30 p.m. in the council chambers of the city of Oakwood, 30 Park Avenue, Oakwood, Ohio 45419.

The Chair, Mr. Andy Aidt, presided and the Clerk, Ms. Lori Stacel, recorded.

Upon call of the roll, the following members responded to their names:

There were no in-person or Zoom visitors in attendance.

Mr. Aidt called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. He shared that Mrs. Gowdy and Mrs. Jackson were unable to attend the meeting and asked to be excused. It was then moved by Mr. Lauterbach and seconded by Mr. Byington that the absence of Mrs. Gowdy and Mrs. Jackson be excused; the motion was approved by viva voce vote.

Mr. Aidt explained that this is a special meeting to approve the May 4, 2022 meeting minutes in connection with a Notice of Appeal.

Mr. Aidt asked if there were any questions or concerns with the minutes from the May 4, 2022 meeting. Mr. Byington noted that the Board accepts the two administrative changes to the draft minutes presented by Ms. Stacel prior to the meeting. It was moved by Mr. Lauterbach and seconded by Mr. Byington that the minutes be approved as written and the reading thereof be dispensed with at this session.

Upon call of the roll on the question of the motion, the following vote was recorded:

There being three (3) YEA votes, thereon, said motion carried.

Mr. Klopsch commented on how Mrs. Gowdy was presented with the Civic Leadership Award from the Oakwood Rotary Club. He read the following into the record:


“The Oakwood Rotary Club Civic Leadership Award goes to a person who has improved the Oakwood community by serving in a leadership role that contributed in a significant way. This service must have been made in a voluntary capacity.

- *Harrison Gowdy has been a resident of Oakwood for 22 years.*
- *In April 2002, Oakwood City Council appointed Harrison to the citizen Budget Review Committee. She was a very active member of this committee for 11 years.*

- *In March 2008, City Council appointed Harrison to the Oakwood Planning Commission.*
- *Harrison also served on the Oakwood Comprehensive Planning Committee, the committee that oversaw development and approval of the city's 2004 Comprehensive Plan that addresses land-use, transportation, public facility and community character planning.*
- *She also served on the Oakwood Martin Luther King Breakfast committee, a committee that worked with a Kettering citizen committee that for many years hosted an annual MLK breakfast celebration.*
- *Additionally, Harrison has been a very active member of the Oakwood Historical Society (OHS) for many years, serving in several leadership positions. Given her passion for Oakwood history, Harrison was heavily involved in planning for and execution of the city's 2008 Centennial Celebration. Of particular note, Harrison was a key member of the team that created the historical video entitled Oakwood: Our Home on the Hill.*


In addition to receiving a personal plaque, and having her name added to a perpetual plaque that hangs on the wall at the entrance to the city building, our Rotary Club is making a \$350 donation in Harrison's name to The Oakwood Historical Society, her charity of choice."

There being no further business, the Planning Commission adjourned. The public meeting concluded at 4:35 p.m.
